

## Deacon's Blog

## Listening:

"In our lives we have experienced trauma. Trauma is a deeply distressing or disturbing experience. It may have been something that has happened to us when we were a child. Some traumas can be when we were a teenager, or an adult. This experience runs deep, and for some reason remains with us. This trauma may be physical, mental, or spiritual."


"In today's first reading, Elijah had a king and queen who were pursing him, wishing him dead. Tired of being on the run, Elijah prayed for death. But God had a different plan for him. The prophet was told to wait and to listen for God's voice on a mountaintop. There he experienced high winds, a raging fire, an earthquake, and a whisper". 1

"God has a plan for us. He saved Elijah from a king and queen. Jesus saved Peter from sinking on the stormy sea. These were traumatic experiences. One common theme was that Elijah and Peter listened to God. Listening for that voice of love from God. The more we develop our relationship with God in Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit, the more readily we hear and see and smell and touch the Lord in the tiniest of whispers. We attune our hearts to God present in us and in the world around us."<sup>2</sup>

"When we have these traumas, remember God is listening and to keep our eyes fixed Him, so we can weather any storm."

Last spring we had a security review of our campus and one of the suggestions was to have another emergency exit in the church, especially if something was to happen in the narthex. A number of parishioners have also expressed concerns to our parish and finance council members that there are not enough exits in case of an emergency.

Currently there are two other exits, one near the choir area and one near the "cry room" area. We are planning on adding the new exit where the old entrance used to be, in the center of the church. Right now, the spot has the large window. The floor area inside would be filled in so there is not the "hollow sound" and doors added to the glass frame. We are currently obtaining estimates for the work to be done. Not only do we want a beautiful church to celebrate our faith, but also one that is safe for all.
