

Third Sunday of Advent

December 11, 2022

For John the Baptist, pointing to Christ as Messiah was complete fulfilment of God's work in him. He didn't do it for his own fame or reward, but merely to prepare the way. [Living the Word 2023]



The book of the prophet Isaiah consists of layers accumulated over time. Unlike most of the material in Chapters I-39, with its references to exile and return, more than likely reflects a post exile time and compose in response to the destruction of Jerusalem, the exile to Babylon and also the eventual return of some to Jerusalem. Yet, as God's Word, Isaiah's influence continues to offer hope in seemingly hopeless situations. "The desert will bloom . . . abundant flowers, joyful song . . ." Written in this manner, God's mighty past deeds provide assurance of what will be!

James writes of "patience" four times in this short passage this weekend and we probably dislike that word and its meaning. We are in general NOT patient. Amen? James repeated it because his people were living then in an in-between time: hoping for the coming of the Lord and it's not-yet time. James wants to encourage us, like farmer, the spring rains and one another. Our understanding of this ancient author is to be "expectant" and assured that the Lord is coming.

The Gospel author Matthew gets it as he mirrors John the Baptist's powerful statement from last week, "the one who is to come is mightier than I" with his question from prison, "Are you the one?" Clearly he is here with us!

Monday December 12th, the church celebrates the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, which recalls the apparitions of Mary to the native Juan Diego. The Feast goes back to the 16th century. Mary's appearance to Juan Diego as one of his people is a powerful reminder that Mary—and the God who sent her—accept all peoples. Mass on Monday is at 9:00am.



Wednesday evening December 14th is our Advent Penance & Absolution Service at 7pm. Making time for recon-

ciliation is an EXCELLENT way to prepare our minds, hearts and spirits for the Coming of the Lord. Making time for reconciliation is our earnest sign of desire to be with the Lord who is with us in all the times of our lives. See the flyer for a copy of the Examination of Conscience. BEGIN to prepare now and come together for the Penance and Absolution Service.

REJOICE FOR ROSE

I am looking for children grade 3-8 to sing in a Children's Choir for the Christmas Eve <u>4.pm</u> Mass! There will be two rehearsals the Tuesdays before Christmas at <u>6.pm</u> in the choir loft, and the children will also be singing carols beforehand as a prelude. If you are already going to this mass and have children who like to sing, this is the perfect time for them to get the choir experience! Please contact me by email if you would like your children to participate!

Two weeks until Christmas: excitement is in the air as we celebrate this week of joy with the Gaudete Sunday! By now, you hopefully have gotten a good start on gifts, baking, and plans with your loved ones. The third candle on our advent candle brings us rejoicing as we see Christ's birth on the horizon. The Music Ministry is diligently working to make sure that Christmas Eve and Christmas Day are Similar to the fourth Sunday of Lent, our priests and deacon are allowed to wear rose colored vestments to reflect this sentiment as well. Now we all agree that pink is a great color for men to wear, but there is actually a reason that the vestments are described specifically as rose! In the Latin version of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (aka the GIRM), it states in 346f that "Color rosaceus adhiberi potest," which translates to 'Rose may be used' in the US version. The bright pink we think of is not actually found in our color spectrum, and cannot be found naturally in the wild. However, rose is technically a shade of red, not pink, and certain vegetables, flowers, and other plants are available to make a naturally blue-tinted 'pink' color. The color rose is only used twice a year in our liturgical calendar, which makes it even more special, so rejoice!
