St. Abraham of Smolensk [d. 1221]

Born to a wealthy Russian family, he was the 13th child after 12 daughters. His parents died when he was young, giving him the freedom to pursue life as a monk. He gave his vast wealth to churches, monasteries and the poor. He became very popular among the laity as he worked for the sick and troubled. He was also a noted biblical scholar in preMongol Russia. He lived austere and preached on the Last Judgment. His selfless apostolate for the sick and poor of the region, caused tension with the local clergy due to his popularity and was thus exiled. When a terrible drought struck Smolensk soon afterward, the laity demanded Fr. Abraham be restored to his serving the poor and preaching. Fr. Abraham urged everyone to reminisce about death and to pray day and night, that they be not condemned in the Judgment by God.

RECOGNIZING A STROKE

Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify. Unfortunately, the lack of awareness spells disaster. The stroke victim may suffer severe brain damage when people nearby fail to recognize the symptoms of a stroke. Now doctors say a bystander can recognize a stroke by asking three simple questions:

S * Ask the individual to SMILE.

T * Ask the person to TALK and SPEAK A SIMPLE SENTENCE (Coherently) (i.e. Chicken Soup)

R * Ask him or her to RAISE BOTH ARMS.

If he or she has trouble with ANY ONE of these tasks, call emergency number immediately and describe the symptoms to the dispatcher.

New Sign of a Stroke ----- Stick out Your Tongue!

NOTE: Another 'sign' of a stroke is this: Ask the person to 'stick' out his tongue. If the tongue is 'crooked', if it goes to one side or the other that is also an indication of a stroke.

AMAZING SIMPLE HOME REMEDIES: THESE REALLY WORK!!

1. To avoid cutting yourself when slicing vegetables, get someone else to hold the vegetables while you chop.
2. To avoid argument with the females about lifting the toilet seat, use the sink.

100th Anniversary of Fatima—What Happened The Lady Who Came From Heaven!

The Vision of Hell! (First part of the secret) As Our Lady spoke these words she opened her hands. The light seemed to penetrate the earth and we saw, as it were, a sea of fire. Plunged in this fire were demons and souls in human form, like transparent burning embers, all blackened and burnished bronze, floating about in the conflagration, now raised into the air by the flames that issued from within themselves, together with great clouds of smoke, now falling back on every side like sparks in huge fires, without weight or equilibrium, amid shrieks and groans of pain and despair, which horrified us and made us tremble with fear. The demons could be distinguished by their terrifying and repellent likeness to frightful and unknown animals, black and transparent like burning coals. Terrified and as if to plead for succor, we looked up at Our Lady, who said to us so sadly: "You have seen hell where souls of poor sinners go. To save them, God wishes to establish in the world devotion to Immaculate Heart. If what I say to you is done, many souls will be saved. And there will be peace. The war is going to end: but if people do not cease offending God, a worse one will break out during the pontificate of Pius XI. When you see a night illumined by an unknown light, (This occurred on January 25, 1938) know that this is the great sign given you by God that He is about to punish the world for its crimes, by means of war, famine, and persecutions of the church and of the Holy Father."

The Request for the Consecration of Russia! (Second part of the secret) "To prevent this, I shall come to ask for the consecration of Russia to my Immaculate Heart, and the communion of Reparation on the First Saturdays. If my requests are heeded, Russia will be converted and there will peace; if not, she will spread her errors throughout the world causing wars and persecutions of the Church. The good will be martyred; the Holy Father will have much to suffer; various nations will be annihilated. In the end, My immaculate Heart will triumph. The Holy Father will consecrate Russia to me and she will be converted, and a period of peace will be granted to the world."

