
"With the dawning of 2022, we may dust our exercise machine off, renew our gym membership or even lock candy in a cupboard. This is the year, we tell ourselves, for losing weight, strengthening our eating habits. Resolutions – those never-ending resolutions."

"Lent is a time for setting 'resolution' to pray, fast, and to give, but too often our Lenten practice(s) mirror secular New Year's resolutions – where we put ourselves on a spiritual 'Fitness' regimen. Only to burn out in a week or two. Likewise, these practices can remain individualized, rooted in a self-help kind of frame work."

"Lent challenges us to look beyond ourselves to the communal good of the Church and the world. Lent summons us to solidarity, one of the seven themes of Catholic social teaching. Fasting and almsgiving are not done for the sake of pride or glory; as we hear in Matthew's Gospel on Ash Wednesday, God 'sees what is hidden' (Mt 6:4) – and we too see anew through solidarity with the poor, the vulnerable, and the marginalized. Lent puts our power and privilege into perspective. Lent is a time to plant the seeds for future growth." ¹






