



The Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order

13TH CENTURY | FEAST DAY — FEBRUARY 17

In 1233, seven Florentine lay-men—two married, two widowed, three single—all well-known merchants and members of a Marian confraternity, abandoned homes, jobs, and wealth for a life of poverty, prayer, and penance at Monte Senario, where they built a chapel and hermitage. Within a few years, they formed the Order of Friar Servants of Mary, or Servites, a mendicant order that received formal papal approval in 1304. The seven founders, jointly canonized in 1888, are: Bonfilius, Bonajuncta, Amadeus, Hugh, Manettus, Sostene, and Alexis. Alexis, who out of modesty refused ordination, served the order in various ways as a lay brother; he outlived the other founders and reportedly died at age 110.

Dear friends in Christ,

As Catholics, we look to our parish priests for pastoral support in good times and in bad. For instance, they have been instrumental in offering God's sacramental grace at various milestones in our lives, as well as God's healing and comfort when loved ones faced illness or death. For those priests who are now retired, it is time for us to care for them.

On this Ash Wednesday, February 18, I invite you to support our Annual Diocesan Collection for the Support of our Diocesan Priests who have retired in good standing.

Unless illness intervened, our priests have cared for parish communities until they were at least 75. Some remained as pastors into their 80s. Many continue to serve as senior priests, temporary administrators, and offer sacramental coverage for pastors who are ill or on vacation, to name just a few examples. We value their efforts and are grateful for their continued help.

Our expenses for retired priests include a monthly stipend, medical insurance, and, for some, assisted living and nursing home costs. Last year our total cost for priests' retirement was \$2,260,940.

Four years ago, we began the Ash Wednesday Collection to help care for the retired priests of our own diocese. We appreciate your past generosity and ask that, as part of your Lenten almsgiving, you consider prayerfully a sacrificial gift to support priests who through the decades have supported you and your family.

Each December our diocese participates in a national collection for retired nuns, brothers and religious order priests. We thank you for your support of them. None of that collection, however, assists in the care of our retired diocesan priests.

Our 44 retired and senior priests have served in the majority of our parishes. They are Monsignors Richard E. Collette, Anthony S. Czarnecki, John E. Doran, Michael G. Foley, Francis D. Kelly, James A. Mongelluzzo and Francis J. Scollen; and Fathers Ernest P. Allega, Roger R. Boucher, Laurence V. Brault, C. Michael Broderick, Paul F. Campbell, James F. Carmody, George A. Charland, William N. Cormier, Andre E. Dargis, David E. Doiron, George A. Dunkley, John A. Dwyer, Lawrence J. Esposito, John J. Foley, David B. Galonek, Raymond M. Goodwin, Bernard J. Grochowski, John F. Hamm, Edward J. Hanlon, John E. Horgan, Joseph J. Jurgelonis, Terence T. Kilcoyne, Leo-Paul J. LeBlanc, Richard A. Lembo, Richard P. Lewandowski, Thirburse F. Millott, Chester J. Lent 2026

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On Ash Wednesday, we Christians mark the beginning of Lent! I am certain that many of us will acknowledge a longing for personal renewal and a desire to open ourselves more fully to the Lord during the forty days that lie ahead. These days offer a unique opportunity to rethink our attitudes and, with God's grace, to change our lives. Lent is a time to walk more conscientiously with the Lord so as to share more abundantly in His life and mission.

In this holy season we turn from sin and recommit ourselves to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. In doing this, we offer witness to the central role that the Son of God plays in our lives. Authentic spiritual conversion is never easy because it challenges us to move away from the self-indulgence which so often characterizes our times. It takes courage, conviction and commitment to "repent and believe the Good News." (Mark 1:14-20)

For Catholics, spiritual renewal is found in many ways: frequent reception of the Sacraments of Eucharist and Penance; the reading of the Scriptures; praying the Stations of the Cross; participating in Marian devotions like the Rosary; performing acts of charity such as the Corporal Works of Mercy. Particular attention should also be given to our traditional practices of fasting and abstinence that are required during this season of Lent.

I ask that you remember the poor and afflicted in a special way this year. Hopefully, we will all become more sensitive to the burdens of many people who suffer financial challenges, at home and abroad. Our prayers and generous sacrifices will truly help others. I am confident that we, each in our own way, will support the needs of the materially and spiritually poor wherever they are found.

Christ died and rose to life so that we might receive in full measure the dignity and freedom of the children of God. During this Lent, I would ask you to pray for the recognition of the dignity and sanctity of human life in all its stages, from its natural beginning to its natural end. In that light, we should ask the Lord unceasingly to bless all those who long for freedom and justice in our world, especially those who suffer the horrors of war and terrorism.


If we draw closer to the Lord in Lent, the joy of Easter will surely be ours in abundance!
