The month of October invites us deeper into the heart of our Catholic faith. This month is traditionally dedicated to our Blessed Mother, Mary, whose fiat echoes through the ages as a model of humble surrender to God's will. We will gather in this spirit of reverence on Sunday,

October 26th, immediately following the 11:00 a.m. Mass at St. Matthew Church. Join our parish community for a Rosary procession to the Grotto, where we'll entrust our intentions to Mary's intercession. This procession, winding through the grounds that hold so many of our shared memories, will be a tangible expression of our devotion. Following the Rosary, we'll gather for fellowship and hospitality. All are welcome; bring a friend and let the beads of the Rosary draw us nearer to the One who leads us to her Son.

As we navigate the liturgical calendar, note these upcoming observances. This year, All Saints Day falls on a Saturday, and it is not a day of obligation. But All Souls Day, November 2nd, falls on a Sunday, transforming our weekend Masses into a profound commemoration of all the faithful departed. We'll pray for our loved ones who have gone before us, marked with the sign of faith, offering Masses, and moments of remembrance.

These seasonal rhythms prompt a deeper reflection: What is the Church, and what is its mission? At its core, the Church is not merely a building of stone or a roster of names—though our beautiful churches are cherished homes for worship. The Church is us: the living Body of Christ, a pilgrim people called from every corner of the earth to be salt and light in the world. Founded by Jesus Himself, who prayed, "That they may all be one", the Church's mission is threefold: to proclaim the Gospel, to celebrate the sacraments, and to serve the least among us.

In our parish, this mission comes alive as a group of people united in a common calling: growing in faith and good works. We are bound not by geography alone but by baptismal promises renewed each Sunday. This growth unfolds through the pillars of our spiritual life—prayer, worship, and study—where we encounter the Trinity, deepen our understanding, and bear fruit in charity. It's a dynamic journey, one that equips us to face the world's joys and sorrows with hope.

To guide this journey, our parish has embraced a five-year strategic plan, a roadmap discerned through prayerful listening to the Holy Spirit. This year, our focus is prayer—the breath of the soul, the lifeline to God's heart. In a noisy world that bombards us with distractions, prayer anchors us, reminding us that we are not self-made but God-sustained. I urge every parishioner: Seek every opportunity to grow in prayer.

Our dedicated staff and countless volunteers have woven a rich fabric of invitations to this deeper communion. Beyond our daily and weekend Masses—those anchors of grace—we offer Eucharistic Adoration on Tuesdays at St. Matthew and Wednesdays at St. Hubert, silent hours where the Real Presence whispers peace to your heart.

For intellectual and spiritual nourishment, join Bible Study on Tuesday mornings, unpacking Scripture's treasures, or the Theological Seminars every other Tuesday evenings, exploring doctrines that shape our belief. The Chosen Series, Men for Jesus, Grief Support Ministry are opportunities for growth and fellowship. Pilgrimages of various lengths beckon, from local to extended journeys, fostering encounter with the sacred. Rosary groups abound, deepening our love for Mary, the Mother who ponders all in her heart.

Service flows naturally from prayer, as our hands become Christ's. Trips to Mother Teresa's soup kitchen in Chicago in Advent and Lent immerse us in radical hospitality, feeding the hungry as He did. Service outings to Feed My Starving Children pack nutrient-rich meals for the world's malnourished, turning assembly-line energy into acts of global mercy. These aren't add-ons; they're the mission incarnate, making a tangible difference in lives while glorifying God who formed us from dust and calls us to co-create justice.

Through every Mass, study, service, and prayer, we serve the God who spoke the universe into being from absolute nothing—a divine act of pure love that mirrors our call to give ourselves away. In serving others, we uncover His face in the poor, the seeking, the lonely and those forgotten. Let this October, with its Marian glow and life-affirming zeal, propel us forward. Come to the procession, linger in adoration, volunteer for a trip—whatever stirs your soul. Together, we're not just growing a parish; we're building the Kingdom, one faithful step at a time.

PRAYER CORNER

Prayer of the Week

The Holy Rosary: Power in Prayer

The Rosary is used by Catholics around the world—by laypeople, religious, clergy, and especially the saints. Saints such as St. Padre Pio, who called the Rosary his “weapon,” and St. John Paul II, who prayed it daily, saw it as a source of strength, healing, and spiritual protection. The Rosary is often prayed in times of personal need, at communal gatherings, and in devotion to Mary.

