# **Deacon Blog**

## Hope:

"I got up with my child crying this morning at 3:00am. I gave him 4 oz. of milk, but he would not go back to sleep. We stayed up until 5:00am. Another reason to get up a 3:00am is planning for a household of family and friends for a dinner on Christmas day. Who's bringing what dishes, where are my table decorations, etc. Our worries can keep us up late at night. We were not created to be awake 24 hours a day. We need our rest. Many of us lack this basic need. Good sleep fuels us so we can be active and alert. We have hope that everything will go well."

"Hope is one of the theological virtues, and like the other virtues it requires action. To be virtuous first requires building up a sort of habit of doing the good – a state of being which is inclined to do the good. I hope to nurture my child to be a healthy human being. I hope that the Christmas dinner will go off without a hitch. Hope is a desire, a longing, for some future and difficult-toobtain happiness."

"Advent is a season of hope. In the Gospel today Jesus tells his disciples to be alert, to be ready, and to watch. In short, he tells them to be full of hope. When will the master of the house return from traveling abroad? Jesus' focuses is on being ready to welcome the master home at a moment's notice. Let us stay alert and keep watch on our Advent journey." <sup>1</sup>