The Call to Penance! Third part of Secret Obeying an order from her Bishop, Sister Lucia wrote the last part of the secret on January 3, 1944. It was not made public until the year 2000, after the beatification of Jacinta and Francisco: "At the left of our Lady and little above, we saw an Angel with a flaming sword in his left hand flashing, it gave out flames that looked as though they would set the world on fire, but they died out in contact with the splendor that our Lady radiated toward him from her right hand. Pointing to the earth with his right hand, the angel cried out in a loud voice: Penance, Penance, Penance! We saw an immense light that is God, something similar to how people appear in a mirror when they pass in front of it, a bishop dressed in white (we had the impression it was the Holy Father), and other bishops priests and men and women religious going up a steep mountain, at the top of which there was a big cross of roughhewn trunks as of a cork tree with the bark. Before reaching there the Holy Father passed through a big city half in ruins, and half trembling with a halting step, afflicted with pain and sorrow, he prayed for the souls of the corpses he met along his way. Having reached the top of the mountain, on his knees at the foot of the big cross he was killed by a group of soldiers who fired bullets and arrows at him, and in the same way there died one after another the other bishops, priests, men and women religious, and various lay people of different ranks and positions. Beneath the two arms of the cross there were two angels each with a crystal aspersorium in their hand, in which they gathered up the blood of martyrs and with it sprinkled the souls that were making their way to God.."

Our Lady said, "Do not tell anyone. Francisco, yes, you may tell him. When you pray the Rosary, say, after each mystery: "O my Jesus, forgive us, save us from the fire of hell. Lead all souls to heaven, especially those who are in most need". She then disappeared off into the distance.

The August Apparition On August 13, the children were kidnapped by the mayor of Vila Nova de Ourem, Arturo Santos, and interrogated about the secret. Despite threats of death, they refused to divulge it. Within a few days, they were released. The following Sunday, August 19th, Lucia and Francisco were together at a place called Valinhos, near Aljustrel, when they recognized that the Lady was approaching, so they sent for Jacinta. The Lady spoke to Lucia: "I want you to continue going to the Cova da Iria on the 13th and to continue praying the Rosary every day. In the last month, I will perform a miracle so that all may believe." She asked that the money left by pilgrims be used to build a chapel there in her honor. Looking very sad, the lady then said, "Pray, Pray very much, and make sacrifices for sinners; for many souls go to hell, because there are none to sacrifice themselves and pray for them." She also reported that because of their imprisonment, "The promised miracle in October would not be as great." With that she rose into the air and moved towards the east before disappearing.

On September 13, very large crowds converged on Fatima from all directions. When the apparition began, Our Lady spoke to Lucia, "Continue to pray in order to obtain the end of war. In October our Lord will come, as well as Our Lady of Sorrows and Our Lady of Carmel. St. Joseph will appear with the child Jesus to bless the world. God is pleased with your sacrifices. He does not want you to sleep with the rope on, but only wear it during the daytime" (the children were wearing a rope tightly tied around their waist as a way to offer penance). Lucia then put forward some petitions for cures, and was told: "Yes, I will cure some, but not others. In October I will perform a miracle so that all may believe." Then she began to rise and disappeared."

The October Apparition The prediction of a public miracle caused intense speculation throughout Portugal, and people from all over the country descended by the tens of thousands on the Cova despite the terrible storm that lashed the mountain country around Fatima. Many pilgrims walked barefooted, reciting the Rosary as they went, all crowding into the area on October 13. By midmorning heavy rain began to fall. The children reached the holm Oak around noon and then saw the customary flash of light as Our Lady appeared. Lucia again asked what she wanted: "I want to tell you that a chapel is to be built here in my honor. I am the Lady of the Rosary. Continue always to pray the Rosary every day. The war is going to end, and the soldiers will soon return to their homes." Lucia made requests for cures, conversions and other things. Our Lady responded, "Some yes, but not others." They must amend their lives and ask forgiveness for their sins." The Lady grew very sad and said; "Do not offend the Lord our God anymore, because He is already so much offended." Then, opening her hands, she made them reflect on the sun and as she ascended, the reflection of her own light projected on the sun itself. After she disappeared, as the people witnessed the great miracle which had been predicted, the children saw the visions foretold during the September apparition.
