

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

One of my favorite new singers/songwriters is Noah Kahan. I'm a little biased because, like me, he is originally from Vermont. In a fine song entitled "Stick Season," he sings of his hope to "cancel out the darkness I inherited from dad." This lyric articulates his painful recognition of a dark spiritual "inheritance" from his father, and his hope to be free of it. We all inherit some degree of evil from our earthly forebears. It's easy to feel doomed to repeat their darknesses.

But we're not so doomed, thank God. This week's Gospel proclaims this. Whatever good or bad we received from our parents, we have a more definitive and perfect inheritance in God. Jesus commands us, "Be merciful just as your Father is merciful" (Luke 6:36). We have a perfect Father in heaven and are destined to inherit and reflect that perfect and merciful love. We have an inheritance of light, not darkness, and thus a whole new possibility of magnanimous love. Like any inheritance, this is a free gift to us.

What are we destined to repeat? Not the darkness of our earthly parents. We are destined to be a reflection of God's life. Jesus liberates us from the inevitability of repeating whatever evils and imperfections are in our familial or cultural upbringings. It's time to claim that perfect inheritance.

Holy Archangels Parish; 5-year Pastoral plan July 2024-June 2029

At Holy Archangels Parish, we are committed to fostering a vibrant and faith-filled community. Our Parish Pastoral Plan is designed to guide us in our shared mission to grow as disciples of Christ and to bring His love to the world. This plan is rooted in the core principles of *Unity, Prayer, Study, Stewardship,* and *Evangelization* – the pillars that will shape our parish life and future.

The main themes of our plan draw inspiration from *Rediscover Catholicism* by Matthew Kelly, a work that challenges us to deepen our faith and live the Gospel with renewed purpose. These ideas have been prayerfully considered and developed in consultation with the Parish Pastoral Council and our dedicated parish staff. Together, we seek to create a parish environment where every member is called to active participation.

Through this plan, we aim to build a stronger sense of unity among parishioners, encourage a life of prayer, foster ongoing spiritual and intellectual growth, promote a culture of stewardship, and empower each member to share the Good News. With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we embark on this journey to grow in holiness and to fulfill our mission as a parish family.

We invite every parishioner to engage with this plan, to embrace its vision, and to work together to make Holy Archangels Parish a place where faith thrives, and the love of Christ is shared with all.

Introduction:

Holy Archangels Parish was formed through the merging of St. Matthew and St. Hubert parishes, bringing together two communities with distinct histories, traditions, and identities. The goal of this Pastoral Plan is to guide the parish through a process of integration and spiritual growth, fostering a deep sense of unity, prayer, study, stewardship, and evangelization over the next five years.

The plan is designed to be implemented in five key phases, each focusing on an essential aspect of parish life. These phases will build upon each other, creating a strong foundation for the parish community and equipping parishioners to live out their faith more fully and effectively. Out of the 5 themes 4 are borrowed from 'Rediscover Catholicism'.

Year 1: Building Unity Among Parishioners

Theme: "One Body in Christ"

Goal: To create a unified parish community, integrating the members of St. Matthew and St. Hubert Churches and fostering a shared identity as Holy Archangels Parish.

Objectives:

- 1. **Host Monthly Fellowship Events:** Begin the year with a series of social events that bring together parishioners from both former parishes. Examples include potluck dinners, coffee socials, and parish family picnics. These events will create opportunities for parishioners to meet and get to know each other in a relaxed setting.
- 2. **Form Welcome Committees:** Organize teams of welcoming parishioners from both former parishes who can greet new members, provide information, and help newcomers integrate into the community.
- 3. **Create a Parish Directory:** Develop a comprehensive parish directory to help parishioners connect with each other. This will include both contact information and brief biographies of parishioners to celebrate the diversity and unique gifts within the community.
- 4. **Joint Liturgies and Celebrations:** Coordinate joint liturgies (such as Feast Days, Advent, Lent) that incorporate traditions from both parishes. This will help foster a sense of shared history and belonging.
- 5. **Integration of Ministries:** Begin the process of merging and revitalizing parish ministries (e.g., altar servers, choir, mass coordinators, ministers of the word and Eucharist, hospitality etc.). Provide training for existing leaders to work together and make the transition as smooth as possible.

Year 2: Strengthening Prayer Life

Theme: "Deepening Our Relationship with God"

Goal: To deepen the spiritual lives of parishioners through regular prayer and liturgical participation.

