

ROSARY MAKERS NEEDED!


Mary's rosary ministry meets on

BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Kids are always fascinated by family history. They want to know what their parents did as kids, where they went to school, what kind of trouble they got into, etc. When grandparents start to talk about the family in the 'old days', kids really listen. Old pictures and stories give children a chance to know who deceased relatives were, to appreciate the importance of their past and to preserve the stories and identities for their children too.

So why not talk about your family's spiritual history? Looking at pictures of baptisms, First Communions, May processions, confirmations and weddings, are great ways of sharing the family's spiritual traditions, the history of your parish and the members of your family, living and deceased, who served as godparents and sponsors, who helped with building a church or volunteered at the parish school. It reminds everyone that our journey of faith is a collective one, where members of a family help each other in faith. Just as the Gospels trace the public ministry of Jesus, we can trace our history, going back generations, to those who made sure we too would follow the Lord.





We have just entered a new year with much hope and joy for 2026. But most important on January 1st we celebrated Mary, the Mother of God. A young woman, conceived without sin, in preparation of becoming the Mother of Jesus Christ our Savior. Mary is mentioned in the earliest creed of the Church. The first symbol listed in the Old Roman Creed is: "I believe in God the Father Almighty, and in Jesus Christ His only Son, our Lord, who was born from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, who was crucified under Pontius Pilate ..." Thank you Mary for your "yes". Teach us how to have the faith and confidence to say "yes" to whatever God ask of us.

At the Annunciation, Mary became the Mother of God. This is her most exalted title, the source of all her other privileges. On Calvary Christ gave His Mother to all men to be their spiritual Mother, so that through her He came to them. It is the will of Jesus that we love His Mother. We should love her because she is our Mother. Amen.

To thrive as a faithful Catholic man, he needs an active and growing relationship with God, to intentionally invest in his formation and prayer life, and to build friendships that will sharpen him and hold him accountable to a life of holiness and virtue.

The COR program is designed for this purpose. It exists to form and strengthen Catholic men in faith and virtue, by drawing them into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ through prayer, formation and fraternity. The name COR, which is Latin for heart, was chosen because our faith, our relationship with God, and our formation begin with and reside in our heart.

Our COR gatherings are the first Sunday of the month at St. Mark's rectory from 9:15am-10:15am, and on the second Saturday of the month at St. Brigid office/rectory from 8am -9am. All our brother parishioners are invited, and we look forward to sharing and exploring our religion together.
