Deacon's Blog

Seed Sower:

"On top of Nebraska's state capitol is a 19-foot-tall bronze statue. The statue is a man holding a bag of seed in his left hand and in his right hand he is throwing seed to the left and to the right onto the ground. The statue emphasized the importance of agriculture to a noble life and civilization."

"In the agricultural environment where Jesus was raised, he often saw farmers casting seed by hand to the left and right as they walked through fields. That ancient practice of scattering seed was the original meaning of our modern term broadcasting. That image became the basis of Jesus' famous parable to explain the Word of God. The seeds are Good News: words of wisdom, cast to the world to produce a harvest of love and peace."

"After Jesus had preached this parable, he explained it to his Apostles. The Word of God is pure, sacred and powerful. Our souls are the soil to keep clear of thorns, stones and briers (Satan temptations). There, the Word can be planted to grow into a spiritually fulfilled life. 'Jesus, help me to be a seed sower.' "1






