Deacon's Blog

Silence 03 – When – Introductory Rites.

“Silence is not limited to the absence of words; rather, we open ourselves to hearing other voices: that of our heart, and above all, that of the Holy Spirit,” said Pope Francis.

¹ When the people are gathered, and as the Priest enters, the Entrance Chant begins. Its purpose is to open the celebration, foster unity of those who have been gathered, introduce their thoughts to the mystery of the liturgical time. This chant is sung by the choir and the people. If there is no singing at the Entrance, the antiphon given in the Missal is recited. The three parts of the Introductory Rite are the song/antiphon, Penitential Act and Collect. When the Entrance Chant/antiphon is concluded, there is a **break** (of silence), the Priest stands at the chair and, together with the whole gathering, signs himself with the Sign of the Cross. After this, the Priest calls upon the whole community to take part in the Penitential Act *“Brothers and sisters, let us acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries.”* A brief **pause** for silence (as we recollect our sins). Then all recite together the formula of general confession. This can be the Confiteor or other invocations. Then the absolution is given by the Priest. Next the Priest calls upon the people to pray *“Let us pray.”* Everybody observes a brief silence, **pause**, so that they may become aware of being in God's presence and may call to mind their intentions. Then the Priest pronounces the prayer usually called the “Collect.” The people, joining in this petition, acclaim *“Amen.”*²

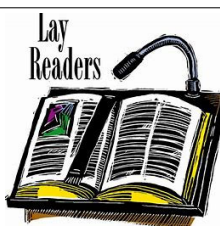
