

An Invitation:

"Recently I received an invitation to a party. The invitation gave me the date, time and place. It also had an RSVP by a certain date. It did not tell me what to wear or what to bring. Just myself. Every week, we are invited to attend a celebration."

"We have been journeying throughout the liturgical year to a feast. Our response to God's invitation to the feast might have ebbed and flowed from week to week. The date is Sunday. The time is at your convenience. The place is at the church. I don't have to bring anything – but myself. How important am I to attend?"

"A teacher had students take a pair of scissors and cut a piece from a poster. 'Take your piece home, but don't peek,' she said. 'Bring it back next Sunday.' The following week, the students returned to put the poster together. To their dismay, it had a big hole in it. One little girl had forgotten her piece. The teacher hugged the tearful girl who forgot her piece and said, 'Amy, I'm glad you forgot, because it teaches, even better than I had planned'. "

"Each of us is invited to witness to Jesus in some unique way, God's plan loses some of its beauty, just like the big hole in the poster (if we do not attend)." ¹






