DID YOU KNOW??? ... that Guglielmo Marconi,

a devout Roman Catholic of Irish/Italian descent, is credited with perfecting a practical wireless radio system. By 1932, he had successfully installed a working radio-telephone system between Vatican City and Castel Gandolfo, the Pope's summer residence. But the impetus for his research in the wireless derived from a fantastic theory - Marconi believed, erroneously, that sound waves, as well as electromagnetic radio waves, travel out into space without fully dissipating. He imagined that these sound waves, produced by human speech, would leave behind a faint residual pattern which could be amplified and reproduced through the workings of a radio receiver. Incredible as it seems, with the most pious of intentions, Marconi was obsessed with the desire to intercept, by radio, the seven last words spoken by Our Lord on the Cross!

St. Veronica of Jerusalem - July 12

Patron of laundry workers & photographers.

During Christ's Passion, Jesus was beaten, whipped, and spit upon – not to mention the countless other cruel treatments He endured. He had blood, sweat, and mud smeared across His face. The crowd mocked and jeered Him as He made His way to Golgotha, carrying His cross.

There was one person, however, who was filled with compassion and had the courage enough to step forward and show Him a small act of kindness. Her name was Saint Veronica.

There is no mention of St. Veronica in the Bible, and no one knows her backstory or what happened to her after the Crucifixion. We know it has been passed down through Catholic tradition and commemorated in the Sixth Station of the Cross.

While Jesus was carrying His cross through Jerusalem, Veronica came forward and offered to wipe His face. Her kindness imprinted His image on her veil. This veil has become known as the Veil of Veronica and is considered one of the Church's most treasured relics.

According to legend, Veronica left the Holy Land, taking the veil with her. She came to Rome and allegedly used it to cure the ailing Emperor Tiberius. From then on, the veil stayed in Rome and eventually was placed in the Vatican and displayed for public veneration.

Rumors surfaced that it was destroyed in 1527 during the Sack of Rome. Also, around this time, many copies were created and passed off as genuine, so it became hard to tell which one was the original. The Vatican, however, had the veil that was most possibly to be the authentic relic since it could be traced back to the Medieval period.

In 1616, Pope Paul V banned the creation of more copies of the Veil of Veronica. In 1629, Pope Urban VIII ordered that all copies be destroyed or sent to the Vatican. Anyone who did not obey would be excommunicated.

Today, the Vatican still has the Veil of Veronica from the Medieval period preserved and in safekeeping, though it is rarely seen in public. It is displayed very briefly on the 5th Sunday of Lent each year.

We can follow St. Veronica's lead and imitate her simple act of charity by treating others with respect and kindness and helping those who are hurt and in need.

REQUIREMENTS FOR BAPTISM OR CONFIRMATION SPONSOR

Godparent/Sponsor must be at least 16 years old * **Godparent/Sponsor must be in good standing with the Catholic Church.** Must be a practicing Catholic (*Attend Sunday Mass weekly*). * Must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Communion, and Confirmation. If married, must be married in the Catholic Church. * If single, not living with significant other, nor married civilly only. * **Godparent/Sponsor cannot be the candidate's parent.** Each child only requires one Godparent. If you wish to have two Godparents, there must be one female and one male. (Canon Law 872874)

Sacred Matrimony on Sacred ground

"ceremony" at the venue is not a valid Sacrament

For the Catholic Church the Sacrament of Matrimony is such a sacred matter that the Church requires for two Catholics to be married Sacramentally in the Catholic Church, not elsewhere. All the Sacraments except Confession are always celebrated in Church. Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation and the Sacred Orders (Priesthood is even celebrated at the Cathedral of a given Diocese). A Catholic priest can only officiate Sacrament of Matrimony of two Catholics on sacred grounds (Church). This wedding at the same time is a civil wedding. For more info contact Fr. Wojciech.

1. A Sacrament is defined as "an outward sign of inward grace" which was instituted by Christ Himself and receives its power from God, through the merits of Christ.
2. Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, Penance (Confession, Reconciliation), Matrimony, Holy Orders, Extreme Unction-Anointing of the Sick.
3. To counsel the doubtful, to instruct the ignorant, to admonish the sinner, to comfort the sorrowful, to forgive all injuries, to bear wrongs patiently, to pray for the living and the dead.
4. To feed the hungry, to give drink to the thirsty, to clothe the naked, to shelter the homeless, to visit the sick, to visit the imprisoned, to bury the dead.

Ladybugs a Sign of Our Lady?

