

<u>Seeds and Sacraments</u> Sacrament of Holy Orders

Seeds and growth are signs of life. Seeds need to be tended, watered, weeded, nurtured and fed in order for growth to happen and life to be sustained. There are many forms of seeds, all with the potential to grow into a beautiful plant, some even flowering into colorful, fragrant blossoms.

In some ways, seeds reflect what happens in our own lives. From our beginning God has sown the seed of His love and life within us. Sacraments are special encounters with the Divine that help us grow and blossom as disciples of Jesus.

The sacraments are caring signs of God's watering, weeding, nurturing, feeding, and tending to us as we walk through the joys and sorrows of life. Sacraments are gifts from God that touch us with God's love in special ways. As we continue our faith exploration of the sacraments, we now look at the Sacrament of Holy Orders.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that "Holy Orders is the sacrament through which the mission entrusted by Christ to his apostles continues to be exercised in the Church until the end of time: thus it is the sacrament of apostolic ministry." "Ordination" comes from the Latin word "ordinatio" which means to incorporate someone into an order. In the Sacrament of Holy Orders, a man is incorporated into the priesthood of Christ. The priesthood was established by God among the Israelites during their exodus from Egypt. God chose the tribe of Levi as priests for the nation. Their primary duties were the offering of sacrifice and prayer for the people. Christ, in offering Himself up for the sins of all mankind, fulfilled the duties of the Old Testament priesthood once and for all. But just as the Eucharist makes that sacrifice present to us today, so the New Testament priesthood is a sharing in the eternal priesthood of Christ.

From the moment of Jesus' conception in the womb of Mary until His resurrection, He was filled with the Holy Spirit. In biblical language, He was anointed by the Holy Spirit and so established by God the Father as our high priest. As Risen Lord, He remains our high priest. While all the baptized share in Christ's priesthood, the ministerial priesthood shares this through the Sacrament of Holy Orders in a special way.

There are three levels of participation in the Sacrament of Holy Orders: as bishop, as priest, and as deacons. A bishop receives the fullness of the Sacrament of Holy Orders. He is the head or Ordinary of the local church. The local area entrusted to him is called a diocese. A bishop is also a member of the episcopal college: this is all the bishops who with the pope guide the church.

Priests serve the community in various ways. They may be called to serve in their dioceses or as religious order priests, carrying out the mission of a particular religious community. They preside at liturgies, preach, administer the sacraments, counsel people, serve as pastors, and teach.

Deacons help and serve bishops by serving the needs of the Church, proclaiming the gospel, teaching and preaching, baptizing, witnessing marriages, and assisting the priest celebrant at liturgies.

Ordination to the priesthood is always a call and a gift from God. Christ reminded His apostles that they needed to ask the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into the harvest. Let us always remember to pray for our bishop, priests, and deacons who serve us so faithfully and also to pray for an increase in vocations to the ministerial priesthood.


