Pastor's Letter

Postscript

Today's gospel puts us inside Peter's fishing boat. Jesus sent the apostles ahead of him. In the middle of the night, the winds picked up and began to toss the boat. They were in a storm. But perhaps more frightening than the high winds was seeing Jesus walking on the water toward them. They thought they were seeing a ghost. To reassure them, Jesus told them not to be afraid. He was coming toward them to be with them.

Then, in his bold way, Peter wanted proof and asked Jesus if he could meet him on the water. And he did! But when Peter realized he was doing something he shouldn't be doing, he began to sink and cried out, "Lord, save me." And in an amazing image, which is something we can visualize, Jesus reached out to him. Matthew tells us, "He caught Peter." He saved him and pulled him back into the boat.

It's a gospel passage that resonates with me as I recover from the heart attack I experienced last week. In a spiritual sense, I was traveling in the boat not realizing I was heading into some rough waters and high winds that would toss me about. As the reality hit that I could be experiencing a heart attack, I became very afraid. But what I was able to see in the nurses, doctors and all the amazing people in the ER at St. Alexius Hospital, was that I was going to make it through the storm.

In fact, I've since learned that the survival rate of those who experience their first heart attack is 90% *when they are in hospital care*. What made the difference for me was realizing I better go to the hospital. When we trust there is someone we can go to to help us, we realize we're not alone and don't have to stay afraid. Don't get me wrong—like some men, I tended to think it would pass and so I began to wait it out. It took me several hours of being tossed in the winds, convincing myself what I should do. But I realized, I needed help. Our faith tells us that letting others help us allows them to love others as Jesus commands.

The doctors, nurses and care providers knew exactly what to do. When it comes to heart issues, as some of you may have also experienced, they know how to help us survive as they learn more and more about what's going on within us. And like Jesus telling the disciples not to be afraid, they conveyed that assurance on to me. Then, like Peter, I began to trust and walk toward the light of hope. Through the nurses and doctors, I heard Jesus' voice, "Take courage, it is I. Don't be afraid." Jesus tells us we can see his face in those helping us.

There were ups and downs in the days since the procedure. At times I felt confident like Peter did walking on the water. And at other times I found myself sinking and actually saying, "Jesus save me." But His hand was always there in those around me.

In this experience, I have been blessed to see how God is with me in ways I didn't expect. God places people in our lives to "catch" us and pull us up to get us back into the boat. I feel buoyed knowing the doctors feel a full recovery is possible and that I probably won't have to go through this again. I have always put my heart into everything. But now I know I can do that in a different way by working differently, eating heart healthy meals, exercising, and managing stress. It's all part of a new journey that I'm grateful to be on.

The most important thing is to be able to be in the boat with you. A parish is a family of families that come together with Christ who comes toward us. I very much am blessed to be a part of this family.

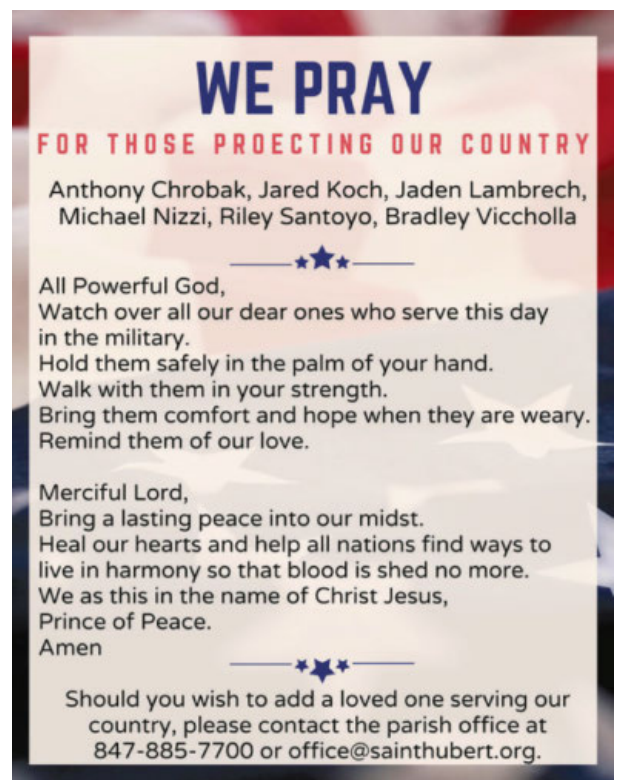

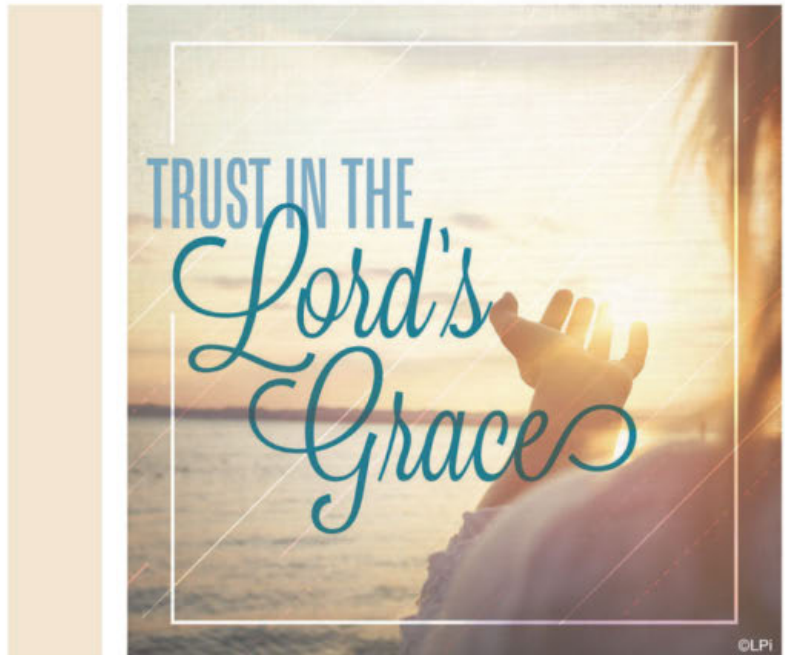

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A man at my parish was struggling to overcome a habitual sin. He said to me, “Father, I know the chance that I will commit sin again is really high. Why should I keep confessing my sins? Isn’t that dishonest?” Anyone who has felt the tyrannical power of sin — and who hasn’t? — has pondered this kind of question.

