

Dear Parish Family,

Praise be Jesus Christ! I would like to share with you a few brief updates. First, I know many of you are wondering where we stand with the unification process between our two churches. On Wednesday, October 4th, the Unification Committee from St. Matthew & St. Hubert Parish met for the first time with Sarah Pelrine and Edith Martinez from the Renew My Church Team from the Archdiocese of Chicago. This committee, made up of representatives from both sites, serves as the "transition team" providing support and counsel to Fr. Tim Fairman, the Parish Administrator, and me during this first year of unification. There will be many more meetings this year. Please look to the bulletin for updates. Please pray for our team, that we will be guided by the Holy Spirit as we move forward to help address whatever challenges are presented as we continue our progress of uniting our parish together. Second, many of you already know by now that Bishop Kevin Birmingham, who not a month ago was transferred from our Vicariate to replace Bishop Perry after his retirement in Vicariate VI, suddenly passed away this last week. It came a shock to many, not the least of which among the episcopate and the priests of the Archdiocese. Please pray for the repose of Bishop Birmingham's soul and for his family as they grieve during this difficult time. Bishop Birmingham was 51 years old, just days before his 52nd birthday. He will be truly missed.

I have come back repeatedly in my thoughts and in my prayers over the last few things that Fr. Mike told me before he passed. I wrote about it in my first bulletin after his funeral. Fr. Mike had a clear vision, a desire which he expressed with earnest, that our community be a people of prayer - not just in large or even small settings, but even beyond those, and within the personal confines of our own private time. I often think, "what is my job, my identity, as an associate pastor where there is no active pastor?" I'm not going to lie, this has been quite the exercise in faith and humility, and for that I'm very thankful to God and for you. I certainly would have never been able to do what a pastor of this large endeavor can do and having Fr. Tim as Administrator has relieved me of so much anxiety. His friendship and yours has been an anchor in my own personal life. But I am still on the edge of the same question: "what is an associate pastor in our particular situation?" Fr. Mike's words over the summer came back to remind me that I don't have to make up anything new, I only have to be a priest of Jesus Christ. Fr. Mike's desire for a prayerful assembly mingled with what I believe to be Fr. Glab's vision of a well-catechized community: these two things have become my subconscious and deepest desires. I don't exactly know what that means right now, but as the unification process continues, I'm certain our Lord will reveal to my heart what He desires of me and for the community, which He has given me charge to take care of. But even this will have its limits. I'm not the pastor here, and I am trying to remain respectful of that fact, albeit current circumstances have required me to take on roles that I have had to learn slowly and painfully.

With that being said, I want you to know what is in my heart and mind these days. I want you to succeed. Our previous pastors from Fr. Mike to Fr. Bob, to Fr. Gene, all have pastored the community of St. Hubert so beautifully in the progress of community. I don't want that to change, and I pray and hope that what you've built together in friendship never ruptures or becomes undone by any circumstances that may surround decisions during the unification process. Fr. Glab has done such amazing work with the community of St. Matthew, and I know of the tireless love he poured out in his work in making St. Matthews the rock that it is in the community. I don't want that familiarity to be severed, nor do I want it to be harmed in any way. Knowing changes are inevitable, these two key factors between both churches. I feel, must remain elemental glues that keep us together: lives of prayer and community; that is, the vertical and horizontal beams that make up our life together in Christ. I too desire that we pray and teach and love each other the way that our previous leaders have paved for our churches from years upon years of wisdom and friendship between God and brethren, not just in our own local churches, but in the Universal Church, which is ever so expansive, ever ancient and ever new. I have no agenda, only those things which are strung together in my own spirituality, which is the only gift I can really offer this newly merged community. I can't be the pastor you desire and deserve, because God will yet reveal who that is, but I am nevertheless here to help for whatever length of time God has sent me to you both as your spiritual father and spiritual brother, that is, a father for your sake, and a brother for mine.

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Jesus' parables are much stranger than most people realize. This week is an attention-getting example. He tells the religious leaders a parable about a completely absurd situation. Bloodthirsty and insane tenants violently abuse and kill the servants of their landlord. Inexplicably, the owner keeps sending them more victims of increasing value — up to and including his own son. Weird.

Usually, we hear this parable and assume it's an allegory: Jesus is the murdered son, the servants the prophets, etc. Fair enough. But notice — and here is where the weirdness deepens — Jesus seems to *disagree* with the Pharisees' interpretation that the landowner should and will punish the inheritance-obsessed murderers. So, is Jesus praising the psychotic and greedy murderers?! You can imagine the furrowed brows and deriding laughter as the scoffing crowd shuffles away.