Objectives:

- 1. **Daily Prayer Focus:** Introduce a parish-wide commitment to daily prayer. This could include a weekly prayer intention shared through the parish bulletin, social media, or email.
- 2. **Prayer Groups:** Establish small prayer groups within the parish that meet regularly to pray for one another and for the needs of the parish. These could be based on different themes such as family life, the sick, or the needs of the community.

- 3. **Adoration and Devotions:** Expand Eucharistic Adoration hours and encourage participation in daily or weekly adoration. Organize seasonal devotions, such as the Rosary for the month of October or special Marian devotions during May.
- 4. **Liturgical Renewal:** Offer opportunities for liturgical formation, focusing on how parishioners can more fully engage in the Mass. This might include brief formation talks, educational materials, or retreats.
- 5. **Prayer and Worship at Home:** Provide resources for parishioners to develop a habit of prayer at home, including guidelines for family prayer, scriptural reflections, and prayer books.

Year 3: Fostering a Culture of Study

Theme: "Growing in Knowledge and Wisdom"

Goal: To encourage and equip parishioners to grow in their understanding of the faith through study of Scripture, Catholic teachings, and spiritual works.

Objectives:

- 1. **Bible Study Groups:** Establish parish-wide Bible study groups, including options for different age groups and learning levels. Offer a parish-wide Bible study in the fall and spring seasons with clear goals for understanding the Scriptures.
- 2. Catechism and Adult Education: Provide adult education programs, including catechetical classes on the Catechism of the Catholic Church. These could be offered as evening classes or weekend retreats. Invite guest speakers or faculty members to present on key topics related to the faith.
- 3. **Library and Resources:** Build a parish library or resource center with books, DVDs, and online resources on Catholic doctrine, history, spirituality, and prayer. Provide suggested reading lists for parishioners of all ages.
- 4. **Theology Nights:** Organize quarterly "Theology Nights," where parishioners can gather for discussions on important theological and ethical issues in the Church today, led by knowledgeable speakers or priests.
- 5. **Faith Formation for Families:** Launch family-focused faith formation initiatives that teach parents how to be the primary educators of their children in the faith. This could include parent workshops, family retreats, or intergenerational programs.

Year 4: Building a Spirit of Stewardship

Theme: "Serving God with Our Gifts"

Goal: To foster a culture of stewardship in which parishioners recognize and generously offer their time, talent, and treasure for the good of the parish and the wider community.

Objectives:

- 1. **Stewardship Education:** Offer workshops and talks on the theology of stewardship, helping parishioners understand that stewardship is not just about money, but about offering all aspects of one's life in service to God.
- 2. **Volunteer Opportunities:** Identify key areas where parishioners can serve in the parish, such as religious education, hospitality, liturgical ministries, and outreach to the needy. Create a "ministry fair" to showcase all volunteer opportunities and encourage active participation.

- 3. **Financial Stewardship:** Launch a campaign for increased tithing and financial support of the parish, helping parishioners to understand the importance of supporting the parish with their financial resources, and the impact this has on parish life and mission.
- 4. **Gratitude and Recognition:** Develop a system for regularly thanking and recognizing those who serve in various ministries. This could include volunteer appreciation events, featured stories in the bulletin, or personal thank-you notes from the pastor.
- 5. Outreach and Social Justice: Encourage parishioners to live out their stewardship by engaging in acts of charity and justice within the community. Organize parish-wide service projects, such as food drives, community clean-ups, or visits to nursing homes.

Year 5: Evangelizing and Reaching Out

Theme: "Go and Make Disciples"

Goal: To form a parish of evangelizers who are actively reaching out to those outside the parish and bringing the Gospel to the world.

Objectives:

- 1. **Evangelization Training:** Offer evangelization training for parishioners, helping them learn practical ways to share their faith in everyday conversations, at work, with family members, and in the wider community.
- 2. **Alpha or Evangelization Programs:** Launch an Alpha program or other evangelization initiative to introduce non-Catholics or lapsed Catholics to the basics of the faith in a welcoming and non-judgmental environment.
- 3. Online Presence and Media Outreach: Strengthen the parish's online presence through social media, and digital outreach. Encourage parishioners to share Catholic content with their networks and invite others to join parish events.
- 4. **Invite a Friend:** Implement an "Invite a Friend" campaign, encouraging parishioners to personally invite friends, family, and co-workers to Mass, parish events, or service projects.
- 5. **Mission Trips and Service Projects:** Organize parish mission trips to serve in other parts of the country or abroad. Additionally, increase local outreach efforts to serve marginalized communities, both as a witness to the Gospel and as an expression of God's love.