I responded to him, “What was the probability Peter would walk on the stormy water?” After some silence, he said, “Zero. But when Jesus called, he did it.” I could tell my penitent friend was re-framing the question from his own weakness to the greatness of the Lord’s love for him. The question for us should not be one of human probabilities about our sin, but rather whether or not we will trust the Lord’s grace in our lives.

This week the Lord is calling you and me to do the impossible: overcome sin with love. The only way to do that is to trust he is calling, and then to walk with the eyes of faith locked on him. And if we sink, he will raise us up again and again. Of that, we can be 100% sure.

A Prophetic Mantra About the Poor

Nobody gets to heaven without a letter of reference from the poor! That's a quote attributed to James Forbes, an interdenominational pastor in New York City, and it wonderfully captures something that the ancient prophets of Israel underlined many centuries ago.

The great prophets of Israel had coined this mantra: The quality of your faith will be judged by the quality of justice in the land. And the quality of justice in the land will always be judged by how "widows, orphans, and strangers" are faring while you are alive. That phrase, "widows, orphans, and strangers", was code for the three weakest, most-vulnerable, groups in society at the time. For the great prophets of Israel, ultimately we will be judged religiously and morally on the basis of how the poorest of the poor fared while we were alive.

That's a scary thought which becomes scarier when we see how Jesus strongly endorsed that view. While this needs to be contextualized within Jesus' message as a whole, we have in Matthew's Gospel the famous text about the Last Judgment where Jesus tells us that, at the end of day, when we stand before the great King on the day of judgment, we will be asked only one set of questions and they all will have to do with how we treated the poor: Did you feed the hungry? Give drink to the thirsty? Welcome the stranger? Clothe the naked? Visit the sick? Visit prisoners? I doubt that any of us would have the raw courage to preach this, just as it is written in the gospels, from any pulpit today. And yet Jesus meant it. Nobody gets to heaven without a letter of reference from the poor.

Now there's a whole series of challenges in this.

First: The demand to live lives that reflect justice and real concern for the poor is an integral and non-negotiable part of Christian discipleship. It's not something that is grounded in some particular ideology which I can buy into or neglect, as long as I am living honestly and prayerfully in my private life. It's an essential part of the gospel, equal in demand to praying, going to church, and keeping my private moral-life in order. For a Christian, it is not enough just to be pious, good, and church-going. We need too a concrete letter of reference from the poor.

Next: What that mantra of the prophets and Jesus' teaching on the Last Judgment also teaches is that charity alone is not enough. Charity is a great virtue, integrally part of the greatest virtue of all, love. It may never be downplayed. But charity isn't necessarily justice. I can be a wonderfully charitable, kind, moral, and generous person in my own life and still be unfairly profiting from an historical, social, political, and economic system that is unduly rewarding me even as it is unfairly burdening and robbing others. The things that I attain honestly through my own hard work and which I am very generous with in terms of sharing with others, can at the same time be the product of a system which is unfair to others. Taking care of "widows, orphans, and strangers" requires not just personal goodness and charity, but requires too that I have the courage to look at how my honest wealth may also be partially the product of a dishonest system. Who loses while I gain?

Finally: The mantra of the prophets and the teachings of Jesus about the Last Judgment should be a challenge to perennially scrutinize myself with the question: Am I actually reaching out to the poor? Do I have real "orphans, widows, and strangers" in my life? Is my commitment to the poor something only in theory, an ideal that I uphold but something that never actually impacts the poor? It is easy to pay lip-service to this ideal and it is even easier to write it into my curriculum vitae so that I look good to others and feel good about myself. However, as Ruth Burrows asks: Does our rhetoric about the poor actually help them or does it just help us feel better about ourselves?

I concede that these are not easy questions and we should be slow to answer them. Sometimes all we can do is admit our helplessness. I was once at a talk given by Gustavo Gutierrez where, after the presentation, a man stood up and, with pained honesty, shared about his own helplessness in reaching out to the poor: What can one person do in the face of all the global issues of injustice that beset us?

Gutierrez acknowledged the complexity of the question and sympathized with the man's helplessness, but then added: "Minimally, make sure that you always have at least one concrete poor person in your life to who you are specially attending. This will ensure that your commitment will always at least have some concrete flesh!" A single letter of reference from the poor is better than no letter at all.

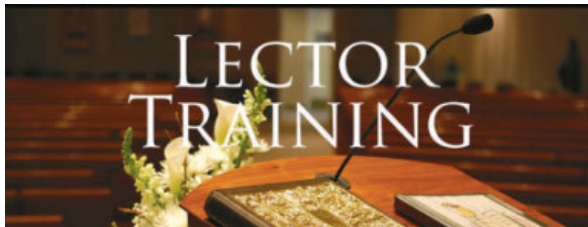

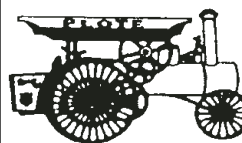

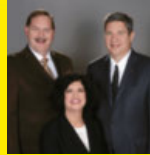
