

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,
 May the grace and peace of God our Father be with you all.

Recently, during our Theological Seminar, we reflected on the spirituality of St. Ignatius of Loyola. Among his many spiritual insights, one that continues to inspire us is his vision of God as the giver of all gifts. This insight flows from his foundational teaching on the “Principle and Foundation,” which outlines the very purpose of our human existence: *God created us to know Him, praise Him, reverence Him, and serve Him — for the salvation of our souls.* Everything else in life — our talents, relationships, possessions, and experiences — are gifts given by God to help us fulfill that ultimate purpose.

To understand this, imagine yourself as a parent who has just bought a new toy for your child. The next day, you return home to find your child joyfully playing with the toy but ignoring your presence. When you ask for help, the child refuses, remaining absorbed in play. Naturally, this would sadden any parent. In a similar way, when we allow the gifts, God gives us to overshadow our love for God the Giver, we risk losing sight of our true purpose.

As the liturgical year draws to a close, the Church invites us to reflect on the passing nature of worldly things. All things — possessions, achievements, and even the most beautiful structures — will one day pass away. Only God is eternal.

In the first reading from the Book of Malachi, the prophet reminds the people of Israel, who had returned from exile, to remain faithful to the Lord. He proclaims that *“the day is coming, blazing like an oven,”* when the proud and evildoers will be punished, but the righteous will find healing in God’s presence. This message calls us to fidelity, reminding us that righteousness, not riches, endures.

In the Gospel, people admire the beauty of the Temple in Jerusalem. Their attention is fixed on the splendor of the building — the gift — rather than on God, the giver who dwells within it. In response, Jesus predicts the destruction of the Temple, emphasizing that nothing in this world is permanent. He challenges us to place our faith not in material beauty or temporal things, but in God alone.

In the second reading, St. Paul addresses the Thessalonians, warning them against idleness. Some had misunderstood the teaching about Christ’s imminent return, believing that since the end was near,

there was no longer any need to work. Paul corrects this misunderstanding, urging them to remain active in doing good and to live responsibly in anticipation of the Lord’s coming. True faith, he reminds us, is lived through perseverance and faithful action.

Recently, I visited a patient in the hospital. On her bedside table, I noticed a framed photograph of a young woman. Assuming it was her daughter, I asked about it. To my surprise, she replied that it was a picture of herself taken just three months earlier. As I looked from the picture to her frail face, my heart ached. How quickly life had changed! Her gift of physical beauty had faded, yet her faith in God remained strong. Her story reminded me powerfully that earthly gifts fade, but the Giver endures forever.

At the end of today’s Gospel, Jesus reassures us: *“By your perseverance you will secure your lives.”* In other words, those who remain steadfast in faith — through trials, change, and loss — will be saved.

My dear brothers and sisters, the gifts do not last — but the Giver does. Let us take time this week to reflect on the gifts in our lives. Are there things we cling to that distract us from God? Let us ask for the grace to look beyond them and to cling instead to the One who gives all things.

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, may this simple prayer guide our hearts:

Lord God, grant us the wisdom to look beyond the gifts, to find You — the Giver of all good gifts — through Christ our Lord. Amen.



Prayer of the Week

The Holy Rosary: Sorrowful Mysteries

The Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary are a powerful way to meditate on the suffering and sacrifice of Jesus Christ during His Passion. Prayed on Tuesdays and Fridays, these five mysteries help us enter into the heart of Christ's pain and love, reminding us of the cost of our salvation. Here is a summary of each Sorrowful Mystery, along with its spiritual fruit:

#	Sorrowful Mystery	Scriptural Reference	Fruit of the Mystery
1	The Agony in the Garden	Luke 22:39-46	Contrition and Conformity to God's Will
2	The Scourging at the Pillar	Matthew 27:26	Purity and Mortification
3	The Crowning with Thorns	Matthew 27:27-31	Courage and Humility
4	The Carrying of the Cross	Luke 23:26-32	Patience and Perseverance
5	The Crucifixion and Death of Jesus	Luke 23:33-46	Self-Denial, Forgiveness, and Salvation

The Sorrowful Mysteries invite us into the heart of Christ's Passion, where love and suffering meet in a profound expression of divine mercy. As we meditate on each mystery, we are drawn into the reality of Jesus' sacrifice—not just as a historical event, but as a living testimony of His love for each soul. These mysteries challenge us to confront the pain of sin, the cost of redemption, and the transformative power of grace. They remind us that in every sorrow, Christ walks with us, offering strength, healing, and hope. Through prayerful reflection, we unite our own sufferings with His, finding meaning in trials and courage in the face of adversity. The Sorrowful Mysteries are not only a path to deeper compassion and humility, but also a doorway to resurrection, where sorrow is not the end, but the beginning of new life.

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was a kid growing up in New England, I'd occasionally go on a whale watch. Once we went out with calm waters and clear skies. But on the way back in, the sea got rough. I was just a kid, and I remember thinking we should turn left or right toward the shoreline I could see. But the pilot of the boat kept going straight — right into the waves — focused on a small, discouragingly distant lighthouse. Even when it flickered in and out of sight, he stayed the course. He knew where he was going.

That image comes to mind when I hear Jesus' words in today's Gospel regarding false messiahs: **"Do not follow them" (Luke 21:8)**. In times of chaos or uncertainty, there are always voices offering easier routes, promising false safety, claiming to speak for God. But Jesus isn't found in the loudest voice or the nearest shoreline. He is steady, like a lighthouse in the storm.

The tribulation of which Jesus speaks — it's real. It happened to the Temple, it happened to him, it happens in the Church, and it will come to each of us. But the command is not to panic. It's to endure. To keep steering toward him. Faith isn't about having all the answers or dodging every wave. It's about knowing where the lighthouse is — and trusting it enough to keep going, especially when false safety beckons us to stop.