Many Catholics are buried with a Rosary in their hands, symbolizing a life rooted in prayer and a final act of trust in Mary’s intercession. Miracles have been attributed to the Rosary’s power—such as the Battle of Lepanto, where victory was credited to widespread Rosary prayer, and the survival of Jesuit priests in Hiroshima, who lived lives of devotion to the Rosary and emerged unharmed from the atomic blast. During the Marian apparitions at Fatima in 1917, the Blessed Virgin Mary specifically asked the three shepherd children to pray the Rosary daily for peace in the world and the conversion of sinners. This request became a central message of Fatima and helped spread devotion to the Rosary globally. These stories, while extraordinary, reflect a deeper truth: the Rosary is a prayer of protection, healing, and transformation.

The power of the Rosary lies in its simplicity and depth. Whether whispered in solitude or prayed aloud in community, it invites us into the mysteries of faith with every repetition. It teaches us to see through Mary’s eyes, to walk with Christ, and to bring our intentions, no matter how small or great, before God with confidence. The Rosary is not just a devotion; it is a lifeline, a spiritual anchor in the storms of life, and a path to holiness walked by saints and sinners alike.

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Every now and then readers of these reflections write letters in which they object to something. Years ago, this Gospel of Luke 18 prompted such an email. A man wrote to me: “I find it deeply offensive that you suggest we are still sinners once we are God’s sons and daughters.” His objection stirred in me a profound awareness of the paradox at the heart of our faith. Are we sinners or beloved children of God?

In this Gospel (Luke 18:9-14), a tax collector appears as one who has missed the mark. His sins have isolated him. His breast-beating is not an act of self-flagellation for pride’s sake but a heartfelt admission of his failure and unworthiness. Remarkably, Jesus honors the candid humility of the parable’s penitent. Why? Because we are always in need of mercy, always. But even more, perhaps because on the cross, Jesus will fully embrace a similar place of humiliation and rejection. He will enter into the most shameful, offensive place of the sinner so that we might “go home justified.”

There is a sacred tension in admitting that we are sinners and yet have profound hope. We are beloved sons and daughters of God, growing precisely through our honest acceptance of failure. When we cry, “Have mercy on us,” during Mass or when we repeat the “Jesus Prayer” in quiet moments, or in the confessional, we embrace our imperfections as fertile ground for divine grace. In doing so, we follow Christ’s example — finding true exaltation in the humble acknowledgment of our human frailty.



The Catholic Church's Views on Domestic Violence

As pastors of the Catholic Church in the United States, we state as clearly and strongly as we can that violence against women, inside or outside the home, is never justified. Violence in any form '---physical, sexual, psychological or verbal' ---is sinful; often, it is a crime as well. We have called for a moral revolution to replace a culture of violence. We acknowledge that violence has many forms, many causes, and many victims---men as well as women. (1)

The Catholic Church teaches that violence against another person in any form fails to treat that person as someone worthy of love. Instead, it treats the person as an object to be used. When violence occurs within a sacramental marriage, the abused spouse may question, "How do these violent acts relate to my promise to take my spouse for better or for worse?" The person being assaulted needs to know that acting to end the abuse does not violate the marriage promises. (2)

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops condemns the use of the Bible to support abusive behavior in any form. A correct reading of Scripture leads people to an understanding of the equal dignity of men and women to relationships based on mutuality and love. They clearly emphasize that no person is expected to stay in an abusive marriage. Violence and abuse, not divorce, can break up a marriage. (3)

Here's how it works. It is an all-day event, so you can come for lunch, dinner or both (open to close). You can bring your business colleagues from work for lunch and then the family for dinner! Make sure you bring a flyer for each visit!

- These flyers may be copied and passed out to anyone and everyone **PRIOR** to the scheduled event. **ANYONE** suspected of passing out flyers on the day of the event on VTG property may cause a penalty deduction or forfeit the entire donation.
- **This flyer must be turned in to your server at the time of payment** along with a copy of your bill in order to receive credit for the donation. Once you've left the building you may not return with a flyer to apply to a bill.
- **20% of the pre-taxed bill, minus any discounts, will be donated.**
