

On Monday, January 22nd, the Church in the United States will observe the 51st Anniversary of the Supreme Court decision Roe v Wade, which effectively legalized abortion in this country.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) states the following: In all the dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion, and of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life. (# 373)

What is a day of penance? What does that mean? Our Code of Canon Law offers some insight:

The divine law binds all the Christian faithful to do penance each in his or her own way. In order for all to be united among themselves by some common observance of penance, however, penitential days are prescribed on which the Christian faithful devote themselves in a special way to prayer, perform works of piety and charity, and deny themselves by fulfilling their own obligations more faithfully and especially by observing fast and abstinence... (Can. 1249)

But wait... didn't the Supreme Court overturn Roe v Wade just a few years ago? Indeed, it did, but the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) adds:

On June 24, 2022, the Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization decision overturned Roe v. Wade, and we praise God for the great opportunity state and federal legislators now have to protect pre-born children. While God, in His mercy, ended the nearly fifty-year nationwide regime of abortion on demand, right now state and federal laws, in many instances, are still hostile to pre-born children. So, great prayer and advocacy is very needed.

Sadly, the State of Illinois is one of the most supportive states in the union when it comes to the ease with which an abortion can be procured. Our Governor, J.B. Pritzker and the state legislature have made it their mandate to expand opportunities for the legal procurement of abortions. In 2022 (the most recent year the Illinois Department of Public Health [IDHP] has recorded statistics) 56,457 pregnancies were terminated as a result of abortions in Illinois. That number means that every day, 155 (rounded up) babies are aborted in Illinois.

Great prayer and advocacy are needed in this state. Please pray for an end to abortion and for the circumstances that lead people to believe abortion is the best answer. Please vote for candidates to office who support life. Time and again when addressing this issue, I have been told that this is a political issue, and the Church shouldn't meddle in politics. However, this is the greatest moral crisis the Catholic Church is confronted with, and the Church absolutely must be a voice in the defense of all life from conception until natural death.

If you or someone you know are considering an abortion please go to the "Walking with Moms in Need" website, https://walkingwithmoms.weebly.com for valuable resources for someone who has many questions when discovering they are pregnant and not sure what to do.

In addition, "Project Rachel" is a long-standing ministry that helps one who is suffering after an abortion (sometimes years later) to heal through finding help, forgiveness and hope. They can be contacted online at: https://hopeafterabortion.com.

I'll conclude with a quote from a great saint:

A great prayer for life is urgently needed, a prayer which will rise up throughout the world. Through special initiatives and in daily prayer, may an impassioned plea rise to God, the Creator and lover of life, from every Christian community, from every group and association, from every family and from the heart of every believer.

Dear Parishioners,

As promised, you're invited to be part of this exciting opportunity of naming the newly unified Parish. Please take some time to review the following information and to keep this process in your prayers.

Timetable and Naming Process:

- \rightarrow All parishioners are invited to submit names from 12/23/23 1/21/24.
- The Unification Committee will consolidate the input for Renew My Church leadership to screen on 1/24/24.
- Parish survey of 3 6 names that pass the initial review process will be presented to the parish for voting 02/03/24 02/12/24.
- > Selected names will be presented to the Episcopal Council at the Archdiocese in late February.
- Episcopal Council submits names for consideration from the parish and the Cardinal selects a unified parish name on 03/05/24.

Guidelines:

- Mission Driven. Two church communities, each with a proud history, should be thoughtfully considered; along with how we will re-focus ourselves to the mission that Jesus entrusted to us in Schaumburg and Hoffman Estates.
- <u>Unique Identity.</u> Names are important and can define us uniquely. The name selected will reflect the identity of the newly unified community and our presence in the neighborhood. It symbolizes who we are and what we want to be as a faith community.
- Saints and Feast Days. The names need not necessarily be saint names; however, they should be associated with a feast day for the new Parish to celebrate. Internet links are offered for your assistance and consideration.
- Cardinal Cupich has specified that newly united parishes do not consider a name that is already in use as the name of a parish, school, mission, agency or shrine in the archdiocese. This means, for example, that St. Michael cannot be used as a prospective name, as it is already in use in the archdiocese. The name for the new parish should have a feast day for the new parish to celebrate. Because of the abundance of Marian names in use, no other names to honor the Blessed Mother will be considered.



Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

We start telling lies around the age of three, the experts tell us. It's understandable. Lying is a god-like power. Whatever I want, I need only say it, and the world rearranges itself accordingly. It's amazing at first. But soon reality snaps back and I'm faced with a dilemma. If I remain committed to my lie I start to fracture into pieces. My words and reality drift apart, and I find myself lost in a lonely world of further falsehoods and fear of being found out.

