To Love:

“Many of us have flown on an airplane. Flying on an airplane, we’ve heard a vital safety protocol: secure your oxygen mask first, then help others. If we don’t have the life-sustaining breath we need, our capacity to serve will be cut off.”

“How do we secure our oxygen masks? How can we seek God before we head into a situation where love of neighbor becomes demanding? We must practice loving God with all our heart, soul, and mind before discerning how best to serve. This practice is meant to help us receive God’s presence and love so we are able to share him with others.”

“Our participation at Mass gives us what we need to answer God’s call to love others. In the Eucharist, we receive Christ: body, blood, soul, and divinity. We are given Goodness himself; we are recipients of eternal and perfect generosity; we are fed with the love God calls us to extend to others. Through Christ’s Real Presence, may we be equipped to go forth and love as he loves us.”




