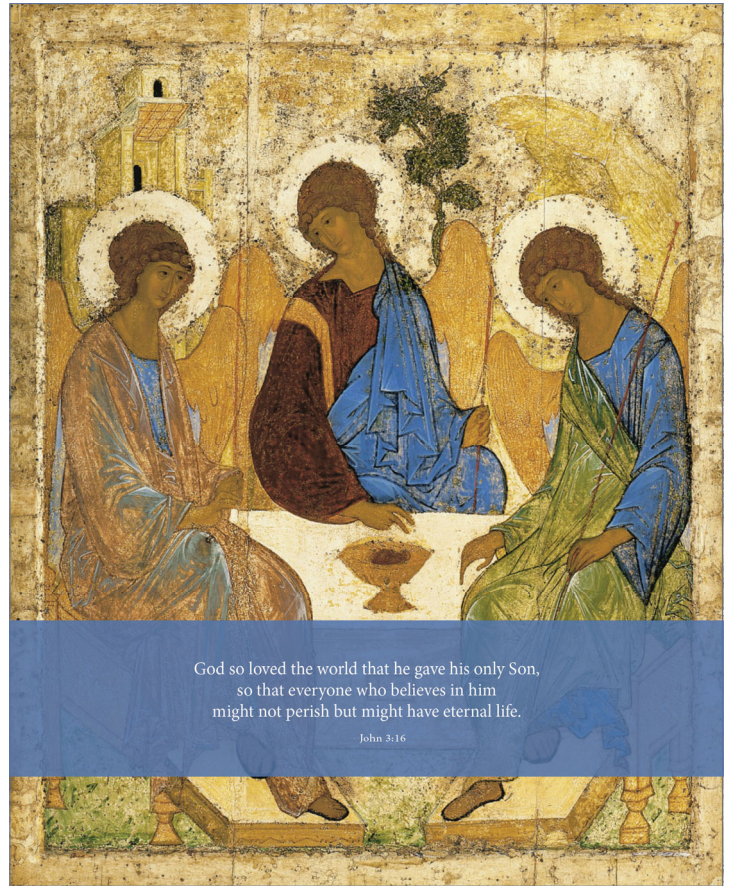

Deacon's Blog

Church Community:

Jesus said: "A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy: I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly" (John 10:10). Sometimes I may get the impression that to join the Church is just the opposite of what Jesus said in John 10:10. Instead of coming out of the confinement of the sheepfold and into the wide open pasture, a person who joins the Church seems to be going into the confinement of the sheepfold. Maybe I feel confined because there are things I can't do. Maybe I feel my thinking has to be stifled. But Jesus' words are true. I may expect that belonging to the Church community means I give up some freedom to think what I want to think. In reality, the security I can find in the Church allows me to dream and explore and ask questions I couldn't ask before. By belonging to a community of the Lord's disciples, I can dream great dreams and experience a great destiny no matter who I am. Jesus has come so that I might have life.¹ Over the past seven years of being a deacon, I've traveled many hills and valleys, as I'm sure that you have also. Listening and hearing to our nations unrest and the world coronavirus pandemic, makes me think of the significance of Church community. One prayer comes to mind "Through prayer and counsel, show me, Lord, where it is in your vineyard that you want me to serve, then give me strength to be faithful."²

We are pleased to announce that Nativity of Our Lord Catholic Church will resume the celebration of Mass with a congregation present beginning Saturday, May 9, 2020.

Reopening our doors will take careful thought, understanding and cooperation.