How marvelous, then, that Jesus begins his ministry by proclaiming: "Repent!" We tend to think it means "stop doing bad things" but it doesn't. It literally means "go beyond the mind you have." Think in a new way. It's painful to admit, but some portion of my mind is addicted to lie-telling, usually to protect my ego or make life easier. To repent means to admit this tendency, to say, "I'm done lying," and to move beyond my split mind into a complete commitment to the truth. Perhaps that's why at Mass we together proclaim, "I have sinned in my thoughts, and in my words..." Repentance and truth-telling work together.

Those who know the twelve-step process of addiction recovery know this process well. The fourth step requires radical truth-telling: listing our moral defects. This isn't being scrupulous. Rather it is freedom from falsehood, and entrance into the real world. This week, I invite you to join me in this practice. Get your phone or piece of paper. Answer the question: what are your true moral defects? Write them down. Remember, the Lord knows them already and loves you. We have a sacrament where this truth-telling is celebrated: Confession. Perhaps it is finally time to go beyond our childish lies.

BIBLICAL METANOIA

"Repent and believe in the good news!" These are the first words out of Jesus' mouth in Mark's gospel and they are meant as a summary of the entire gospel. But what do these words mean?

In English, the word "repent" is often misunderstood. It seems to imply that we have already done something wrong, regret it, and now commit ourselves to live in a new way. Repentance, understood in this way, means to live beyond a sinful past. Biblically, this is not quite what is meant. In the gospels, the particular word used for repentance is *metanoia*. Literally this means to do an about face, to turn around, to face in an entirely new direction. But what direction?

Robert Barron, a young theologian out of Chicago, offers a simple, yet profound, understanding this. In his view, within each of us there are two souls, a little soul (a *pusilla anima*) and a great soul (a *magna anima*). On any given day we tend to identify more with one or the other of these and we are a very different person depending upon which soul is reigning within us.

Thus, if I take my identity from my little soul I will inevitably feel bitter and angry. It is here, in the pusilla anima, where I am petty, afraid, aware of my hurts, and constantly nursing the sense of having been cheated and short-changed. In my little soul, I am paranoid and defensive. When I relate to life through it, I am short-sighted, impatient, despairing, and constantly looking for compensation.

But I also have within me a great soul. When I let it reign, I become different person altogether. I am relating out of my great soul at those moments when I am overwhelmed by compassion, when everyone is brother or sister to me, when I want to give of myself without concern of cost, when I am able to carry the tensions of life without a breakdown in my chastity, when I would willingly die for others, and when my arms and my heart would want nothing other than to embrace the whole world and everyone in it.

All of us, I am sure, have had ample experience of both, identifying with the great soul and with the petty soul within us. Sometimes we operate out of one, sometimes out of the other.

When Jesus asks us to "repent", to do *metanoia*, what he is asking is that we cease identifying ourselves with the little soul and instead begin to live out of our other soul, the *magna anima*. The very etymology of the word *metanoia* implies this. It takes its root in two Greek words: *meta – beyond; and nous – mind*. Literally, *metanoia* means to move beyond our present mindset, beyond our present way of seeing things.

When one looks at the miracles of Jesus, it is interesting to see that so many of them are connected to opening up or otherwise healing someone's eyes, ears, or tongue. These miracles, of course, always have more than a physical significance. Eyes are opened in order to see more deeply and spiritually; ears are opened in order to hear things more compassionately; and tongues are loosened in order to praise God more freely and to speak words of reconciliation and love to each other. To put it metaphorically, what Jesus is doing in these miracles is attaching the eyes, ears, and tongue to the great soul so that what a person is now seeing, hearing, and speaking is not bitterness, hurt, and pettiness but rather compassion, gratitude, and praise.

Many of us are familiar with a famous passage in Thomas Merton within which he describes a revelation he had one day while standing on the corner of Fourth and Walnut in Louisville. Among complete strangers in the middle of a shopping district on a very ordinary day, Merton had the sense that his eyes, ears, and tongue were suddenly attached to a bigger soul: "I was suddenly overwhelmed with the realization that I loved all of those people, that they were mine, and I, theirs, that we could not be alien to one another even though we were total strangers. It was like waking from a dream of separateness ... Then it was as if I suddenly saw the secret beauty of their hearts, the depths of their hearts, where neither sin, nor desire, nor self-knowledge, can reach the core of their reality, the person that each one is in God's eyes. If only we could all see each other that way all the time! There would be no more war, no more hatred, no more cruelty, no more greed. I suppose that the big problem would be that we would all fall down and worship each other."

To repent is let the great soul, the image and likeness of God, reign within us so that, like Merton on the corner of Fourth and Walnut, we are so overwhelmed with compassion that indeed we do turn and face in a completely new direction.
