Christ IS Risen! It was a joy to celebrate with such great number of parishioners and visitors the Resurrection of our Lord. Our little Church was filled with life and *Life from the emptied tomb*. So many volunteers helped us and participated in so many ways throughout. May God reward you ALL!

Did You Know?

Scientist: Shroud of Turin captures Jesus RISING, not lying dead

Dr. Gilbert Lavoie, a seasoned physician and former skeptic, spent decades investigating the Shroud of Turin and came to a stunning conclusion: The cloth doesn't show a man lying in death but one rising in glory.

Through anatomical analysis, photographic comparisons, and gravity-based experiments, Dr. Lavoie discov-



ered that the image depicts a man in an upright position capturing, he believes, the very moment of Jesus Christ's resurrection.

What began as scientific curiosity became a profound journey into theology, leading Lavoie to connect his findings with the Gospel of John and Christ's promise to be "lifted up." He began working on a 3D image of the upright man over a 7 year period, first with an artist, and then sculptor, Pablo Edouardo, a master of art anatomy. They spent 3-1/2 years on and off working on the sculpture... two years just on the face. His 3D reconstruction of the man of the shroud now stands at the Saint John Paul II National Shrine as a powerful witness to the divinity of Jesus.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY APRIL 27

Jesus told St. Faustina that this Feast of Mercy would be a very special day when "all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened." (Diary 699) Our Lord made a great promise to all those souls who would go to Confession and then receive Him in Holy Communion on the Feast of His Mercy, now called Divine Mercy Sunday through out the Catholic Church. Jesus promised that "The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain the complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." (Diary 699) He went on to say "I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My Mercy." (Diary 1109) We want to encourage everyone to take advantage of this incredible promise and the additional Plenary Indulgence on this great Feast of Mercy "Divine Mercy Sunday". It is required of all Catholics to confess their sins at least once every year. Those who have already confessed sins for Éaster could make room for others. It is allowed for one to go to Confession up to about 20 days before or after Divine Mercy Sunday. There is a beautiful meaning behind the two rays coming from Jesus' chest in the Divine Mercy image. St. Faustina wrote Jesus' words in her diary, Divine Mercy in My Soul, after asking Him the meaning. Before we discuss the meaning, take a look at the full image.


The image here depicts two rays coming from Jesus' chest: one pale ray and one red ray. But what does this mean?

St. Faustina's confessor, Blessed Fr. Michał Sopocko, requested that she ask Jesus for an explanation of these rays. Here's what Jesus said:

"The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls.

"These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross.

"These rays shield souls from the



"Ask of my faithful servant [Father Sopocko] that, on this day, he tell the whole world of My great mercy; that whoever approaches the Fount of Life on this day will be granted complete remission of sins and punishment.

"Mankind will not have peace until it turns with trust to My mercy."

"Oh, how much I am hurt by a soul's distrust! Such a soul professes that I am Holy and Just, but does not believe that I am Mercy and does not trust in My Goodness. My Heart rejoices in this title of Mercy.