- A general dispensation from the Sunday obligation will remain in effect. This means you can come to Mass any day of the week (not just Sunday). You may also continue to live-stream Masses.
- Attendance at each Mass is limited to 75 parishioners. We will be taking on-line and phone reservations. To register online, please follow the link on our website (www.nativityofourlordcc.org). ** To register by phone, call the parish office, 477-3221.
- Social distancing will be practiced - pews will be roped off and 6 feet of separation between families/individuals will be maintained.
- Liturgical changes will take place - the distribution of the Precious Blood is suspended and it is strongly recommended receiving the Host only by hand.
- Anyone who attends public Mass will still be at risk. Our church will be sanitized between Masses, but the risk of COVID-19 remains. PLEASE NOTE: **It is recommended that everyone attending Mass wear a face mask.**

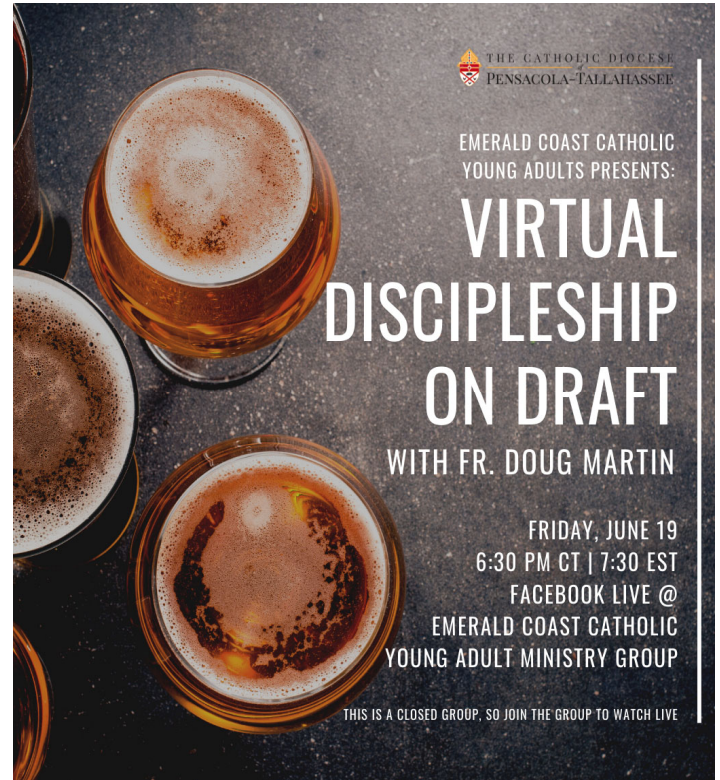

Special Indulgences Granted by the Holy See

The Apostolic Penitentiary, which is the office of the Holy See entrusted with granting indulgences, issued a decree on March 19, 2020 granting special indulgences for the faithful during the current COVID-19 epidemic.

Indulgence for the Sick A plenary indulgence is granted to all the faithful affected by the Coronavirus and subjected to quarantine by order of the health authority. The plenary indulgence is obtained by one of the following: *Spiritually joining in the celebration of Holy Mass by means of TV, radio or some other medium *praying the Stations of the Cross or some other devotion *devoutly reciting the Creed, Our Father and a pious prayer to Mary. These pious acts must be done with a spirit of faith in God and charity towards our brothers and sisters. The person who wishes to obtain this plenary indulgence must be free from all attachment to sin and intend to fulfill the usual conditions for obtaining a plenary indulgence if they are able. The usual conditions are: *go to Confession, *receive Holy Communion, *pray for the intentions of the Pope.

Indulgence for Those Who Care for the Sick Under the same conditions, a plenary indulgence is granted all health care workers, family members and others who assist Coronavirus patients.

Indulgence for All the Faithful Under the usual conditions stated above, a plenary indulgence is granted to those Catholics who implore Almighty God to stop the epidemic, relieve those afflicted, and grant eternal salvation to those who have died, by means of: *making a visit to the Blessed Sacrament, *prayerfully reading the Bible for at least half an hour, *praying the Stations of the Cross, *reciting the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.

The Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EMHC) is a lay minister who assists in the distribution of Holy Communion at Mass when there are not enough priests and deacons present to do so in a timely manner. As our communities have grown, EMHCs have become a common sight in most parishes, and they perform a great service to the Church.

In order to serve as a Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, you must be a registered member of the parish, you must be in good standing with the Church and a regular practitioner of your faith, you must be confirmed and at least 16 years old. You must also have a special mandate from Bishop Wack, which expires after five years or when you move to another parish. In order to qualify for this mandate, plan on attending a workshop for EMHCs on **Tuesday, March 31 at 6:30 PM.**
