The Voice of the Good Shepherd

Traveling through the Easter Season

The first three Sundays of Easter have us focus on the reality of Jesus' resurrection. The tomb is empty. And when the body of Christ appears, it can do so suddenly—even behind locked doors. It can also vanish in front of people—we heard about that last Sunday.

The resurrected Jesus is just different. A change in reality has taken place, and now it's time to adjust to the new reality. And so, the Church shifts the gospel passages from focusing on Jesus' resurrected body to focusing on how Jesus prepares us for this new reality—the reality that we're the Body of Christ, too. Jesus empowers us to take in his presence to witness his presence in our everyday world.

And it begins by being able to recognize Jesus' voice—a voice that's familiar; a voice we know because we've heard it and know it within the midst of the Church ("Love God with all your being." "Father, forgive them." "I am the way, the truth and the life.").

Some voices will rob us away from what we need to focus on. You can tell because they usually focus us on promises that lead to emptiness. They're voices that mislead us or lead us in circles ("get rich quick", "look out for number one," "lose 50 pounds in two weeks," "you don't need religion," "you can never have too much").

Jesus' voice leads us to find fulfillment in looking out for others, appreciating the person we are, the realization we can change because we can be forgiven, the desire to share our goodness and our time for causes that help others, and the willingness to sacrifice for those we love. Those are just a few things. Jesus' voice will challenge us but it will also lead us to hope, to understanding, to awe and wonder; to meaning.

We recognize it when we hear it. The other voices, the voices we hear most of the time, we begin to expose for what they are—especially those that tell us we're not good enough, strong enough, or worthy enough. Jesus teaches us how to distinguish his voice from the shallow voices of others.

Because when we hold onto the voice we know and follow, our voice begins to sound like His. That's how the voice of the Body of Christ is often heard—through each one of us.

Congratulations to our First Communicants!

On Saturday, our second graders received the Eucharist for the first time surrounded by their families and a full church. They've begun to learn the voice of the One we follow who brings us into his arms, like a shepherd caring for his sheep. Congratulations!

Our Seminarians Take Off for a Summer Break

Our three seminarians, JohnPaul Stedwill, Jonathan Puckett and Luke Olson, are wrapping up their semester at Mundelein and will head home to the Diocese of Peoria for the summer to learn more about pastoring. They'll be back with us this Fall.




Anointing

"I am the gate.

Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture."
— John 10:9

I recently rescued a dog. She's a terrier and rather adorable. And she's crazy about me. She could spend all day with me. But I'm a pastor at a parish and sometimes I leave her at the front desk of the church office. She constantly amazes me by her ability to distinguish between my voice and that of everyone else. If I say one word, even if I'm hidden around a corner, she'll sprint toward me and jump up into my arms.

This week the readings focus our attention to the *voice* of the risen Jesus Christ. Comparing his disciples to sheep and himself to a shepherd, he says, "They recognize his voice." He speaks to us

and wants us to respond. When we hear his voice, we follow. Throughout this coming week, we will experience many interior promptings to receive God's love, and to love Him in return. That's his voice. Follow it into the safe and tender arms of Christ.

By contrast, some voices we will hear do not convey God's concern and love for us, but rather produce fear, despair, and other harmful mischief. Jesus calls these voices those of robbers. Does an idea or thought make it harder for you to love God? If so, run away. Let it go. It is most likely not the voice of the Risen Lord. Keep waiting for him to speak. You will recognize his voice. Then run to him as fast as you can.

Searching for God Among Many Voices

We are surrounded by many voices. There's rarely a moment within our waking lives that someone or something isn't calling out to us and, even in our sleep, dreams and nightmares ask for our attention. And each voice has its own particular cadence and message. Some voices invite us in, promising us life if we do this or that or buy a certain product or idea; others threaten us. Some voices beckon us towards hated, bitterness, and anger, while others challenge us towards love, graciousness, and forgiveness. Some voices tell us that they are playful and humorous, not to be taken seriously, even as others trumpet that they are urgent and weighty, the voice of non-negotiable truth, God's voice.

Within all of these: Which is the voice of God? How do we recognize God's voice among and within all of these voices?

That's not easy to answer. God, as the scriptures tell us, is the author of everything that's good, whether it bears a religious label or not. Hence, God's voice is inside of many things that are not explicitly connected to faith and religion, just as God's voice is also not in everything that masquerades as religious. But how do we discern that?

Jesus leaves us a wonderful metaphor to work with, but it's precisely only a metaphor: He tells us that he is the "Good Shepherd" and that his sheep will recognize his voice among all other voices. In sharing this metaphor, he is drawing upon a practice that was common among shepherds at the time: At night, for protection and companionship, shepherds would put their flocks together into a common enclosure. They would then separate the sheep in the morning by using their voices. Each shepherd had trained his sheep to be attuned to his voice and his voice only. The shepherd would walk away from the enclosure calling his sheep, often times by their individual names, and they would follow him. His sheep were so attuned to his voice that they would not follow the voice of another shepherd, even if that shepherd tried to trick them (shepherds often did this to try to steal someone else's sheep) by imitating the voice of their own shepherd. Like a baby who, at a point, will no longer be cuddled by the voice of a babysitter, but wants and needs the voice of the mother, each sheep recognized intimately the voice that was safeguarding them and would not follow another voice.

So too with us: among all the voices that surround and beckon us, how do we discern the unique cadence of God's voice? Which is the voice of the Good Shepherd?

There's no easy answer and sometimes the best we can do is to trust our gut-feeling about right and wrong. But we have a number of principles that come to us from Jesus, from scripture, and from the deep wells of our Christian tradition that can help us.

What follows is a series of principles to help us discern God's voice among the multitude of voices that beckon us. What is the unique cadence of the voice of the Good Shepherd?

- The voice of God is recognized both in whispers and in soft tones, even as it is recognized in thunder and in storm.
- The voice of God is recognized wherever one sees life, joy, health, color, and humor, even as it is recognized wherever one sees dying, suffering, conscriptive poverty, and a beaten-down spirit.
- The voice of God is recognized in what calls us to what's higher, sets us apart, and invites us to holiness, even as it is recognized in what calls us to humility, submergence into humanity, and in that which refuses to denigrate our humanity.
- The voice of God is recognized in what appears in our lives as "foreign", as other, as "stranger", even as it is recognized in the voice that beckons us home.
- The voice of God is the one that most challenges and stretches us, even as it the only voice that ultimately soothes and comforts us.
- The voice of God enters our lives as the greatest of all powers, even as it forever lies in vulnerability, like a helpless baby in the straw.
- The voice of God is always heard in privileged way in the poor, even as it beckons us through the voice of the artist and the intellectual.
- The voice of God always invites us to live beyond all fear, even as it inspires holy fear.
- The voice of God is heard inside the gifts of the Holy Spirit, even as it invites us never to deny the complexities of our world and our own lives.
- The voice of God is always heard wherever there is genuine enjoyment and gratitude, even as it asks us to deny ourselves, die to ourselves, and freely relativize all the things of this world.

The voice of God, it would seem, is forever found in paradox.


Prayer Shawl Ministry News!!






