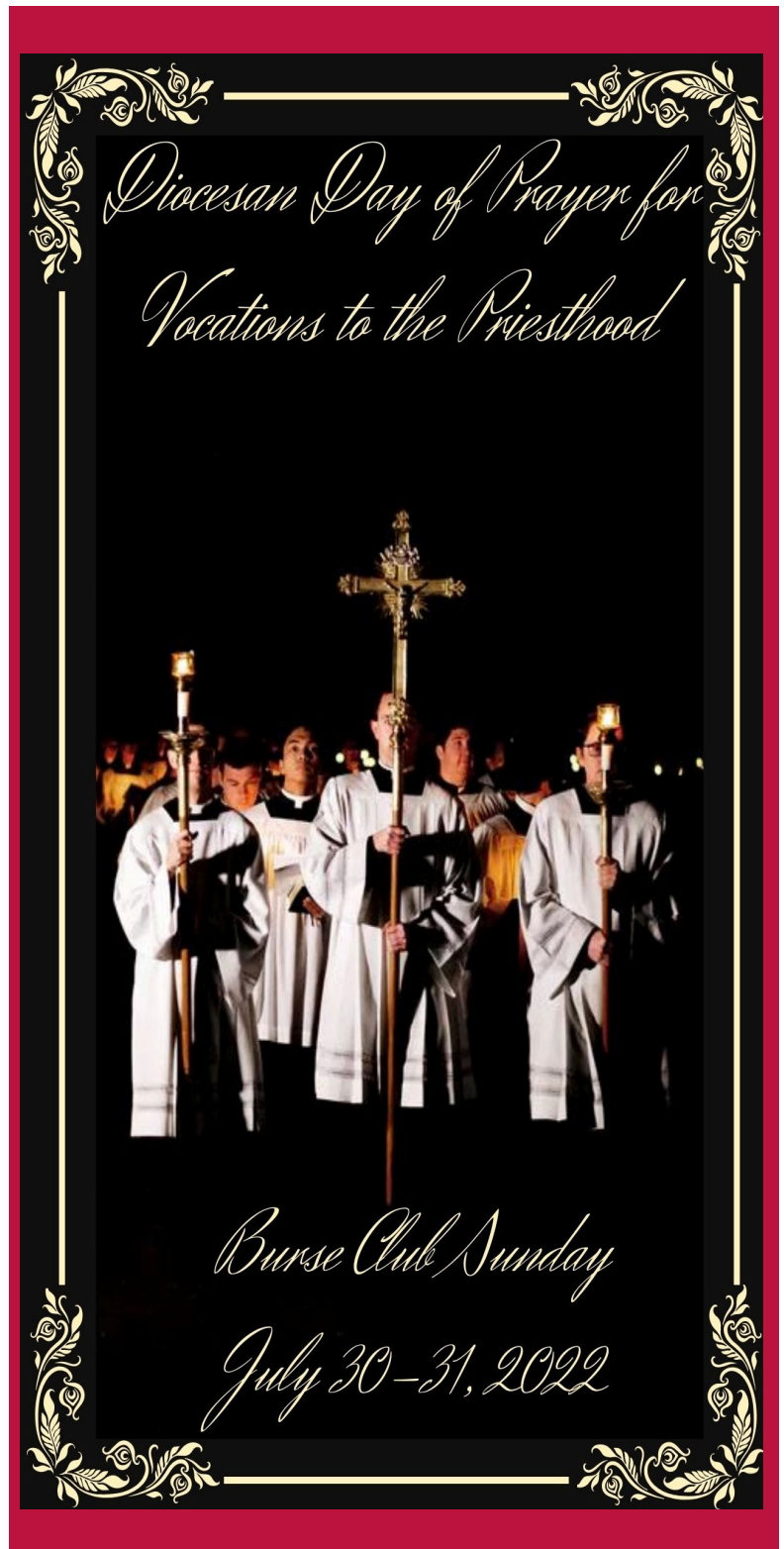

Mass Origin 01:

“The Mass began at the Last Supper. The Last Supper takes place during Passover, the day when the paschal lambs were slaughtered. Why is this important? Because Christ is himself the Paschal Lamb who will be slaughtered for the salvation of the world, and the sacrifice is made sacramentally present at every Mass. ‘Take, eat; this is my body.’ Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks he gave it to them, saying, ‘Drink from it, all of you; for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins’.” (Matthew 26:14-30).

“This is one biblical source of the Institution of the Lord’s Supper. You know what is interesting is that, Judas is present at the Last Supper. Judas, you say. Why is he there? It means that Jesus associates with all of us sinners. He entered into the darkness in all of its power in order to bring the light. If even Judas was invited into the Lord’s presence, so are you.”¹

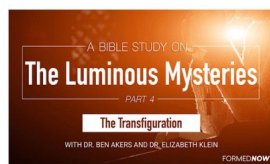
COMPANIONS IN SHIPWRECK

A BIBLE STUDY ON THE LUMINOUS MYSTERIES: THE TRANSFIGURATION

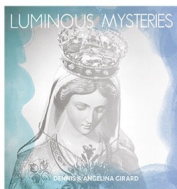

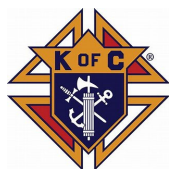

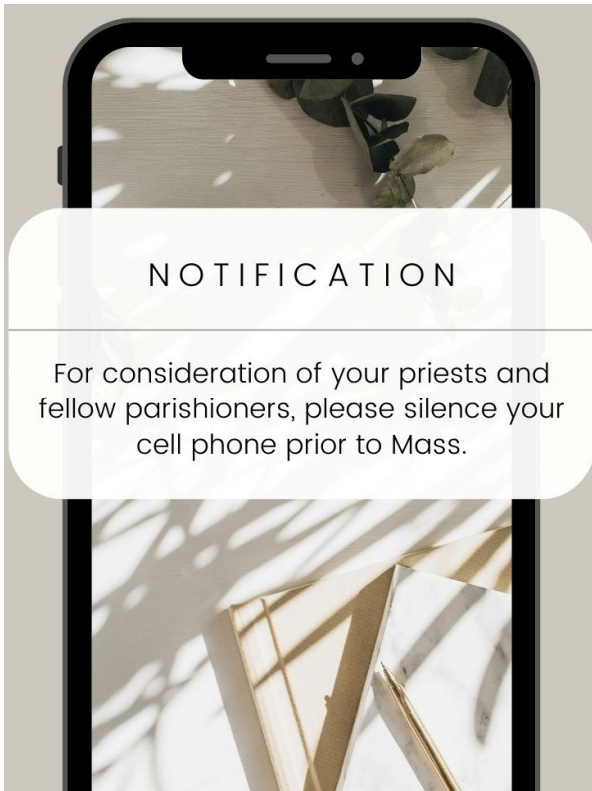
