Free Will: Choices:

"A man turned to drinking. He also turned from God and his family. One day while walking along, he saw a bent, rusty nail in the gutter. For some reason, the nail reminded him of himself and his life. He decided to pick it up and take it home. Placing the nail on an anvil, he began to straighten it out. He then cleaned it up. Then it occurred to him. He could straighten out and clean up his own life in the same way. That thought triggered his conversion. He turned from drinking and turned to God and his family. He keeps that straightened and cleaned nail in his wallet." ¹

"Our choices do matter. In today's Gospel, the first son, who immediately said **no** to his father but afterwards went to work, teaches us that it's always possible to change our mind and hearts. The second son, who immediately said **yes** but did not do what this father wanted, also teaches us that it's always possible to change our mind and hearts."

"Jesus' parable tells us that changing our mind can work both ways. That's the blessing of free will that Ezekiel also describes in today's first reading. God loves us so much that he gives us this freedom. So, take heart! It's never too late to use your free will as God intended. 'Father, I choose to do your will today.' ²
