HOW WE ARE DOING FINANCIALLY AS A PARISH



In this time of financial difficulties for so many people, we want to be transparent about what we are receiving as income, and how we are spending the money you all so graciously and so lovingly offer to us.

*For February 2023 (figures are rounded up)*  
**Ordinary income- \$38,500**  
**Ordinary expenses- \$48,400**

**Please note: these figures do not include the charitable contributions we make to individuals from our Solanus Casey Fund and the food pantry expenses (both of those are paid out of a dedicated fund).**

As you can easily see, ordinary expenses were a good deal higher than ordinary income in February. For the most part, it was "business as usual", but as always there were a couple of extraordinary expenses connected to things that are essential to the upkeep and the efficient utilization of our buildings and our property- for this month, including repairs to one of our vehicles and snow removal. And of course, utility bills have been high, and you all know why!

We continue to monitor all of our expenses and limit them whenever and wherever we can, without of course hurting our essential ministries or our ability to help our brothers and sisters in our parish family and in the greater community.

To help us to ensure that we can function financially as we should, we humbly ask you to prayerfully discern what you can offer to the parish in your weekly contributions and your general donations. Whatever you can offer to your parish family, know that it is very much appreciated and is essential in allowing this wonderful parish to continue to function.

If you have any questions about the figures above, or about anything else related to our current financial situation, please contact Fr. Salvatore and he would be happy to answer them the best that he could.

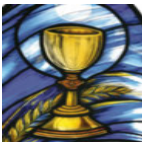
**WHO'S WHO IN THE OLD TESTAMENT-**

## FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

**RECONCILIATION MONDAY-** On *Monday, April 3*, every parish in the Archdiocese of New York will offer an opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession). By participating in this sacrament, a person can experience the healing love of God in Jesus Christ and is reconciled to God and neighbor. Please consider taking advantage of this opportunity for forgiveness and for peace of mind and soul.

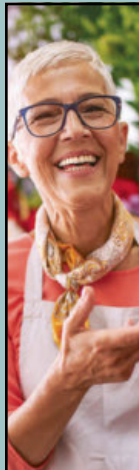
