Deacon's Blog

Silence 05 –

When –

Liturgy of the Eucharist.

The purpose of the Creed or Profession of Faith is that the whole gathered people may respond to the Word of God and that they may also honor and confess the great mysteries of the faith. Followed by the Profession of Faith are the Universal Prayers or Prayer of the Faithful. Usually, the petitions are offered for the Church, public authorities, any kind of difficulties (pandemic, natural disasters), and for the local community.¹ In the Liturgy of the Eucharist where the gifts of bread and wine are brought to the altar and the Eucharistic Prayer is offered so that the gifts become Christ's Body and Blood. During this time of the pandemic, the priest prepares bread and wine at the altar. The high point of the entire celebration begins, namely, the Eucharistic Prayer. The prayer of thanksgiving and sanctification. The priest calls upon the people to lift up their hearts towards the Lord in prayer and thanksgiving. The people, for their part, should associate themselves with the Priest in faith and in silence, **silent reflection**. The response is called the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy). At the heart of the prayer is the showing of the consecrated elements, first the Host, then the Chalice. This is an action which engages the gaze of the faithful to respond in the Mystery of Faith, **silent reflection**. At the conclusion of the Eucharistic Prayer, the priest should make a distinct **pause**, prayerful silence, to make clear that the prayer is complete and that the Communion Rite is about to begin.²

Brice Higginbotham, a priest of the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux, where he serves as pastor of Holy Cross Parish in Morgan City, Louisiana. Fr. Brice has just published a fine new book containing reflections on the lives the saints, one for each week of the year:

*Daily Lessons from the Saints:
52 Weeks of Inspiration and Encouragement.*

The book presents a saint for each week close to the saint's feast day on the liturgical calendar. Along with biographies of each of the 52 included saints, the book offers a week's worth of brief daily reflections based on the life story, the courage, or the writings of each saint.
