Flashes of Grace:


"The Dismals Canyon in northwestern Alabama attracts a number of tourists each year. Many in May and June when the gnat larvae hatch and become glowworms. At night, these glowworms cast a brilliant blue luminescence, and thousands of them together create a breathtaking light."

"When people of faith share their spiritual journeys, it is not uncommon that they will relate a profound faith experience (transfiguration) sometime in their past. They will speak of an experience of God in prayer or a graced moment in which God intervened in their lives. These 'flashes of grace' have a powerful influence on them. Such graces strengthen their faith, and when times of trail come, these graces help to sustain them. Witnessing the radiant divinity of Christ (transfiguration) was a powerful 'flash of grace' that helped sustain the Apostles." ²

Healing Mass

Nativity of Our Lord will be offering a Healing Mass on August 8 at 6:00pm. We invite all those who are in need of prayer, anointing and healing to attend this special celebration.

The ministry of healing is among the central works of the Church, as it was for Jesus himself. As Pope Benedict XVI remarked, "Healing is an essential dimension of the apostolic mission and of Christian faith in general...(It is) a religion of healing". During Mass, we will celebrate the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Jesus, our Divine Physician heals body, mind and spirit.

There will be an opportunity for the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Adoration before the Mass begins.



I'm sure many have seen the portrait of St. Cecilia adorning the wall behind the piano. Many may not know her history. Below is a brief summary of her life.

Although details of her life may be unknown to us, Saint Cecilia was one of the most revered early virgin martyrs of Rome, as evidenced by her name appearing in the Roman Canon of the Mass. According to a late 5th-century legend, she was a noble Roman, who, as a child, had vowed her virginity to God. When she was married against her will to the future Saint Valerian, then a pagan, she told him that an angel of God wished her to remain a virgin. He promised to respect this wish if he were allowed to see the angel. She replied that he would if he were baptized. On his return from baptism he found Cecilia talking to the angel. She then converted his brother Tiburtius, who also saw the angel. Both men were martyred before she was. She distributed her possessions to the poor, which enraged the prefect Almachius, who ordered her to be burned. When the flames did not harm her, she was beheaded.

Cecilia was buried in the catacomb of St. Callistus, near Rome. At the beginning of the 9th century, Pope Paschal I discovered her incorrupt relics in the catacomb of St. Praetextatus and had them moved to Rome, to a basilica in Trastevere that now bears her name. According to tradition, as she was dying she sang to God. It is also written that as the musicians played at her wedding she "sang in her heart to the Lord".

St. Cecilia is the patron saint of music and musicians.




