

First Sunday of Advent

November 27, 2022



And the Church begins the Advent Season singing, "O Come, O Come Emmanuel and ransom captive Israel, that mourns in lowly exile here, until the Son of God appear! Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel. Shall come to thee, O Israel." Once again we enter into this holy season with joyful hearts, minds and spirits in anticipation of the Savior who is to be born anew! Yes, it is a season of waiting, of stillness, of reflection, and of expectation and the Scriptures of this holy time encourage us in that expectant waiting EVEN THOUGH everywhere else is anything BUT calm, quiet and

serene. Prayerfully the Scriptures and the Music and the Environment brings forth the wonder of this season into our lives! Let's let that be our guide these many days.

Of course, the dwindling daylight also sets the stage, if you will for advent as we yearn for the coming of the Light – the Son of God. In these December days we are reminded of that yearning heart as we pray in hope for the Dawn of Christ. These days are for reflection, joy, anticipation and an eagerness as we count these 28 days to the Birth of Christ.

The Advent Wreath is foremost in our sanctuary space to remind us of the counting days until the Savior is born. The Advent color of violet in our new vestments also prompts us to know that this season of beginning is also a season to be reconciled. So we are encouraged to make a good confession.

The simple banners hung on the back sanctuary wall likewise reflect our yearning spirits – soon to be replaced with the colors of Christmas.

And without exception, the *subdued* and *minor keys* of our Advent music prompt us to a spirit that is a little off key as the words of each hymn tell the story of our yearning and hope.

So, come dear friends, and ENTER INTO this time of HOLINESS and WONDER and WANDER through the rereading of the stories of this season and make their story OURS. Put on the calm and the stillness of this season here in Church and take that spirit beyond our church doors and out it into the world! LET the world know we are a WAITING PEOPLE of FAITH!

CHRIST IS COMING

Advent is upon us! No longer are we waiting around in an Ordinary Time with no focus; the Christchild will be born soon and there is so much to do! Have you put up your Christmas tree yet? Devin and I have a tradition every year to wait until the day after Thanksgiving to buy our tree and decorate the house. The church color palette has been switched to a royal purple and we have new hymnals for the 2023 liturgical year; thank you so much to everyone who helped out! This year I have decided to have us continue singing the Mass for our Lady throughout the Advent and Christmas season because it is a new setting to our church community and I would like everyone to be really comfortable with it! We also have a new gospel acclamation for the Advent season that uses the tune of 'O Come, O Come Emmanuel' that will really keep us in the joyful spirit of waiting for Christmas day to come!

In Year A of the three-year liturgical reading cycle, we will be focusing on the gospel of Matthew. Matthew takes careful thought in connecting the birth of Christ fulfilling the prophecies in the Old Testament. Isaiah reassures of the coming of the kingdom of God, with the house of the Lord being Jesus Christ. God has had a plan in motion since the day he created life on earth, and his love has not once wavered. We are called to walk in the light of the Lord, and Jesus is coming to lead us back to the kingdom in heaven. Advent is a time for preparation and a time for prayer. Did you know that Catholics used to fast during Advent like we do now during Lent? Until 1918 when the obligation was removed, Catholics in the United States fasted on each Friday of Advent, and in Great Britain, Ireland, Canada, and Australia Wednesdays as well! We know that Christ is coming and now is the time to get ready!
