Thousands are expected to walk with Jesus in this bilingual Stations of the Cross journey, known as Via Crucis or Way of the Cross. The faithful will participate in a dramatic spiritual journey in which they recall the suffering of Christ and the redemption of the world through the Cross. Actors portray Jesus' arrest, trial, crucifixion, and death.
