



## PENTECOST SUNDAY TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Pentecost Sunday is one of the most ancient feasts of the Church, celebrated early enough to be mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles (20:16) and St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians (16:8). It is the 50th day after Easter (if we count both Easter and Pentecost), and it supplants the Jewish feast of Pentecost, which took place 50 days after the Passover and which celebrated the sealing of the Old Covenant on Mount Sinai. Christ had promised His Apostles that He would send His Holy Spirit, and, on Pentecost, they were granted the gifts of the Spirit. The Apostles began to preach the Gospel in all of the languages. Pentecost is often called "the birthday of the Church." On this day, with the descent of the Holy Spirit, Christ's mission is completed, and the New Covenant is inaugurated. Today we are at the fiftieth day of the Easter celebration: seven weeks of seven days, a week of weeks, now culminating in a festival fiftieth day. While the liturgical color of the Easter season is gold, on this last day we have red. For the first thousand years of the church, there were no firm rules for using colors. Only wealthy churches could afford a full array of colors, and most places used the best vestments, no matter the color, for the greatest feasts. The Church spelled out an exact plan for color, including red for Pentecost, only in 1570, but local differences held on until the 1800s. Color experts tell us that red is a ho t color, best used for fast paced, upbeat, active experiences. It is hard to be neutral before red, as any matador will tell you. It invites commitment, draws you in. It is a stimulating color, engaging the eye, stirring hunger. It is the most fitting color for this day when we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit into our lives, a dynamic presence overturning neutrality in favor of passion and commitment.

## PENTECOST THE CHURCH'S BIRTHDAY

On Pentecost the Apostles left the Upper Room, the site of the Last Supper, where they had been barricaded for fifty days. (The Greek word, Pentecost, means 'Fiftieth day'.) For fifty days the Apostles prayed with Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and other holy women and men; once they were infused with power from on high, they began what is also called the "Age of the Church". From Pentecost until the Parousia (The Greek title for the Second Coming of Christ in glory) the work Jesus began during His earthly life will continue through His Body on earth today: the Church. And so Pentecost is rightly called the Church's birthday.

- <u>IF YOU</u> are a member of one of the 11 Orthodox Churches your Church seceded from the Roman Catholic Church in the year 1054.
- **IF YOU** are a member of one of the 20 groups of The Lutheran Synod your sect was founded by Martin Luther in 1517.
- **IF YOU** are a member of one of the 17 groups of The Mennonites your sect was founded by several reformers in 1523.
- **IF YOU** are a member of the Episcopal-Anglican Communion your Church was founded by Thomas Crammer in 1534.
- <u>IF YOU</u> are a member of one of the ten groups of The Presbyterians your sect was founded by John Knox in 1560.
- **IF YOU** are a member of one of the 23 branches of The Baptists your sect was founded by John Smyth in 1600.
- **IF YOU** are a member of one of the 19 groups of Methodists your sect was founded by John and Charles Wesley in 1739.
- **IF YOU** are a member of The Disciples of Christ your group was founded by Thomas and Alexander Campbell in 1827.
- **IF YOU** are a member of one of the 7 branches of The Church of Latter Day Saints your religion was founded by Joseph Smith in 1830.
- **IF YOU** are a member of one of the 5 branches of The Seventh Day Adventists your sect was founded by William Miller in 1831.
- **IF YOU** are a member of the Salvation Army your group was founded by William Booth in 1865.
- <u>IF YOU</u> are a member of the Jehovah Witnesses your religion was founded by Charles Russell in 1872.
- **IF YOU** are a member of the Church of Christian Scientist your group was founded by Mary Baker Eddy in 1879.
- **IF YOU** are a member of nine groups of The Pentecostal Assemblies your sect was founded by revivalists in 1901,

**BUT IF YOU** are a member of the Roman Catholic Church, only you can trace your Church's foundation to the disciples and Jesus Christ on Pentecost. It was on this day that the Holy Spirit came down to the 12 disciples to enlighten and empower them to take charge and fulfill the commands of Jesus Christ. The Roman Catholic Church, unlike the 400 or more groups that have broken off from it, remains One in Faith, One in Fold, with One Shepherd.

#### REQUIREMENTS FOR BAPTISM OR CONFIRMATION SPONSOR

Godparent/Sponsor must be at least 16 years old \* Godparent/Sponsor must be in good standing with the Catholic Church. Must be a practicing Catholic (Attend Sunday Mass weekly). \* Must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Communion, and Confirmation. If married, must be married in the Catholic Church. \* If single, not living with significant other, nor married civilly only. \* Godparent/Sponsor cannot be the candidate's parent. Each child only requires one Godparent. If you wish to have two Godparents, there must be one female and one male. (Canon Law 872-874)

#### Sacred Matrimony on Sacred ground

"ceremony" at the venue is not a valid Sacrament

For the Catholic Church the Sacrament of Matrimony is such a sacred matter that the Church requires for two Catholics to be married Sacramentally in the Catholic Church, not elsewhere. All the Sacraments except Confession are always celebrated in Church. Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation and the Sacred Orders (Priesthood is even celebrated at the Cathedral of a given Diocese). A Catholic priest can only officiate Sacrament of Matrimony of two Catholics on sacred grounds (Church). This wedding at the same time is a civil wedding. For more info contact Fr. Wojciech.

