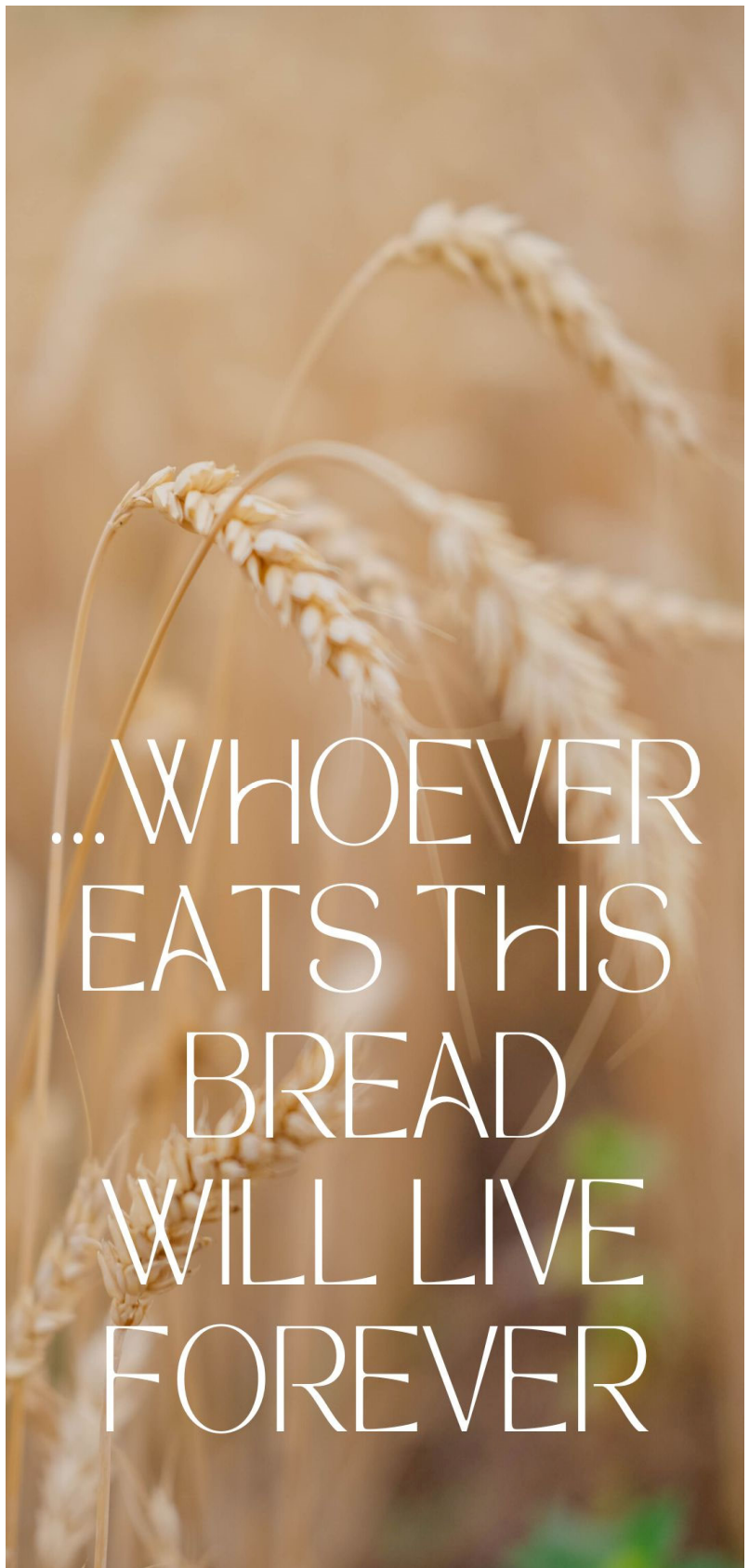

Deacon's Blog

One Loaf:

“If you buy an airline ticket, you have to decide between the first-class or the basic economy class. If you go to a college football game, you have to decide to be on the 50-yard line section or the upper-deck section. Similar options exist in many other places where people gather. Except, of course for Mass. There are no different ‘classes of sections’ at the liturgy: just the whole people of God gathered as one to receive “the one Loaf,” which is Jesus himself (1 Corinthians 10:17)”.

“On this feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, St. Paul reminds us that we are ‘one body’ in the Lord (1 Corinthians 10:17). Jesus has called us into one community as his brothers and sisters. He has gifted all of us with the ‘one baptism for the forgiveness of sins’ (Apostles Creed). And he has filled each one of us with the same Holy Spirit. Everyone has a first-class seat. Everyone has the same high privilege of being named a child of God”.

“Today during Holy Communion, we receive the ‘one Loaf’, look at our brothers and sisters gathering with you. Honor them as the beloved of Christ that they are. And welcome them into your heart. *‘Jesus, thank you for giving yourself to me so freely and generously’.*”¹

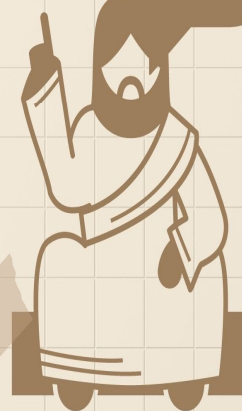

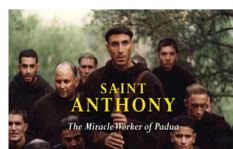

Don't worry about your children being exposed to unwholesome television content anymore! In this fun, family-friendly series, your children will learn important lessons, such as the value of honesty.

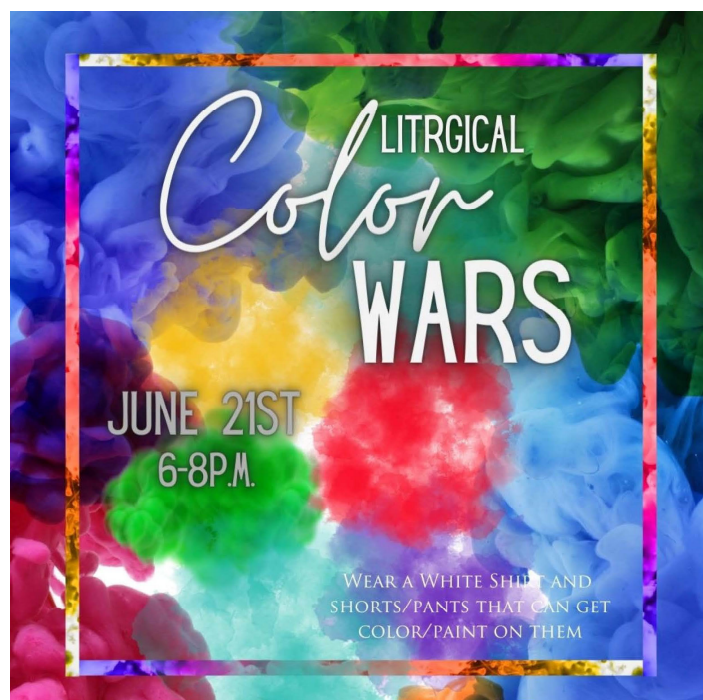


Saint Anthony: Miracle Worker of Padua
