

From the desk of Father Rob

School Starts This Week! It is hard to believe that the academic year is upon us already. As last week's bulletin mentioned, we have a number of changes in our school. Mrs. Diece, Hodge, Bakke, and Pursley, will be starting anew this year. Welcome to them and to all our new students, as well as all those students returning. This morning, after the 10:30 AM Mass, will be a Back to School Picnic for the students and their families. A big thanks goes toward the Knights of Columbus for providing the hot dogs and donating their time for this day. Welcome back!

Mass Intentions: In the bulletin, you will typically see a list of intentions for the coming week. What is the purpose of that? In our Catholic faith, the Mass is the most powerful prayer. It is the sacrifice of Jesus Christ that is re-presented. At each Mass, Christ offers Himself to the Father for the salvation of the world. At each Mass we ask Christ for His mercy and to hear our prayers. Specifically, in the Church's tradition, Mass has been celebrated for our dead. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says: "Our prayer for them (the dead) is capable not only of helping them, but also of making their intercession for us effective." One such person who knew the effectiveness of Mass and souls of the dead is St. Margaret Mary. She wrote: "How grateful should I be if you would help me by your prayers to relieve my 'dear suffering friends', for so I call them. There is nothing I would not do or suffer to help them. I assure you they are not ungrateful." As the years pass, many of the newer Catholics and those who are not familiar with our tradition do not realize the power of the Mass for the deceased. Because of this lack of understanding, the number of Mass intentions has been slowly dropping. I write this to reinforce the practice of offering Masses for the dead, whether they have recently died or died some time ago. Also, Masses are celebrated for the living as well. Consider putting this practice part of your faith. To schedule a Mass intention, please call Sharlet at our parish office.

SCRIPTURE

Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

"The words I have spoken to you are Spirit and life. But there are some of you who do not believe." And he said, "For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by my Father." As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him. - Jn 6:63c-64a, 65-66

"This saying is hard; who can accept it?" The words of Jesus' disciples in today's Gospel must sound familiar. At some point in our lives, you and I have said it about some article of our faith. Christianity makes firm demands on our ethical behavior and gives no easy answers for suffering. Many disciples were confused and dismayed by Jesus' words in the Bread of Life Discourse. Not all of them, however, had the same reaction.

When the disciples question Jesus' teaching, he confirms its truth. "The words I have spoken to you are spirit and life." For some, Jesus' reassurance was not enough. These disciples do not question Jesus further or wrestle with their lack of understanding. The mighty deeds Jesus has done fade to the background. "Many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him." For them, their doubt proves too much.

Jesus turns to the Twelve, knowing that confusion lives in their hearts as well. Peter answers. "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." Notice this is not a confession of perfect understanding. It is a confession of faith in Jesus. The precise words may still confuse them, but they believe the One who said them. In our own lives, we face doubt, confusion, and disillusionment in our Christian faith. The same choice available to the disciples is available to us. Do you have faith in Jesus, even when you lack perfect understanding? Will you stay or will you go? What do you do with your doubt?

This week we celebrate two saints, a mother and son: St. Monica and St. Augustine. As a young Christian woman, St. Monica was married to a pagan. Early in their marriage, he was bitter and critical. After nearly 20 years, Monica's holy example led to his conversion to Christianity. In the meantime, Augustine was a teenager beginning to live a wild life of self-indulgent excess. This lifestyle would continue into his adulthood. Like with her husband, Monica prayed and fasted for the conversion of her son. Augustine met another future saint, the bishop Ambrose of Milan, who greatly influenced his perspective on life. Augustine was baptized a Christian! Augustine later became a bishop and one of the most influential thinkers in Christian history. How's that for the power of patience and intercessory prayer?