## **Catechism of the Catholic Church**

§ 797-799 (trans. rev.)

"What the soul is to the human body, the Holy Spirit is to the Body of Christ, which is the Church" (St Augustine)... The Holy Spirit makes the Church "the temple of the living God" (2 Co 6:16; 1 Co 3:16). Indeed, "it is to the Church herself that the 'Gift of God' has been entrusted.... In it is in her that communion with Christ has been deposited, that is to say: the Holy Spirit, the pledge of incorruptibility, the strengthening of our faith and the ladder of our ascent to God... For where the Church is, there also is God's Spirit; where God's Spirit is, there is the Church and every grace" (St. Irenaeus). The Holy Spirit... works in many ways to build up the whole Body in charity: by God's Word ...; by Baptism, through which he forms Christ's Body (1 Cor 12:13); by the sacraments, which give growth and healing to Christ's members; by "the grace of the apostles, which holds first place among his gifts" (Vat II, LG 7); by the virtues, which make us act according to what is good; finally, by the many special graces (called "charisms"), by which he makes the faithful "fit and ready to undertake various tasks and offices for the renewal and building up of the Church" (LG 12). Whether extraordinary or simple and humble, charisms are graces of the Holy Spirit which directly or indirectly benefit the Church, ordered as they are to her building up, to the good of men, and to the needs of the world.

Breathe in me, O Holy Spirit,
That my thoughts may all be holy.
Act in me, O Holy Spirit,
That my work, too, may be holy.
Draw my heart, O Holy Spirit,
That I love but what is holy.
Strengthen me, O Holy Spirit,

#### **Quotes from St. John Paul II on Pentecost**

"In the Acts of the Apostles, St Luke describes the extraordinary manifestation of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost as a communication of the very vitality of God who gives himself to men. This divine gift is also *light and power. light*, to proclaim the Gospel, the Truth revealed by God; *power*, to infuse the courage of witnessing to the faith, which the Apostles begin at that very moment" (May 18, 1997).

"Mary Most Holy, since Pentecost you have kept watch with the Church as she prays for the Holy Spirit: remain with us at the centre of our extraordinary Upper Room. To you, whom we venerate as *Our Lady of Divine Love*, we entrust the fruits of the City Mission, so that through your intercession the Diocese of Rome may offer the world a convinced witness to Christ our Saviour" (May 22, 1999).

"On the day when we celebrate the memorial of the Church's birth, we want to express *heartfelt gratitude to God* for this *twofold*, and ultimately *one*, witness, which has involved the great family of the Church since the day of Pentecost. We want to give thanks for the witness of the first community of Jerusalem which, through the generations of martyrs and confessors, has become the inheritance of countless men and women down the ages around the world" (June 10, 2000).

"The Church of Christ is always, so to speak, in a situation of Pentecost: she is always gathered in the Upper Room in prayer, and at the same time, driven by the powerful wind of the Spirit, she is always on the streets preaching" -John Paul II (June 8, 2003).

## Mary, Mother of the Church

Monday after Pentecost

In 2018 Pope Francis added a feast day for Mary, Mother of the Church to be celebrated on the Monday following Pentecost – and the date he chose was intentional. On Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the birthday of the Church and on the memorial of Mary, Mother of the Church, we celebrate the fact that Mary, as the mother of Our Lord, is intrinsically linked to the Church as her mother.

In issuing his decree to add this feast day to the Church's calendar, Pope Francis wished to promote this



devotion to "encourage the growth of the maternal sense of the Church in the pastors, religious and faithful, as well as a growth of genuine Marian piety."

This year, the feast day is on June 9th. What is the significance of today's feast? The feast of Pentecost was possible because of our Blessed Mother. Today, in complementary fashion, we honor Mary in her title of Mother of the Church. Although this feast is a new one-created in 2018 by Pope Francis - this title is one of the Blessed Mother's oldest titles.

The early Church Fathers - such as St. Augustine of Hippo - liked to speak of her as the Mother of the Church. It reminds us that Mary is the means by which our Salvation came into the world. She gave birth to Christ so that our souls could be born anew in His Church. Moreover, after Jesus formed the Church, He gave her into the maternal care of His own Mother.

From the Cross, Jesus entrusted the Blessed Mother and St. John to each other's care. The Church traditionally holds that St. John represented every soul who has ever been and ever will be baptized into the Church.

When Jesus said to Mary, "Woman, behold your son," He gave not only St. John but also His entire Church into her maternal keeping. Since then, she has unfailingly protected us, and in return we take her into our souls and run to her as our perfect, loving Mother.