Have you heard the endearing story about how the ladybug earned its name?

Ladybugs are associated with various symbols, including luck and good fortune. However, did you know there is a symbol from a Catholic perspective?

The story goes that in Europe during the Middle Ages, swarms of pesky insects (probably aphids) destroyed crops and threatened faithful farming communities with starvation.

"Locusts came, grasshoppers without number.
They devoured every plant in the land; they
devoured the crops of their fields."

— Psalms 105:34-35

In desperation, the farmers, who had a devotion to the Blessed Mother, turned to the Virgin Mary for help! Soon after, a cloud of black-spotted, red-orange insects came and devoured the plant-destroying pests, saving the crops!

The farmers considered this an answer to their prayers and a sign of Our Lady's intercession. They began referring to these life-saving, beautiful insects as "Our Lady's Bugs."

Variations of this name, including "The Beetles of Our Lady" and "Lady Beetles," came about. In Germany, the term "Marienkäfer" means "Marybeetle." The bug's red-orange wings represent the mantle of the Blessed Virgin Mary, while the black spots symbolize her joys and sorrows.

St. Augustine Zhao Rong & Companions July 9

Christianity arrived in China by way of Syria in the 600s. Depending on China's relations with the outside world, Christianity over the centuries was free to grow or was forced to operate secretly.

The 120 martyrs in this group died between 1648 and 1930. Most of them (87) were born in China and were children, parents, catechists or laborers, ranging from nine years of age to 72. This group includes four Chinese diocesan priests.

The 33 foreign-born martyrs were mostly priests or women religious, especially from the Order of Preachers, the Paris Foreign Mission Society, the Friars Minor, Jesuits, Salesians and Franciscan Missionaries of Mary.

Augustine Zhao Rong was a Chinese soldier who accompanied Bishop John Gabriel Taurin Dufresse (Paris Foreign Mission Society) to his martyrdom in Beijing. Augustine was baptized and not long after was ordained as a diocesan priest. He was martyred in 1815.

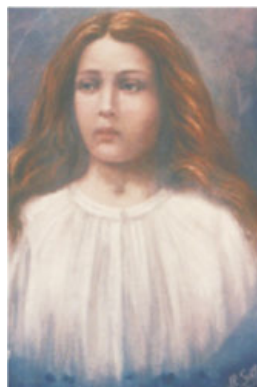
Beatified in groups at various times, these 120 martyrs were canonized in Rome on October 1, 2000.

Saint Maria Goretti - Patroness of Youth



St. Maria Goretti, called by Pope Pius XII "the St. Agnes of the 20th Century," was born on a small farm near Ancona, Italy, in 1890. The third of seven children, she was, in the words of her mother, "happy, good, open-hearted, without whim, but with a sense and seriousness beyond her years, and never disobedient." Her father died when she was nine, and Maria helped out with the younger children and the housework while her mother ran

the farm.

She received First Communion at eleven and strove with all her strength to do better each day. Six months later this heroic maiden was severely tried for her Faith. The Goretti family shared a home with a partner of their father and his son, Alexander, a wicked-minded youth who began making sinful advances toward Maria. She repelled them immediately but said nothing about them for he threatened to kill her and her mother if she did. Finally lust drove the tragic Alexander to attack outright, but again the Saint resisted him with all her strength, crying out repeatedly "No, it's a sin! God does not want it." Thereupon, the attacker, over whelmed by fear and anger, began to strike at her blindly with a long dagger, and several blows passed clear through her body.

St. Maria was rushed to the hospital where surgeons worked feverishly to save her life, but it soon became evident that nothing could be done. The next morning she was given Communion, but first queried about her attitude toward Alexander. She replied clearly that she forgave him, that she would pray for his repentance, and that she wished to see him in heaven. On July 6, 1902, this saintly maiden died and went to meet her heavenly Spouse for Whose love she had been willing to give her life.

On July 25, 1950, she was raised to sainthood by Pope Pius XII, with her mother, brothers and sisters present, a unique event in the history of the Church. By that time her prayers for her murderer had long since been heard and answered. After eight years of unrepentant imprisonment, Alexander had a complete change of heart; released for good behavior after twenty-seven years, he hastened to beg forgiveness of the Saint's mother and then became a Capuchin lay brother, who gave evidence at the canonical inquiry about Blessed Maria and lived to see her canonized. St. Maria Goretti's Feast day is July 6th.

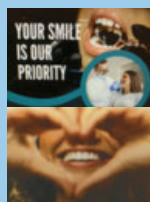
