### **All Hallows' Eve and Halloween**

The word "Halloween" comes from "All Hallows' Eve", which is the evening before All Saints Day, also known as *Hallows Day*. The tradition of Halloween, now celebrated in many countries, has roots in ancient Christian customs. Early Christians would prepare for All Saints Day by holding a vigil on the night before. Over time, Halloween became a secular celebration, but its Christian origins are still remembered.

### **Offering God our true wealth**

# Tuesdays are dedicated to the Apostles

## Why do we kneel at Mass?

Since the beginnings of the Church, kneeling has been a key posture of prayer. We see Sts. Peter and Paul in the Acts of the Apostles kneeling in prayer. Early in the 4th century, the Council of Nicea prohibited kneeling on Sundays and special feasts. Kneeling began more as a posture of penance for our sins, but in the history of the Church, it has become more a posture of reverence and solemn prayer.

You will notice that the times we kneel at Mass are tied to the consecration of the holy Eucharist. We kneel in both anticipation of what will occur and then in awe of what has taken place: Jesus Christ becomes truly present to us under the guise of bread and wine. The profoundness of this event has over time led the Church to mandate in the current General Instruction of the Roman Missal that kneeling is the only posture allowed during this time. The sheer awesomeness of the holy Eucharist leads us to fall to our knees in wonder and thanksgiving. ©LPi

## WISDOM

One Saint, when confronted with the problems in his life, would say, "What is this compared to eternity?" This puts everything into perspective. To make this point more clear, is it better to die at ten or at ninety? Ten, if you believe that heaven is everything that God says it is. ## Are you an ADULT without Confirmation, Communion or Baptism?

If you want to become a Roman Catholic or complete your Initiation into the Church, the RCIA is for you! For information, phone the rectory. *Adult Catholics* who have not yet celebrated *Confirmation* or *Holy Communion* should contact the rectory for preparation class/information.

### REQUIREMENTS FOR BAPTISM OR CONFIRMATION SPONSOR

Godparent/Sponsor must be at least 16 years old \* **Godparent/Sponsor must be in good standing with the Catholic Church.** Must be a practicing Catholic (*Attend Sunday Mass weekly*). \* Must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Communion, and Confirmation. If married, must be married in the Catholic Church. \* If single, not living with significant other, nor married civilly only. \* **Godparent/Sponsor cannot be the candidate's parent.** Each child only requires one Godparent. If you wish to have two Godparents, there must be one female and one male. (CanonLaw872874)

### Sacred Matrimony on Sacred ground

"ceremony" at the venue is not a valid Sacrament

For the Catholic Church the Sacrament of Matrimony is such a sacred matter that the Church requires for two Catholics to be married Sacramentally in the Catholic Church, not elsewhere. All the Sacraments except Confession are always celebrated in Church. Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation and the Sacred Orders (Priesthood is even celebrated at the Cathedral of a given Diocese). A Catholic priest can only officiate Sacrament of Matrimony of two Catholics on sacred grounds (Church). This wedding at the same time is a civil wedding. For more info contact Fr. Wojciech.

### Saint Marcellus the Centurion-October 30

St. Marcellus, also known as Marcellus of Tangier, was a Roman centurion stationed at Tangiers, which is located in modern-day Morocco. He gained recognition and reverence for his unwavering faith and courageous actions in the face of persecution. Marcellus lived during a time when the Roman Empire was dominated by paganism, and the emperor's birthday was widely celebrated with pagan rites and offerings. It was during one such celebration that Marcellus found himself in a dilemma. As a devout Christian,



he found it impossible to partake in the pagan offering ceremony, considering it an act against his faith and dedication to Jesus Christ. Displaying immense bravery and conviction, Marcellus took a stand for his beliefs. He cast away his arms and armor, publicly declaring himself a Christian, regardless of the severe consequences that awaited him. Such an overt proclamation of faith was considered a direct challenge to the authority and religious practices of the Roman Empire. In response to his open defiance, Marcellus was quickly arrested and brought before the authorities, who condemned him to death. His steadfast refusal to compromise his faith and conform to the pagan rituals made him an example of unwavering commitment to Christ. The martyrdom of Marcellus had a significant impact, leading to the death of another Christian, Saint Cassian. He was inspired by the courageous actions of Marcellus and publicly declared his faith as well. Both men became martyrs for their refusal to renounce their Christian beliefs, embracing death with unwavering faith and the hope of eternal life. Marcellus died a martyr's death in approximately 298 AD in Tangiers, Morocco. His sacrifice and martyrdom were witnessed by a multitude of people, strengthening the faith of many and inspiring numerous others to stand up for their beliefs in the face of persecution. Though Saint Marcellus The Centurion's life was marked by a singular act of defiance and his subsequent martyrdom, his story continues to resonate with believers today. His incredible courage, unwavering faith, and dedication to his Christian principles make him an important figure in Christian history. Despite the lack of specific iconographic representations attributed to Saint Marcellus, his devout followers honor his memory on October 30th each year. This day serves as a reminder of his remarkable sacrifice and as an encouragement for conscientious objectors who find themselves in situations where their faith conflicts with worldly obligations. The inspiring life and martyrdom of Saint Marcellus The Centurion have led many to recognize him as a saint. Although canonization in the Pre-Congregation era did not follow the rigorous process observed today, his exemplary life, martyrdom, and the inspiration he provides to conscientious objectors have led to him being venerated as a saint within the Catholic Church. Saint Marcellus The Centurion is considered the patron saint of conscientious objectors, providing guidance and intercession for those facing conflicts between their faith and societal pressures. He stands as a shining example of unwavering dedication to one's beliefs, even in the face of severe persecution and the threat of death.

## ALL SAINTS

In designating one day on our calendar for all Saints, the Church chooses a time to honor our heroes – the men and women whose example we admire and wish to imitate. Coming near the end of the Church year, the solemnity of All Saints invites us into the mystery of death and the promise of eternal salvation. An early tradition placed the feast on May 13. Pope Boniface IV (himself a saint) began the celebration in Rome. On that date in 609, he dedicated a very old building in Rome as a new church. The Pantheon had been built to honor all the pagan gods, but Pope Boniface rededicated the building as a Christian Church in the seventh century. He brought the relics of the martyrs from the catacombs to this famous public place of worship. The parade of martyrs' relics changed the Pantheon from a place for worship of all the pagan gods to a place which honored Mary and all the Christian Saints and in turn the one Christian God. Eventually, the idea of a feast of All Saints was transferred to November 1, near the end of the Church year. The Church honors many Saints with a day of their own on the general liturgical calendar, but there are more Saints than days in the year. Since Vatican II, the number of individuals canonized as Saints had multiplied considerably. Although we do not celebrate all their names on specified dates in all our church throughout the year, we do gather them as one on this day. Unfortunately, secular tradition has turned the eve of All Saints into a kind of anti-festival, a night when heroes of the underworld take command.



### Communion of Saints
