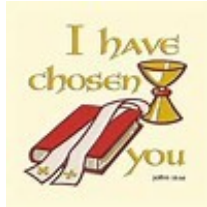

Music and Ministry by Jeff Comeau

Music that blends both spiritual and artistic excellence, is liturgical – it's sacred. Such music has the ability to cultivate, strengthen and deepen the spiritual experience of those gathered for worship. The musical tradition of the Church is a treasure of immeasurable value.

Liturgical music never dominates, but serves. Sacred music imparts spiritual truth to one's mind, heart and soul. It displays a dimension of meaning and feeling that mere words cannot. Music makes prayer more pleasing, promotes a sense of congregational unity and confers greater solemnity upon the sacred rites. When deciding which parts of the Mass are to be sung, preference is given to those which are more important, especially those which the priest, one of his assistants, or a cantor is to sing in alternation with the people, or which all are to sing together.

Singing is an expression of joy. In Colossians 3:16, St. Paul exhorts the faithful assembled in expectation of their Lord's return to sing together. He says, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly...singing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God." Our relationship with God is one of love and whether we sing loudly or softly, sing! St. Augustine very rightly says that, "it is natural for a lover to sing." We might also remember the ancient proverb that tells us "those who sing pray twice." So sing your praise, your love song, to God – He will surely be pleased.

Important Faith Formation Announcement

Sacrament Preparation:

To help our children be as prepared as possible to receive the sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion, and Confirmation, we are implementing a 2 year program for each of these. For First Reconciliation and First Communion, preparation will typically begin in 1st grade and the sacraments will be received in 2nd grade. However, students who begin faith formation in 2nd grade will be put in the First Year class and receive the sacraments in 3rd grade. So, if you have a child who is going into 1st grade for the 2016-2017 school year and wish to have them receive First Reconciliation and Communion in 2nd grade, you MUST enroll them in faith formation for their 1st grade year. The same applies to Confirmation. If you and your child are planning to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in 9th grade, if they are going into 8th grade for the 2016-2017 school year, they MUST be enrolled in faith formation for 8th grade. The exceptions to this would be students who attend Catholic school and children who are homeschooled as their main form of education. If you fall under the exception, please call the faith formation office for more details. If your child is going into 2nd or 9th grade and did not attend faith formation this year, please contact the faith formation office if you wish for your child to receive the sacraments at the usual time.