Conclusion: By following this five-year plan, Holy Archangels Parish will undergo a transformation, rooted in prayer, study, stewardship, and evangelization. Each year will build upon the last, creating a dynamic and thriving parish that is united in Christ, grounded in the faith, and committed to bringing the Gospel to all corners of the community and beyond. As we move forward, we will continually seek to be instruments of peace, joy, and hope in a world that desperately needs the message of the Gospel.



RISKING GOD'S MERCY

Shortly after ordination, doing replacement work in a parish, I found myself in a rectory with a saintly old priest. He was over eighty, nearly blind, but widely sought out and respected, especially as a confessor. One night, alone with him, I asked him this question: "If you had your priesthood to live over again, would you do anything differently?" From a man so full of integrity, I had fully expected that there would be no regrets. So his answer surprised me. Yes, he did have a regret, a major one, he said: "If I had my priesthood to do over again, I would be easier on people the next time. I wouldn't be so stingy with God's mercy, with the sacraments, with forgiveness. You see what was drilled into me was the phrase: 'The truth will set you free,' and I believed that it was my responsibility to challenge people so as to protect something inside of them. That's good. But I fear that I've been too hard on people. They have pain enough without me and the church laying further burdens on them. I should have risked God's mercy more!"

I was struck by this because, less than a year before, as I took my final exams in the seminary, one of the priests who examined me, gave me this warning: "Be careful," he said, "never let your feelings get in the way. Don't be soft, that's wrong. Remember, hard as it is, only the truth sets people free!" Sound advice, it would seem, for a young priest.

However, as the years of my ministry move towards middle-age, I feel more inclined to the old priest's advice: We need to risk God's mercy more. The place of justice and truth should never be ignored, but we must risk letting the infinite, unbounded, unconditional, undeserved mercy of God flow free. The mercy of God is as accessible as the nearest water tap, and so we. like Isaiah, must proclaim a mercy that has no price tag: "Come, come without money and without virtue, come everyone, drink freely of God's mercy!"

What holds us back? Why are we so hesitant in proclaiming God's inexhaustible, prodigal, indiscriminate mercy?

Partly our motives are good, noble even. Concern for truth, justice, orthodoxy, morality, proper public form, proper sacramental preparation, fear of scandal, and concern for the ecclesial community that needs to absorb and carry the effect of sin, these are not unimportant things. Love needs always to be tempered by truth, even as truth must ever be moderated by love. But sometimes our motives are less noble and the hesitancy arises out of timidity, fear, jealousy, and legalism – the self-righteousness of the pharisees or the bitter jealousy of the older brother of the prodigal son. No cheap grace is to be dispensed on our watch!

In doing this we are misguided, less than good shepherds, out of tune with the God that Jesus proclaimed. God's mercy, as Jesus revealed it, embraces indiscriminately, the bad with the good, the undeserving with the deserving, the uninitiated with the initiated. One of the truly startling insights that Jesus gave us is that the mercy of God cannot not go out to everyone. It is always free, undeserved, unconditional, universal in embrace, reaching beyond all religion, custom, rubric, political correctness, mandatory program, ideology, and even beyond sin itself.

For our part then, especially those of us who are parents, ministers, teachers, catechists, and elders, we must risk proclaiming the prodigal character of God's mercy. We must not spend God's mercy, as if it were ours to spend; dole out God's forgiveness, as if it were a limited commodity; put conditions on God's love, as if God were a petty tyrant or a political ideology; or cut off cut access to God, as if we were the keeper of the heavenly gates. We aren't. If we tie God's mercy to our own timidity and fear we limit it to the size of our own minds. A bad game.

It is interesting to note in the gospels how the apostles, well-meaning of course, often tried to keep certain people away from Jesus as if they weren't worthy, as if they were an affront to his holiness or would somehow stain his purity. So they tried to shoe away children, prostitutes, tax-collectors, known sinners, and the uninitiated of all kinds. Always Jesus over-ruled their attempts with words to this effect: "Let them come! I want them to come."

Things haven't changed. Always in the church, we, well-intentioned persons, for the same reasons as the apostles, keep trying to keep certain individuals and groups away from God's mercy as this is expressed in word, sacrament, and community. Jesus handled things then; I suspect that he can handle them now. God doesn't want our protection. What God does want is for everyone, regardless of morality, orthodoxy, lack of preparation, age, or culture, to come to the unlimited waters of divine mercy.
