THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

"The Immaculate Conception" is a title reserved for Mary, the mother of Jesus, the Christ. The expression means that MARY was conceived without sin. The conviction that Jesus was born of a virgin is a distinct belief, even though many Catholics erroneously believe that the Immaculate Conception refers to Jesus. Contributing to the confusion is the celebration of the Immaculate Conception during the season of Advent. While the faithful are preparing to honor the birth of their Savior Jesus, we commemorate the conception of Mary. The choice of December 8 for the Immaculate Conception does not directly relate to Advent; it corresponds more to the traditional date for the feast of the Birth of Mary, September 8. The feast of the conception of Mary is backed up from that day by nine months. In a similar way, we celebrate the Annunciation on March 25, nine months before the birth of Jesus. Belief in the Immaculate Conception asserts that God preserved Mary from all sin from the moment of her conception, thus preparing a pure vessel for the incarnation of the Son. Although the Immaculate Conception of Mary has been affirmed since the earliest centuries of Christianity, it was not formally proclaimed until 1854. December 8 is now a Holy day of Obligation in the United States, which is placed under Mary's patronage with this title. Mary, the Immaculate Conception, is the exalted Queen of Heaven who manifests God's power over sin.

Saint Damasus - December 11

St. Damasus served as bishop of Rome for 18 years as Pope Damasus I (366-384). He had to endure significant controversy early in his pontifical reign when a factional group of bishops insisted that their chosen claimant, Ursinus, was the true pope. Both sides resorted to violence before the issue was decided in favor of Damasus. He went on to make the unification of the Church a central focus of his papacy and fervently fought to counter any division caused by the many heretical teachings of his time.



While he was pope, Christianity was declared the official religion of the Roman Empire and Rome's authority in the Church was decided by a synod that Damasus called in 382. This synod established Rome as the direct descendant of the Church founded by the apostle Saint Peter, the apostolic see, and put an end to confusion stemming from Constantinople, which some were already calling 'The New Rome'.

To further unify the Church, Damasus introduced Latin as the principle liturgical language and commissioned his secretary, Saint Jerome, to compile and revise the various translations of the Bible into one official translation to be used by the entire Church: The Latin Vulgate. This successfully preserved the original Scriptures by making them more accessible to the average Christian.

A writer and poet himself, Saint Damasus lives on in history through his many epigrams and verse inscriptions that can be found on the Roman catacombs that he restored during his papacy. Saint Jerome described his friend, Pope Damasus, as being "an incomparable person, learned in the Scriptures, a virgin doctor of the virgin Church, who loved chastity and heard its praises with pleasure."

REQUIREMENTS FOR BAPTISM OR CONFIRMATION SPONSOR

Godparent/Sponsor must be at least 16 years old * **Godparent/Sponsor must be in good standing with the Catholic Church.** Must be a practicing Catholic (*Attend Sunday Mass weekly*). * Must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Communion, and Confirmation. If married, must be married in the Catholic Church. * If single, not living with significant other, nor married civilly only. * **Godparent/Sponsor cannot be the candidate's parent.** Each child only requires one Godparent. If you wish to have two Godparents, there must be one female and one male. (Canon Law 872-874)

Sacred Matrimony on Sacred ground

"ceremony" at the venue is not a valid Sacrament

For the Catholic Church the Sacrament of Matrimony is such a sacred matter that the Church requires for two Catholics to be married sacramentally in the Catholic Church, not elsewhere. All the Sacraments except Confession are always celebrated in Church. Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation and the Sacred Orders (Priesthood is even celebrated at the Cathedral of a given Diocese). A Catholic priest can only officiate Sacrament of Matrimony of two Catholics on sacred grounds (Church). This wedding at the same time is a civil wedding. For more info contact Fr. Wojciech.

**Our Lady of Guadalupe—December 12
Jasmine Flowers and Our Lady**

The Guadalupe apparitions reveal a special meaning in relation to the jasmine flower. A picture paints a thousand words, they say. The miraculous image of Our Lady of Guadalupe speaks to the truth of that old saying. Every detail on the Tilma - no matter how tiny - speaks volumes.

Let's take a quick look at just one of these features: the four-petaled jasmine flower on Our Lady's dress.

In Aztec culture, each petal of the jasmine represents a direction - north, south, east, or west - and each direction is governed by its own god. At the same time, the jasmine is associated with the sun god, whose main temple was built over a system of natural caves in the shape of a four-petaled flower. So, the four-segmented shape represents the entirety of the cosmos, with the sun god in its center. The four-petaled jasmine flower, therefore, is a symbol of the highest divinity, the sun god himself, who is the center of all.

On Our Lady's dress, this flower is found directly over her womb, indicating to the Aztec people that she herself carries the only true God, the true Center of the cosmos. Thus, the tiny flower - half-hidden in the thick folds of a gloriously floral garment - steadfastly proclaims in silent humility that Our Lady is the Mother of the Most High God. SAINT LUCY—December 13

St. Lucy was, and still is, a very popular saint in Naples, and, of course, the most popular in her native Sicily. She was born of noble Christian parents in the late third century in the city of Syracuse on the island of Sicily. Not far from her birthplace, in Catania, about fifty miles away, was the tomb of the virgin martyr Saint Agatha, who was slain for her Catholic Faith a half century earlier during the Decian persecution (249-253).

So revered was Saint Agatha that numerous Christians came to venerate her relics, risking their lives in doing so, and many (God knows how many) were cured of various illnesses. As a young girl, Lucy's Catholic faith and devotion to Christ grew strong, and so did her longing to give all the material goods she had to the poor and, like Saint Agatha, she was determined to consecrate her virginity in service to God. These intentions were kept secret by her, for a while, from her mother, but after her father's early death, her mother, Eutychia, began suffering from a serious hemorrhage.



Her daughter convinced her to come with her to Catania and ask Saint Agatha for a cure. She agreed, and, upon venerating the martyr's relics, she was cured. So grateful was Eutychia for this miraculous favor that, upon hearing of her daughter's holy resolve, she gave her a Catholic mother's full support. However, there was one problem. Prior to this, and without Lucy's knowledge, her mother had arranged for her to marry a young pagan. When this man noticed Lucy's largess with the poor, he became very upset. *Life of Saint Lucy, by Quirizio di Giovanni da Murano*: The year was 303, and a new emperor, Diocletian, had passed an edict declaring Christians to be "enemies of the state." Two years of a persecution equal to, if not surpassing, that of Decius in its cruel intensity, ensued. The rejected betrothed reported Lucy to the governor of Syracuse. First, she was condemned to a brothel, but, when they tried to drag her there, her body became rigid and immobile. Then, an executioner attempted to burn her alive, but the fire did her no harm. Finally, her neck was pierced with a sword, and her virginal soul was taken to heaven where she received the martyr's crown.


