

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Welcome to our reflection on the Solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe. This feast marks the final Sunday of the liturgical year, and with it we conclude Year C.

As I prayed with today's Gospel, the theme of *contradiction* stood out strongly. It reminded me of a similar experience eight years ago during a retreat before my priestly ordination. My wise retreat director handed me an article by the Jesuit theologian Michael Buckley titled "Are You Weak Enough to Be a Priest?" At first, I assumed the title must have been misprinted—surely priesthood required strength, competence, and excellence!

Buckley points out that many professions associate success with natural aptitude: "Joe makes straight A's, speaks well, and is detail-oriented; therefore, he will be a great lawyer." Sadly, this mindset is often applied to the priesthood: "John is prayerful, intelligent, admired, and hardworking; therefore, he will be an amazing priest." But Buckley argues that this is far from the truth. What makes a good priest is not his strength, but his weakness—because the priesthood is modelled after the priesthood of Christ the King, who "can deal gently with the ignorant and the wayward, since He Himself is beset with weakness" (Hebrews 5:2).

Christ embraced the weakness of our human nature. He experienced fear (Mark 14:33), sorrow (John 11:35), weariness (John 4:6), and even a sense of abandonment (Matthew 27:46). The same pattern continued in the apostles—ordinary fishermen with real limitations—yet their impact has shaped the world more than any other institution in history.

Today's Gospel reflects this same paradox. Though Jesus is King of the Universe:

- He wears not a crown of gold, but a crown of thorns.
- His throne is not majestic, but a cross.
- His companions are not royal ministers, but two criminals crucified with Him.
- He commands no earthly army; instead, He is commanded by Roman soldiers.

This is the very contradiction Simeon foretold at the presentation of Jesus in the temple (Luke 2:34). Beloved in Christ, this is the nature of the King we celebrate today—a King whose power is revealed through humility, suffering, and love.

This week, our nation also celebrates Thanksgiving—a tradition that deeply inspired me when I first came to the United States. I was amazed to see an entire country set aside a special day each year to thank God and to honor the people who have blessed their lives. In fact, I had not heard of this practice in any other country before! With such a beautiful practice, we are silently reminded that the first One

we thank must be God. As Catholics, the best expression of our gratitude is to come to Mass, which is the highest form of thanksgiving.

Our parish will celebrate Thanksgiving Mass at 9:00 AM at St. Matthew Church. By thanking God first, we enthrone Christ as King of our hearts, our families, and our homes—and only then do we return to celebrate with loved ones.

This solemnity also calls us to live our faith publicly. In this spirit, 33 parishioners will depart on November 28, 2025, the day after Thanksgiving, for a pilgrimage to Italy as part of the Jubilee Year of Hope. I am blessed to accompany this group as we represent Holy Archangels Parish on this journey of faith. It is not a vacation but a spiritual pilgrimage seeking a deeper encounter with our Lord and King, Jesus Christ. Please feel free to share your prayer intentions with any of us. We go as a parish family—praying for you, and grateful for your prayers for us.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, as we conclude this liturgical year, let us love Jesus Christ in our personal lives and boldly acknowledge His kingship in the world. May our lives proclaim that Jesus is truly the Lord of the Church and the King of the entire universe.

 Joyful Mysteries**


The Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary offer a rich and prayerful way to enter into the early life of Jesus Christ and the faithful response of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Prayed on Mondays and Saturdays, these five mysteries invite us to reflect on moments filled with divine promise, humility, and love. Here is a summary of the Joyful Mysteries and their spiritual fruits:

#	Joyful Mystery	Spiritual Fruit	Bible Verse
1	The Annunciation	Humility	Luke 1:26-38
2	The Visitation	Charity	Luke 1:39-56
3	The Nativity	Poverty of Spirit / Love of God	Luke 2:1-20
4	The Presentation in the Temple	Obedience	Luke 2:22-38
5	The Finding of Jesus in the Temple	Joy in Finding Jesus	Luke 2:41-52

The Joyful Mysteries are a pathway to prayer that is both meditative and transformative. As we pray each decade of the Rosary, we enter into the mystery of God's love made visible in the Incarnation. These moments are not distant memories but are living truths that speak to our own journey of faith. 

St Hubert Campus Updates

Parking lot core samples and borings have been completed, allowing us to plan for resurfacing next year. The concrete walkway at the north entrance will be replaced in the coming weeks. A new ice machine has been installed in the parish office, and the new cross is expected to be installed before Christmas. The church gutters have been cleaned, and the parking lot islands have been replanted with salt-resistant plants. Campus-wide, the grass edging has been brought up to curb level and newly seeded. New benches have also been installed. We are currently working with ComEd to upgrade our power supply to help prevent future outages. As part of this project, they will repair the concrete entryway.

St Matthew Campus Updates

The parking lot has been seal-coated and re-stripped. Concrete walkways under the awnings, along with several other areas, have been repaired. Many dead trees have been removed, though a few still need attention. We plan to clean the main carpet pathways in the church before Christmas. Across the campus, the grass edging has been brought up to curb level and newly seeded. A new refrigerator has been installed in the church kitchen, and the former unit has been relocated to the ministry center. Additionally, the lighting for the grotto and Stations of the Cross has been repaired and upgraded.

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Not long ago, I was called to a hospital to anoint a woman in her early 80s. She was dying, and visibly in pain. But what struck me most wasn't her suffering — it was the atmosphere in the room. She had eight children and 30 foster kids, and many of them were gathered around her. You'd expect sorrow, fear, maybe even despair. But the room was filled with something else entirely — a quiet strength, a kind of sweetness. It was as if she was suffering not just with them, but for them. And they, in love, were suffering for her. The pain was real. But so was the peace. I didn't want to run. I felt as if I was in a little paradise, beeping machines and all.

I think of that moment when I hear today's Gospel. Jesus, hanging on the cross, doesn't look like a king. But one of the crucified, dying men beside him sees through the suffering and says, **"Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom" (Luke 23:42).** That word — *remember* — literally means to make someone a member again. He's asking to be joined to Christ, to become part of his Body. And Jesus says, **"Today you will be with me in paradise."**

He doesn't say, "I'll take your suffering away." He says, **"You will be with me."**

That's the strange power of Christ the King. He doesn't rule by avoiding suffering. He reigns by entering into it, and transforming it with love.

What are you suffering right now in your life? Likely you want it to stop. But if we are willing to suffer with him — paradise begins even today.


