**REGISTRATION** for the 2019/2020 school year has begun. Registration forms will be available in the back of the Church, in the Parish offices, and will be handed out in all classes beginning the first week of April. All brand new registrants must make an appointment with Sr. Philomena, call 255-0237. Registration can also be done online on our Parish website. Get your registrations in early to avoid the late fee, and to be sure to reserve your child's space in class... classes fill fast! Unfortunately our 7th/8th grade Confirmation Preparation class is full, therefore we can't accept any new students. If your child is currently in our program, their space is already reserved, but you do need to complete a registration form for next year.

There is a mandatory Confirmation Preparation retreat for 7th and 8th grade students on Thursday, July 18. If students can't go on this retreat, there is another option on Tuesday, August 20. Please send in your permission slip as soon as possible, as seats on the bus fill up fast. Extra slips are available in the Parish Office. 

Parishioners who are gluten intolerant should see the priest before Mass so that a low-gluten host can be placed on the altar for consecration. At Communion time, please come forward with the Eucharistic Ministers and receive the Body and Blood of Christ with them. Totally gluten-free hosts are not available, so for those gluten-intolerant persons who cannot receive even the low-gluten host, they can of course still receive the Precious Blood from the chalice. Catholics believe that whether Holy Communion is received under the form of bread or under the form of wine, the whole Christ is being received.