If we stay with this tough parable, perhaps this truth emerges: God wants us to have an over-the-top obsession with a *totally undeserved inheritance*. Of course, we are forbidden to use violence. But the parable's violence gets our attention because it highlights the crazy goodness of the landowner. Jesus reveals that God is not merely in the business of rewarding the good and punishing the bad. He is playing a much stranger game — one marked by a kind of over-the-top mercy, a breathtaking giving of what is *not* deserved. What would our week look like if we embraced this kind of desire for God's kingdom on earth, even if others think we're nuts? This week let's seek God's kingdom with a passionate confidence in God's desire to give the good things we don't deserve.

IMAGINING GRACE

Imagine this: A man, entirely careless of all moral and spiritual affairs, lives his life in utter selfishness, pleasure his only pursuit. He lives the high life, never prays, never goes to church, has numerous sexual affairs, and has no concern for anyone but himself. After a long life of this, he's diagnosed with a terminal illness and, on his deathbed, tearfully repents, makes a sincere confession, receives the Eucharist, and dies inside the blessing of the church and his friends.

Now, if our reaction is, "Well, the lucky fellow! He got to live a life of selfish pleasure and still gets to go to heaven!", then (according to Piet Fransen, a renowned theologian on Grace) we haven't yet, at all, understood the workings of grace. To the degree that we still envy the amoral and wish to exclude them from God's grace, even as we count ourselves in, we are the "Older Brother" of the Prodigal Son, standing outside the Father's house, heaven, in envy and bitterness.

I teach in a seminary that prepares seminarians for ordination. Recently our professor of Sacramental Theology shared this: He's been teaching a course on the Sacrament of Reconciliation for more than forty years and only in the last few years have the seminarians asked: "When do we have to refuse giving someone absolution in confession?"

What's betrayed in this concern? The seminarians asking the question are, no doubt, sincere; they're not trying to be rigid or hard. Their anxiety is rather about grace and mercy. They're sincerely anxious about perhaps dispensing God's mercy too liberally, too cheaply, too indiscriminately, in essence, too unfairly. Their fear is not so much that God's mercy is limited and that there's only so much grace to go around. Not that. Their concern is more that by giving out grace so liberally they're being unfair to those who are practicing faithfully and bearing the heat of the day. Their fear is about fairness, justice, and merit.

What's at stake here? That grace is not something we merit. After the rich young man in the Gospels turns down Jesus' invitation to leave everything and follow him, Peter, who watched this encounter and who, unlike the rich young man, hasn't turned down Jesus' invitation and has given up everything to follow him, asks Jesus what those who do give up everything are going to get in return. In response, Jesus tells him the parable of the generous land owner and the vineyard workers who all arrive at different times, wherein some work for many hours and some for virtually no time at all, and yet they all receive the same reward, leaving those who worked the full day and bore the heat of the sun bitter with sense of unfairness. But, the vineyard owner (God) points out that there's no unfairness here since everyone has in fact received an over-generous return.

What's the deep lesson? Whenever we're protesting that it isn't fair that those who aren't as faithful as we but are still receiving the full mercy and grace of God we are some distance from understanding grace and living fully inside it.

My dental hygienist knows I'm a Catholic priest and likes to ask me questions about religion and church. One day she shared this story: Her mother and father had both, as far as she knew, never attended church. They'd been benign enough about religion, but not interested themselves. She, their daughter, had begun practicing as a Methodist, mainly through the influence of friends. Then her mother died and as they talked about plans for a funeral, her father revealed that her mother had been baptized as a Roman Catholic, though she had not practiced since her middle-school years. He suggested they try to arrange a Roman Catholic funeral for her. Given all those years of absence, it was with some trepidation that they approached a priest at a nearby parish to ask whether they might have a Roman Catholic funeral for her. To their surprise, the priest's response was non-hesitant, warm, and welcoming: "Of course, we can do this! It will be an honor! And I'll arrange for a choir and a reception in the parish hall afterwards."

No price was exacted for her mother's life-long absence from the church. She was buried with the full rites of the Church ... and her father, well, he was so touched by it all, the generosity of the church and the beauty of the liturgy, that he has since decided to become a Roman Catholic.

One wonders what the effect would have been had the priest refused that funeral, asking how they could justify a church funeral when, for all these years, they weren't interested in the church. One wonders too how many people find this story comforting rather than discomforting, given a strong ecclesial ethos today wherein many of us nurse the fear that we are handing out grace and mercy too cheaply.

But grace and mercy are never given out cheaply since love is never merited.
