# PASTOR'S LETTER

---

*The Good News of Easter*

## Signs and Wonders

In the gospel today, Jesus appears to his apostles in the upper room for the first time after rising from the dead. John tells us he breathed on them so that they could receive the Holy Spirit.

It's what eventually sent them into the world so that they could bring the good news of Easter to others. Jesus died and rose to bring us into a life with God that is never meant to end. Jesus has great mercy on us, which we know as his Divine Mercy.

In the first reading, we hear the results of the apostle's faith. We see how they started their work in the world and how they performed "many signs and wonders" (Acts 5:12) that attracted others to want what they discovered. And maybe what attracted so many was nothing more than realizing a life in Christ is life-giving—for ourselves and others.

It's in the signs and wonders of goodness, kindness, compassion and mercy. And the signs and wonders that amazed the early Christians are still happening in our world, even until this very day...especially here at St. Hubert. We see signs and wonders all the time. And here are just a few from recent weeks:

- **Feeding the Hungry.** Our St. Hubert 8<sup>th</sup> Graders teamed up once again with our Encore 55+ group on a joint work of charity. On Holy Thursday morning, they partnered to make 60 lunches for the guests of Catholic Charities soup kitchen in Des Plaines.
- **Feeding the Heart and Soul.** This weekend we say farewell to **Fr. Peter Fernandes** who was with us the last three months, and **Deacon Tom Heathershaw** who will graduate Mundelein Seminary and be ordained a priest for the Diocese of Dubuque on May 25. We're grateful for their service and for enriching us with the good news of the gospels. Our Parish Pastoral Council teamed up with our Funeral Luncheon Team and our Teaching Parish Advisory Committee to host a reception after the 4:30 pm Mass. Fr. Peter and Deacon Tom will be around after the Masses if you'd like to wish them well.
- **Jesus Feeds the Children.** This weekend we celebrate First Holy Communion, the moment when 92 children from our parish families receive the Holy Eucharist for the first time. Jesus tells us to be like the children...to come to him. And when given the chance, they do! These 92 children are an incredible sign of faith in a world that needs to see it.
- **Sometimes Goodness is Rewarded.** Two St. Hubert parishioners were recently named Schaumburg's Volunteers of the Year! **Helen Jerusis**, one of our Eucharistic Ministers and an active WINGS helper, was named the adult volunteer of the year, and **Sarah Mathias**, a talented musician active in our music program and youth group, was named the teen of the year. That's an incredible witness of the power of service, and an incredible reflection of the good things St. Hubert parishioners are doing.

There are a lot of signs and wonders of Christian goodness all around us. It's good every now and then to simply be amazed by simple things that bring Easter joy.

The Gospel reading sets the stage for Pentecost. Prior to giving us the full gift of his Spirit, Jesus provides the gift of peace, the gift of his heart. A supernatural gift, it penetrates deep into our own hearts. It is the calming presence of Christ when we face challenges and difficulties.



Jesus bestowed it upon his first apostles twice in the same meeting shortly after his resurrection. Then he gave them the life-breath of God, the Holy Spirit, and commissioned them with the priesthood of forgiving the sins of others – another gift that brings peace.

This gift of peace has been distributed by Jesus ever since, through the ordained priesthood in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. And to hold us steady in our efforts to remain holy, Jesus gives us the breath of God. This breath, this life-sustaining presence of God's Spirit, which created the world and keeps us spiritu-

ally alive, is the Holy Spirit – God's holiness activating us and dwelling within us.

Whatever is not holy – not of the Spirit – is sinful and destructive. Jesus, who is the embodiment of Divine Mercy, died on the cross and gave us his Spirit so that we could live in the forgiveness of God.

When you pray the "Our Father", do it slowly and intentionally. During the words, "forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us," think of people who have irritated you or hurt you without remorse. Consciously forgive them.

Otherwise, your unforgiveness could affect their eternal souls as well as your own, because you're denying them an opportunity to understand God's forgiveness through your example, and you're denying God the opportunity to forgive you for your sin of unforgiveness.

