

Lent – The True Meaning:


"Here we are, the first Sunday of Lent. The scripture readings for the next couple of Sunday's will be from the New Testament. We will hear the testing of Abraham, Moses and the Israelites grumbling and lost in the wilderness. Repentance is a turning away from the sins and the mistakes of the past and a turning toward God. Thus, hearing the stories of salvation history reminds us of these sins and invites us to walk in God's path. Reflecting on the history of salvation throughout Lent guides us toward the mighty Easter Vigil liturgy."

"Today we hear 'Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you' (Ps 33:22). Examples like this remind us that penance does not mean sadness; Lent is not absent of joy. We take joy, in God's mercy and love. Too often, Lenten practices (resolutions) equate to transactional 'payment' so that God may forgive us and deem us worthy. This is not the goal of Lent."

"'Lent is an opportunity for the community of faith to pause and reawaken to the bounty of God's love (*Eternity Today*, volume 2, p. 57 by Marin Connell). Connell continues, 'These Lenten disciplines (resolutions) are meant to keep hearts beating and engaged in the world, to keep them from turning to stone, and to keep the senses alert for the fullest revelation of the gifts of God.' Therein lies the true meaning of Lent." ¹





 When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal as well as two smaller meals that together do not equal a full meal.
- Abstinence from meat is binding from age 18 and up.
