Dear Friends,

It is with great joy that I am able to share with you that there is a new pastor for SS. Matthew & Hubert Parish, and his name is Fr. Tomy Abraham. Fr. Tomy is currently the Associate Pastor at St. Edna Parish in Arlington Heights and will begin his assignment at SS. Matthew & Hubert Parish on Sunday, April 14th. This is an especially welcomed development, as it was my presumption the new pastor would be beginning his term on July 1st, along with all the other newly named pastors.

Fr. Tomy and I were able to meet with each other recently, and he and Fr. Matt met separately over lunch to help give Fr. Tomy some insights on the "lay of the land." Fr. Tomy strikes me as a very faithful, kind, gentle and confident priest and I believe he will make an excellent pastor here. Fr. Tomy is sharing a little about himself in this week's bulletin, and I invite you to welcome him when he begins his term on April 14th. Please pray for Fr. Tomy. It is never easy to move and say goodbye to a community you have come to love, but he is very enthusiastic and excited to begin his ministry at Ss. Matthew and Hubert Parish!

I would also like to thank His Eminence, Cardinal Cupich, Fr. Mike Knotec and the Priest Placement Board for discerning Fr. Tomy's assignment here and for granting us the grace of having him begin his term as pastor before July 1st. The assignment process for priests gets more difficult every year as fewer and fewer priests are available to move, so their work at finding good men for parishes is truly guided by the Holy Spirit.

Because of Fr. Tomy's imminent move to SS. Matthew & Hubert Parish, the Archdiocese of Chicago Presbyteral Council recommended at their meeting in March that the name of our parish be selected at their next meeting in May or the one after that in September. You can read the letter in its entirety in this bulletin, but they wanted to give Fr. Tomy an opportunity to understand what each of the possibilities for a name means to the parish.

Of note in the letter is the recommendation that a new patron be chosen for the parish, as other pastors on the Presbyteral Council who have gone through parish unification processes already have observed that combined names, such as the current name of our parish, are more challenging in building unity and an identity as a new parish. This means that SS. Matthew & Hubert Parish will not be considered as a name for the parish in the future. However, it is important to remember that each church building and the school will retain their current names. At the next Presbyteral Council meeting in May or September, they will then consider the other two names presented to them for our parish as voted on by all of you... St. Clare of Assisi Parish or Holy Archangels Parish.

Next week, March 18-20 at 7:00 pm at St. Theresa Church in Palatine, you are all invited to participate in our yearly Lenten Mission. The mission will be given by Fr. Nicholas Kostyk and is titled, "O Lord, I am Not Worthy - Biblical Approaches to Communion."

The mission will examine three scenes from the Gospel that teach us how to approach Our Lord in the manner He wishes to be approached and will focus especially on the implication of those scenes for a fruitful and worthy meeting with Him in the Holy Eucharist. Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament will be celebrated at the conclusion of every evening, and confessions will be heard on each night of the mission.

- Wednesday, March 20: How do you see yourself before God? - The Roman Centurion

Fr. Nicholas Kostyk is a native of the southwest side of Chicago, and a priest of the Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy of St. Nicholas. He holds an S.T.L. in Sacramental Theology from the University of St. Mary of the Lake, and is currently working on his doctorate in Patristics at the Ukrainian Catholic University of L'viv. He is director of the Eparchial Mission Institute and an associate pastor at St. Nicholas Cathedral in Chicago.



An Introduction: Fr. Tomy Abraham 4

Dear brothers and sisters of SS. Mathew and Hubert Parish,

'Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ'. In borrowing these words from St. Paul, I would like to greet you and introduce myself. I have been appointed your new Pastor of SS. Mathew and Hubert parishes. I thank my Almighty God, Cardinal Cupich, and the placement board for placing their trust and confidence in me and I consider it a privilege. I received this appointment with both joy and sadness. I will be leaving my beloved St. Edna Parish hardly two years after my appointment, but I know and believe it is what our Lord wills, and I am only his humble servant. I joyfully look forward to being your new pastor.

I was ordained a priest on May 5th, 2001, at my home parish in Kerala, India. I came to Chicago in 2006 after working as a Missionary priest for five years in Northern India. I began my journey in Chicagoland as a hospital chaplain with Resurrection Health Care for almost three years while residing at St. Viator Parish, Chicago. Right before and during my chaplain work, I completed seven units of Clinical Pastoral Education at Lutheran General Hospital, Park Ridge, and UIC Chicago. In October 2009, at the invitation of Vicar, Bishop Thomas Paprocki, I began working as an Associate Pastor at St. Edward's Parish on the north side of Chicago. I moved from St. Edward in 2012 to St. George Parish, Tinley Park, where I served as an Associate for five years. From there, I was transferred to Mary, Seat of Wisdom (MSW) Parish, Park Ridge, as an Associate. Then in March 2019, I was incardinated as a priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago. I was named Pastor of St. Terrence Parish, Alsip in July 2019 the same year.

In 2020, COVID-19 arrived, the Archdiocese continued to move forward with the Renew My Church process, and as a result, St. Terrence in Alsip and Incarnation Parish in Crestwood were unified to become one Parish in 2022. The Pastor of Incarnation was named the Pastor of the combined Parishes. I moved to St. Edna Parish, Arlington Heights, in July 2022 as an Associate. With a need for Pastors, I entered the Pastor pool for 2024 and subsequently was named the Pastor of your parish. I enjoyed my assignment at St. Edna and gained many friends, as I undoubtedly will here at SS. Mathew and Hubert. I continue to grow and learn as a priest and a Pastor with every new assignment. God has continued to bless me and those around me.

