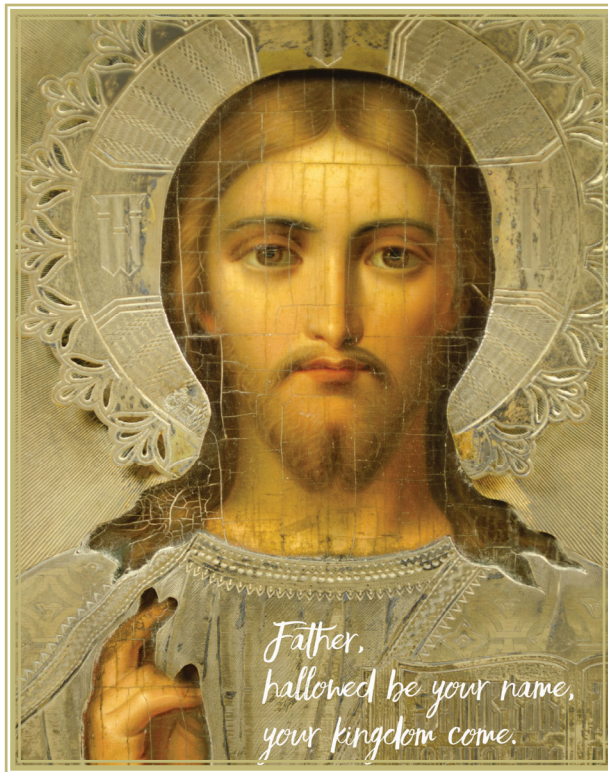

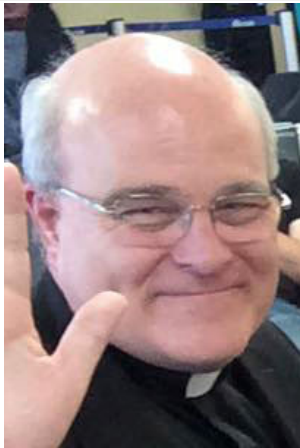

**Fr. Michael J. Flynn**

A native of Birmingham, Alabama, Fr. Michael J. Flynn holds a Bachelor of Music Degree from Florida State University. Fr. Flynn graduated from Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans in 1994, and was ordained that year a priest of the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee. Fr.

Flynn served in a number of pastoral ministries in his diocese, including serving as Campus Minister for both the University of West Florida (1994-1999) and Florida State University (2001-2003). Fr. Flynn served as pastor of Resurrection Parish in Miramar Beach, Florida, from 2003-2007. At the same time, he also served on the formation team for the Permanent Diaconate for the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee. Fr. Flynn earned his M.Div. (*summa cum laude*) from Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans in 1994, and a Licentiate (STL) in Liturgical Studies from Catholic University of America (Washington, DC) in 2009. He has since served as Director of both Liturgy and Sacred Music at St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary in Boynton Beach, Florida (2009-2012). He also served as Director of Sacred Music and as an Instructor of Liturgy at Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans, Louisiana (2012-2013). Fr. Flynn has developed and taught seminary courses on liturgical history, theology, and praxis. He has given workshops in dioceses around the country on topics pertaining to the liturgy.

Fr. Flynn began work with the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops in March, 2014, where and as Executive Director of the Secretariat of Divine Worship he assisted the bishops of the U.S.A. in liturgical matters, including the development and editing of revised liturgical texts. A highpoint of his time at the USCCB was preparing for and assisting with the historic visit of Pope Francis to the U.S.A. in September 2015. Since returning to ministry within the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee in January 2017, Fr. Flynn has served as the Diocese's Director of the Secretariat for Sacraments and Worship. In addition to his duties at the Liturgy Office, he began service as Parochial Vicar at Nativity of Our Lord Parish on July 1, 2019.



Deacon John Jacobs is new to the Nativity of Our Lord. Deacon Jacobs was ordained to the Permanent Diaconate in June 2013 in the Archdiocese of Mobile. For three years he was assigned to the Church of the Holy Spirit in Montgomery, Alabama. He was then assigned to the St. Patrick's Parish in Elkhorn, Nebraska for three years. He is retired from the

U.S. Air Force and the Alabama Department of Corrections. He has been married to his wife Karen for 46 years. They have a son, daughter, and three grandchildren. Their son and family reside in Omaha, NE and their daughter resides here in Pensacola. He plans to assist the pastor at liturgical celebrations, administering the sacraments, and assisting in ministering to hospital patients, nursing home residents, the home-bound and do such works assigned by the bishop and the pastor.

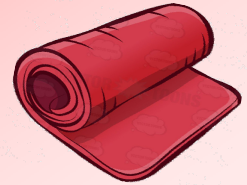

Encouragement from the Mat***Brought to you by Catholic on the Mat; Fun, Functional, Faith filled Fitness for Body, Mind, and Soul*****Step Back and Step In**

Stepping back from the forest so we can see those trees in our lives that are blocking our way to a life free of harmful habits is a courageous first step in healing.

Stepping back, however, is only the first step. Stepping in to what will help us grow in virtue is ultimately what will enable us to be successful in our quest to leave bad habits behind. I would like to offer this insight from John of the Cross from his book, *The Living Flame of Love*, that Fr. Ron Rolheiser shared in his July 2015 column:

John proposes a theory of, and a process for, healing in his book. In essence, it runs this way: For John, we heal of our wounds, moral flaws, addictions, and bad habits by growing our virtues to the point where we become mature enough in our humanity so that there's no more room left in our lives for the old behaviors that used to drag us down. In short, we get rid of the coldness, bitterness, and pettiness in our hearts by lighting inside our hearts enough warm fires to burn out the coldness and bitterness. The algebra works this way: The more we grow in maturity, generativity, and generosity, the more our old wounds, bad habits, temperamental flaws, and addictions will disappear because our deeper maturity will no longer leave room for them in our lives. Positive growth of our hearts, like a vigorous plant, eventually chokes-out the weeds. If you went to John of the Cross and asked him to help you deal with a certain bad habit in your life, his focus wouldn't be on how to weed-out that habit. Instead the focus would be on growing your virtues: What are you doing well? What are your best qualities? What goodness in you needs to be fanned into fuller flame? By growing what's positive in us, we eventually become big-hearted enough so that there's no room left for our former bad habits. The path to healing is to water our virtues so that these virtues themselves will be the fire that burns out the festering wounds, addictions, bad habits, and temperamental flaws that have, for far too long, plagued our lives and kept us wallowing in weakness and pettiness rather than walking in maturity, generosity, and generativity.

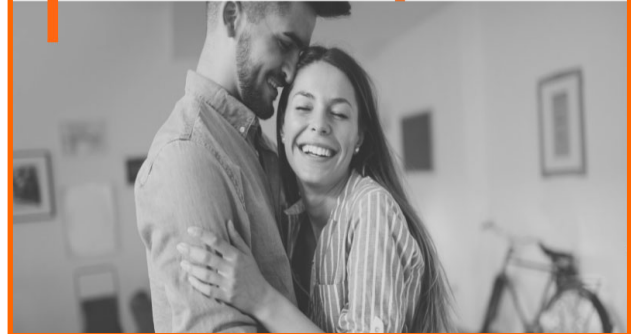