Forgiveness doesn't mean approving of the sin nor forgetting. It means letting go of the desire to retaliate. It means choosing to love whether it's deserved or not. It means entering anew into Christ's gift of peace.

### Reflect & Discuss:

1. Who in your life is hardest to forgive? Perhaps yourself! What sins are you retaining by refusing to accept that God has already made his forgiveness available? What are you going to do to let go of the unforgiveness?
2. Name a situation that illustrates the resurrection power of forgiveness. How did the Holy Spirit help make forgiveness easier?
3. What changed when forgiveness was given? How did this bring the kingdom of God to earth?

There is a story about St. Christopher, probably more legend than truth, which runs this way:

As a youth, Christopher was gifted in every way, except faith. He was a big man physically, powerful, strong, goodhearted, mellow, and well liked by all. He was also generous, using his physical strength to help others. His one fault was that he found it hard to believe in God. For him, the physical was what was real and everything else seemed unreal. However, he yearned to believe in God and deeply respected those who did believe. And so he lived his life in a certain honest agnosticism, unable to really believe in anything beyond what he could physically see, feel, and touch.

This, however, did not prevent him from using his gifts, especially his physical strength, to serve others. This became his refuge, generosity and service. He became a ferryboat operator, spending his life helping to carry people across a dangerous river. One night, so the legend goes, during a storm, the ferryboat capsized and Christopher dove into the dark waters to rescue a young child. Carrying that child to the shore, he looked into its face and saw there the face of Christ. After that he believed, for he had seen the face of Christ. The very name, Christopher, contains the legend. Christopher means CHRIST-BEARER.

Fact or fiction? In either case, the story contains, within its very simplicity, a profound lesson. It gives us an answer, a practical one, to one of the most difficult questions of all: What should we do when our faith is weak? What should be our reaction in the face of the fact that God often seems silent, distant, dead? How do we move from believing only in the physical, from believing in the reality of only what we can see, feel, touch, taste, and smell, to believing in the existence of deeper, spiritual, realities?

Christopher's answer? Live as honestly and respectfully as you can and use your gifts to help others. God will appear. Faith is not so much a question of feeling as of selfless service.

That is also the lesson in the biblical account of the apostle, Thomas, and his doubt about the resurrection of Jesus. Remember how he protests: "Unless I can (physically) place my finger in the wounds of his hands and stick my finger into the wound of his side, I will not believe." It is noteworthy that Jesus offers no resistance or rebuke in the face of this remark. Instead he takes

Thomas at his word: "Come here, and (physically) place your finger in the wounds of my hand and the wound in my side; see for yourself that I am real and not a ghost."

That is an open challenge for all of us: "Come and see for yourselves that I am real and not a ghost!" The challenge, however, has a couple of conditions: honesty and generosity.

Skepticism and agnosticism, even atheism, are not a problem as long as one is honest, non-rationalizing, non-lying, ready to efface oneself before reality as it appears, and generous in giving his or her life away in service. If these conditions are met, God, the author and source of all reality, will eventually become evident, even to those who need physical proof. The stories of Christopher and Thomas teach us that and they assure us that God is neither angered nor threatened by an honest agnosticism.

Faith is never certainty. Neither it is the sure feeling that God exists. Conversely, unbelief is not to be confused with the absence of the felt assurance that God exists. There are, for everyone of us, dark nights of the soul, silences of God, cold lonely seasons, bitter times when God's appearances to us cannot be truly grasped or recognized. The history of faith, as witnessed by the life of Jesus and the lives of the saints, shows us that God often seems dead and, at those times, the reality of the empirical world can so overpower us that nothing seems real except what we can see and feel right now, namely our own pain.

Whenever this happens, we need to become Christ-bearers, Christophers, honest agnostics who use their goodness and God-given strengths to help carry others across the burdensome rivers of life. God does not ask us to have a faith that is certain, but a service that is sure. We have the assurance that, should we faithfully help carry others without first thinking of ourselves, we will one day find ourselves before the person of Christ who will gently say to us: "See for yourself, that I am real, and not a ghost."