I realize that the parishioners at SS. Mathew and Hubert have gone through some tough times during the last couple of years. I can relate to losing a parish's independence as part of the Renew My Church initiative. The unexpected death of your beloved former Pastor, Fr. Mike Scherschel, was a loss to our community. These challenges are very tough for a parish. I sympathize and share with everyone's loss. I thank Fr. Tim Fairman, Fr. Matt Jamesson, and the Parish staff for leading the community subject to the appointment of a new Pastor.

As with every Parish, some challenges lie ahead for us, and these will be opportunities for growth. Together with God's help, we shall meet these tasks with the confidence that this beautiful community is capable of. This Parish was founded by the early Catholics living in and around Hoffman Estates and Schaumburg, supported by the Archdiocese, and spearheaded by many hardworking Pastors, Priests, Deacons, and parishioners. We will continue to honor their legacy for many more years to come. I look forward to joining you in less than a month. I ask for your valuable prayers that I may imitate the Good Shepherd who came to seek what was lost.

May God's blessings be upon each of you.

Subject: Parish Naming Process Update

Dear Parishioners of SS. Matthew and Hubert Parish,

The archdiocesan Presbyteral Council discussed the parish name options for your parish as part of its meeting on March 5. The Council advised Cardinal Cupich to hold on deciding on a final name based on two areas of feedback:

First, pastors on the Council who have led parish unification themselves encouraged focusing on a new patron for the parish over a combined name. They have experienced uniting under a new patron as a more effective way to build unity and an identity as a new parish, recognizing the church buildings and school retain their names as a connection to the history and legacy of the communities.

Secondly, in light of Fr. Tomy Abraham's assignment as pastor effective April 14, the Council suggested engaging him in understanding what the parish valued about each of the name options voted upon by the parish before a final name is decided. The Council recognizes the incredible work the Unification Committee has undertaken with the naming process and the thoughtful rationale included on the document provided to parishioners to vote on the name options.

Thank you in particular to your Unification Committee for their thorough discernment of potential patrons for your united parish and communication with parishioners about the possibilities and process. Please pray for Fr. Tomy as he prepares to begin as your pastor on April 14.

AFRICAN PALM CROSSES

Available next weekend at both churches

Freewill donations appreciated

African Palms was founded in 1965 by Father Alan Talbot who served for six years as a missionary in Tanzania. Father Talbot saw the needs of the people and sought ways for them to increase their income. Since 1976, St. John's Episcopal Church in Olney Maryland accepted the mission of distributing the palm crosses to churches throughout the US. African Palm crosses are hand made by villagers near Masasi, Tanzania to earn a fair wage to support their families.

Net proceeds from the sale of palm crosses and totes fund basic humanitarian aid projects in Tanzania in the form of self-help grants. 100% of donations to African Palms USA are used to fund grants to organizations for use in projects that benefit an entire community.

Self-sustaining projects often include: implementation of community water supply; medical aid, supplies and equipment; training for public health (HIV/AIDS prevention) and vocational training/community education, teacher housing.

Only the leaves are used, leaving the plant intact. The crosses are environmentally friendly, sustainable and organic.

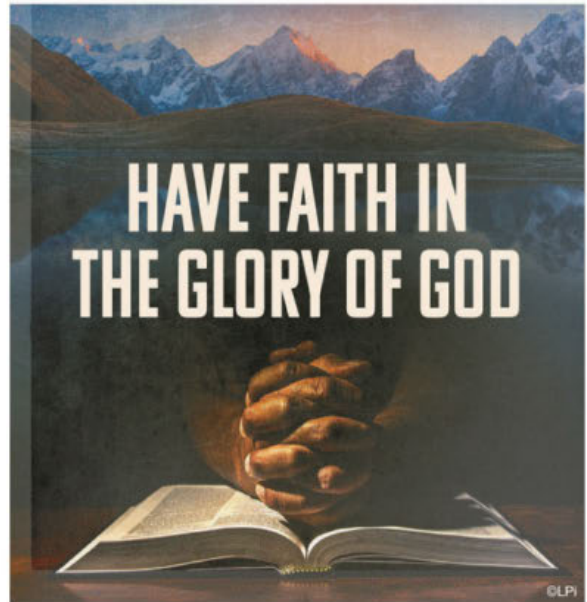

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A middle-aged woman sat on the couch in my parish office and recounted to me a shocking list of terrible calamities in her life: addictions, terminal illnesses, financial loss, broken relationships, and so on. She smiled as she did so. "Please forgive me," I asked, "but you seem to be smiling as you share this." She said, "Father John, I am totally overwhelmed. But I'm smiling because I just can't wait to see what good things God does with this mess." She expected God would manifest His glory when she most needed it.

This week in the Gospel, God speaks from heaven for the third and final time in Jesus' earthly ministry. It's at a tough moment. Gentiles seek Jesus, who announces his terrible suffering, and then boldly prays, "**Father, glorify your name!**" John then writes: **Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again."** Was the task of drawing the whole non-Jewish world to himself overwhelming? Or was it the terrible specter of crucifixion? Whatever it was, the crushing weight triggers his turning to the Father with an unshakeable expectation of divine glory to burst through. And indeed, it did on Easter Sunday. In our burdens, our greatest strength is to turn to God and boldly ask Him for His glory.

Lenten challenge: This week, I invite you to list out everything which is a burden to you. Write it down. Then add these words: "Father, glorify Your name in all these things!" Put that paper in your pocket or purse when you come to Holy Week liturgies next week. You might smile at the most unlikely times.
