

## Fire from Heaven

As we return to the Sundays of Ordinary Time, we find ourselves inside an interesting conversation between Jesus and his disciples. As he focuses intently on going to Jerusalem, they have to pass through Samaria. One of the villages they were entering didn't welcome them; the implication was because they were Jews. In those times, Jews and Samaritans did not usually associate with one another (see John 4:9).

James and John (who Jesus called "the sons of thunder"—see Mark 3:17) thought Jesus should call down fire from heaven to consume them. Instead, Jesus rebuked the two. His next step was to go to another village where they were accepted.


Even though this took place 2000 years ago, it seems like it could have been a conversation that took place last week. When we're insulted, most likely we all have a little bit of the sons of thunder in us. We want to get even. Human nature doesn't change.

But, Jesus has us see there is another choice—to take the high road. Instead of getting even, we can also find an alternative way. Jesus is basically saying, "move on."

The rest of the passage is about the demands of following him. Jesus knows his way challenges the norm, so he urges us to look at things differently. If we're looking for an easy way to follow him, and to simply rest in what's comfortable, he says think twice: "the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head." Jesus is constantly moving. As such, he urges us to always think, react, and choose where he's leading us to be.

In the end, following Jesus moves us to think like him. He moves us to look ahead, not behind, with a whole new set of eyes. He moves us to wholeness, to respecting people (even if we don't agree with them, and even if they insult us), and to avoid harsh, quick judgements with the aim of tearing another down. He moves us to forgive, which is a movement toward peace.



How well do you handle rejection? Today's Gospel reading shows us how the disciples reacted to rejection. They had entered a Samaritan village ahead of Jesus, as he had asked them to do, to gather an audience. But because the Samaritans had an anti-Jewish prejudice, they didn't want to hear Jesus. Their hearts were closed to anything he might say. And so they missed an opportunity to experience the Savior of the world.

How do you feel when someone refuses to listen to you? The disciples who traveled with Jesus didn't like rejection any more than we do. Two of his closest friends, James and John, thought they would do Jesus a favor by asking, "Do you want us to zap them with a lightning bolt?"

Jesus had previously told them to deal with rejection by wiping the dirt from their sandals and walking away. Now he lived what he preached by walking away these Samaritans.

He didn't force his beliefs upon the villagers, even though they definitely needed the truths he could have taught them.

There's a lot we have to give up when we follow Jesus, including the grudges we like to hold and our desire to deal with rejection by retaliating. Why give others that kind of control over our moods? Wiping the dirt from our shoes means we get rid of the bad feelings that steal our joy.



At the end of this scripture, Jesus explains that following him is always a forward motion. We're always walking away from something – away from rejection, away from our unloving reactions to prejudice, away from the close-heartedness of those who are as yet unteachable – and moving into the loving embrace of Christ.

To move forward, remember that the Holy Spirit is the only one who can prepare a heart to receive Jesus. When we try to bring someone to Jesus and fail, we're not really failing; we're planting seeds rather than harvesting the crop. Let the Holy Spirit finish the work while you move on to other fields.

### Reflect & Discuss:

1. Who is frustrating you because he/she is not willing to change? What can you do to "walk away" lovingly and to give yourself a break? (It might not be a literal departure.)
2. When did someone reject you because you spoke the truth? How did you feel about it? Did you walk away?
3. How did (or might) the Holy Spirit work on that person's heart to prepare them to eventually accept the truth?

A friend of mine jokingly says that when she dies she wants this epitaph on her gravestone: There was always something!

And there always is! All of us appreciate her frustration. Invariably, there's always something, big or small, that casts a shadow and somehow keeps us from fully entering the present moment and appreciating its richness. There is always some anxiety, some worry about something that we should have done or should be doing, some unpaid bill, some concern about what we need to face tomorrow, some lingering heartache, some concern about our health or the health of another, some hurt that is still burning, or some longing for someone who is absent that mitigates our joy. There's always something, some loss, some hurt, some anxiety, some bitterness, some jealousy, some obsession, or some headache, that is forever draining the present moment of its joy.

Henri Nouwen once gave a very simple, poignant expression to this: "Our life," he writes. "is a time in which sadness and joy kiss each other at every moment. There is a quality of sadness that pervades all the moments of our life. It seems that there is no such thing as a clear-cut pure joy, but that even in the most happy moments of our existence we sense a tinge of sadness. In every satisfaction, there is an awareness of limitations. In every success, there is the fear of jealousy. Behind every smile, there is a tear. In every embrace, there is loneliness. In every friendship, there is distance. And in all forms of light, there is the knowledge of surrounding darkness." There's always something!

Jesus had his own way of expressing this. There is an incident recorded in the Gospels wherein Peter approaches Jesus and asks him what reward a disciple will receive for following him. Jesus replies that anyone who gives up father, mother, spouse, children, house, or land in order to be his disciple will receive these back (mothers, spouses, children, houses, lands) one hundred times over. But then he adds a rather unwelcome clause: "though not without tribulation". There will always be something – some stress, some jealousy, some persecution – which can wipe out both the recognition and the enjoyment of the hundredfold. In effect, what Jesus is saying is that we can have everything – and enjoy nothing! Why? Because there will always be something impaling itself into the present moment that can cause us to lose perspective and thus lose the richness and joy inside of our own lives.

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus specifies what that something often is, namely, jealousy. We can have everything and enjoy nothing because we are jealous of what other people

have. How true. How often do we denigrate our own lives and talents, failing to see and savor their richness, because we would like to be someone else, someone rich and famous, someone set apart. Our lives are rich, but we are not content within them because we would want what someone else has.

There is a rich literature today, both within religious and secular circles, that tries to challenge us to not let our anxieties, heartaches, jealousies, and worries block us from entering fully into the present moment. Most of that literature is good since it formulates the right challenge. Sometimes, however, some of these authors give us the impression that, if you focus your attention and work hard at a few techniques, this is an easy thing to do. It's not! Entering into the present moment, truly entering it without being waylaid by our own heartaches and headaches, is one of the most difficult psychological and spiritual tasks in all of life.

Our lives are rich, and that is true for all of us, not just for the rich and famous. At the height of his fame, the poet, Rainer Marie Rilke, received a letter from a young man, complaining that he wanted to be a poet but was handicapped because he lived in a small town where nothing exciting or noteworthy ever happened. Rilke wrote back to him and telling him that if his life seemed poor to him than he probably wasn't a poet after all because he couldn't pick up the riches of his own life. Every person's experience is the stuff of poetry. There are no lives that aren't rich; but most of us are blocked from entering into the richness of our own lives and can never appreciate the hundredfold ... because there's always something.

The challenge is to be present to the richness inside of our own lives, and that means learning to celebrate the temporary, the imperfect. That means learning how to go to the great banquet that lies at the heart of life, even while our lives are not yet fully healthy and complete. And part of that means accepting too how difficult this is, enjoying the times when we do get there, forgiving ourselves for mostly falling short, and having an epitaph engraved for ourselves that reads: There was always something!



### Children's Ministry of Initiation (CMI)



is an invitational process that provides families and students with an opportunity to explore issues of faith and to receive the Sacraments. The CMI process helps students deepen their faith through an experience of God with other people on a journey of faith.

This children/teen program is for children of catechetical age (7 and above) who:

- Have never been baptized.
- Were previously baptized in another Christian Tradition (Protestant or Orthodox) and wish to become part of the Catholic tradition.
- Were baptized Catholic, but did not receive Eucharist in Grade 2.




