
Fraud Alert: Scammers in Emails Pose As Pastors, Ask Faithful To Buy Them Gift Cards

Scammers have taken aim at pastors, parishes and even bishops in dioceses all over the country in the past few months. Even our pastor here was not immune. In the past few months, someone has created email accounts using Fr. Dan's name and sent messages asking for gift cards.

The Federal Trade Commission and Office of the Attorney General have sent out alerts about scams like these. Priests and pastors will NEVER email parishioners looking for gift cards and would never send a business email from a private account such as AOL or GMAIL. The bottom line is that people should always verify in person or by phone any request involving money or personal information. Email and text messages are convenient, but are anonymous and easily created by crooks.

Let Your Voice Be Heard! Say NO to Expanded Abortion Access

The Massachusetts State Legislature will consider passing into law two deeply troubling bills this legislative session. They are identical in text but differ slightly in their titles. The first, (HB 3320) is "An Act removing obstacles and expanding access to women's reproductive health." The second, (SB 1209) is "An Act to remove obstacles and expand abortion access." Combined they share the same acronym – ROE. These bills would:

- 1) Allow abortions during the nine months of pregnancy for virtually any reason.
- 2) Eliminate any requirements that abortions be performed in a hospital.
- 3) Eliminate the requirement that provides medical care to a child who survives an abortion attempt.
 - 4) Eliminate the requirement that a minor under the age of 18 have the consent of a parent, guardian, or the courts.
 - 5) Provide state funding for women who cannot afford the procedure.




