Preparation –

Did you know that your baptism is a wellspring of inexhaustible grace? You can always recall your baptism and draw strength from it

“now you have had yourselves washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and the Spirit of our God” 1 Corinthians 6:11.

“John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins” Mark 1:4. Advent is a time of watching and waiting. Are you open to the surprising ways God comes to you? Be attentive to God's call.

John's preparation of the way for Christ is a model for us, especially in this Advent season. He challenges us to consider whether we lead others to Jesus, or whether our actions are motivated by a need for attention and affirmation. We are given these days to grow in holiness and devotion so that we will be eager to be found without spot or blemish before him, at peace, when he comes. During this busy time of year, a time when we are doing so much to prepare for the coming of Christmas, let us make sure to heed the voice crying out in the wilderness – to prepare for the coming of the Christ, not just as a babe in Bethlehem, but his imminent return in glory as our King. During this holy season, may we grow in devotion so as to prepare the way of the Lord in our homes and our hearts. ¹

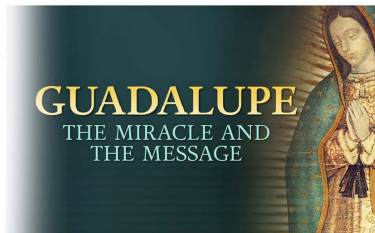

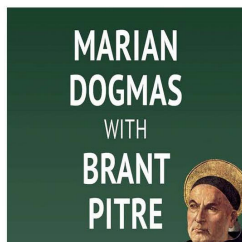

Anointing of the Sick

If you or a member of your family is sick, anticipating a medical procedure or in the hospital and would like to be anointed or just need someone to pray with, please let the parish office know.

We often don't know that you are in need of pastoral care until after the fact.

A relationship of faith and commitment exists between the Catholic Church and its members and the public, whether they are children, young people, adults or elderly. Sexual abuse in this context, or any other relationship, is a matter of grave concern. Knowledge of such abuse requires a special response in order to facilitate the healing process and assure the safety of the community. With this in mind, The Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee is committed to healing the hurting hearts of sexual abuse victims and has established Victims Assistance Coordinators, experienced and trained counselors. These coordinators are available to help persons who have been sexually abused by a priest, deacon or other church personnel.

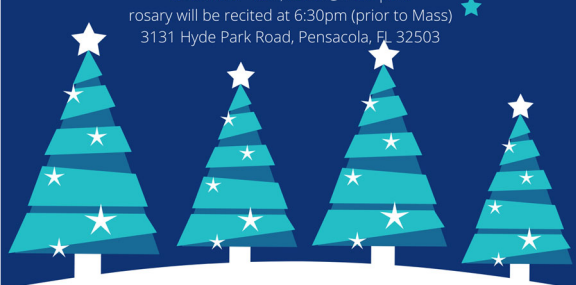

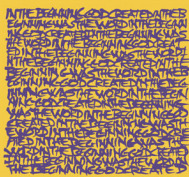
