From the desk of Father Rob

Saints Corner: The Church is a divine institution. Christ is the head of His Church. The members of His body, the Church, are human beings. All human beings, to varying degrees, are weak and broken. All members of the Church need healing. Unfortunately, we remember all too often the sin and brokenness when it comes to the failures of others. The Church today is undergoing a crisis. Certain members of the clergy, bishops and priests, have violated the trust of the people concerning abuse. It is scandalous and shocking, and the behavior disappoints us, angers us, and saddens us.

Throughout the history of the Church, we have had some big sins and sinners. At certain times in the Church's history, priests did not act with chastity. Bishops would sell church offices to the highest bidder. Members of religious orders were lax in their duties and lax in living their vows of chastity, poverty, and obedience. But as tempting as it is to focus on the sinners, there have been and there are many in the Church, be they lay or clergy, committed to following Christ and living out their vocation.

On this final Sunday of Ordinary Time, the saint for today is St. Catherine of Alexandria. She was born of a noble Egyptian family in the 4th century. By all accounts, she was a beautiful, young woman who was wealthy and educated. Was Catherine aware of the faults of Christians during her time? No question. But despite that, she was drawn to the Gospel and converted to the faith when she was eighteen years old. This is important since being a Christian meant death. Not only did Catherine live her faith in private, she also publicly witnessed it. She would go around her city preaching the Gospel. Catherine also denounced the Emperor for persecuting Christians. The Emperor was not amused and murdered any person who converted through Catherine's efforts. He did offer her a royal marriage if she would deny Christ. Catherine refused and she was thrown into prison. During her incarceration, Catherine brought the Emperor's wife and 200 of his soldiers to the Catholic faith. All of them were put to death. Finally, Catherine herself was condemned to death. Despite all her temptations and trials, Catherine loved Christ, the One who loved her before time began. May we find the strength to love and follow the Lord in the midst of our struggles and gain victory as she did.

SCRIPTURE

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Jesus answered, "My kingdom does not belong to this world. If my kingdom did belong to this world, my attendants would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not here." - Jn 18:36

"Hail the King of the Jews." The kingship of Christ has always been different than the world expected. Many of Jesus' disciples hoped for an earthly Messiah who would overthrow the Romans. But, as Jesus says in today's Gospel, his kingdom is "not of this world." And yet it is a very real kingdom. Jesus is a very real Lord. And we are called to invite Jesus to be king of our lives. In the early 20th century, disillusionment with authority of all kinds was growing. Revolutions, atheistic thinkers, and World War I contributed to a rejection of faith. In 1925, Pope Pius XI called the Church and the world back to a sense of hope in Christ. He instituted the solemnity of Christ the King on the last Sunday before Advent. How is Jesus king of your life today?


