PRAY ALWAYS



Persistent Prayer:

“Why must we pray? ‘Pray always without becoming weary.’ (Luke 18:1).

First: *We must pray first and foremost because we are believers.* Prayer is in fact the recognition of our limitation and our dependence: we come from God, we belong to God and we return to God. Prayer is first of all an act of intelligence, a feeling of humility and gratitude, and attitude of trust and abandonment to him who gave us life out of love. Prayer is a mysterious but real dialogue with God, a dialogue of confidence and love.”

“**Secondly,** we must also pray because we are frail and guilty. Prayer must be humbly and realistically recognized that we are poor creatures, confused in ideas, tempered by evil, frail and weak, in continual need of inner strength and consolation. Prayer gives the strength for great ideals, to maintain faith, charity, purity and generosity. Prayer gives the courage to emerge from indifference and guilt, if unfortunately, one has yielded to temptation and weakness.”

“In our culture, we demand quick and preferably easy solutions to every problem. We may find it difficult to recognize the steady, patient, ever-active, and surprising work of God. We seek surface results: God transforms the depths that define the surface, when we ask, God answers - sometimes quickly and obviously, but often with a far-reaching love whose fruits we are slow to see. Pray always!”¹




