

Advent begins not with lullabies but with a shout: “Stay awake!”

Jesus speaks these words in today’s Gospel (Matthew 24:37-44), and the Church places them in our ears on the very first day of the new liturgical year like a trumpet blast. We are not easing gently into Christmas. We

are being summoned to attention.

Think of it. While the malls started playing “Jingle Bells” weeks ago and the world is already exhausted from holiday frenzy, the Church steps back and says, “No. First things first. The Lord is coming. Be ready.” Advent is counter-cultural by design. It refuses to let Christmas be reduced to sentimentality. It insists that the cradle in Bethlehem cannot be separated from the cross on Calvary or the clouds of the final coming.

“Stay awake!” is not a suggestion for insomniacs. It is the urgent plea of a God who loves us too much to let us sleepwalk through life. In the days of Noah, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage—perfectly ordinary things—right up to the moment the flood came. They were not ready, not because they were especially wicked, but because they were distracted. They had forgotten that history has a destination and that every human life is lived in the tense interval between promise and fulfillment.

That is our situation exactly. We, too, live between the times: Christ has come in the flesh, Christ will come again in glory, and right now Christ comes to us quietly in Word and Sacrament, in the poor, in the stranger, in the stillness of prayer. The whole Christian life is learning to recognize Him in all three comings.

So what does it mean, practically, to “stay awake” this Advent?

Reclaim silence. The world will try to fill every spare second with noise. Guard at least fifteen minutes a day for real silence—phone off, lights low, heart open. Let the Lord speak in the stillness you finally give Him.

Make a confession. Nothing wakes the soul like the grace of absolution. If it has been a while, homecoming awaits you. The Lord is richer in mercy than we are in misery.

Simplify one thing. Choose one area—decorations, spending, schedule, social media—and deliberately do less. Create breathing room for wonder.

Light the candle and mean it. When you light the first purple candle on your Advent wreath tonight, pause and pray: “Come, Lord Jesus. Wake me up to Your presence here and now.”

Watch for the unexpected. The Son of Man comes “at an hour you do not expect.” He may come today in the

coworker who annoys you, in the child who needs a story read slowly, in the homeless man whose eyes meet yours. Be awake enough to recognize Him.

Advent is short—only four weeks this year—but it is deep. It is the Church’s annual retreat, a yearly chance to remember who we are: pilgrims, not permanent residents; watchmen on the walls, not settlers in the city. The wreaths, the candles, the “O Antiphons,” the empty manger waiting for the Infant—all of it is training in wakefulness. That future is not automatic. It is the fruit of lives that have learned to stay awake and walk while it is still day. So let the world rush. We will wait. We will watch. We will walk in the light of the Lord.

Many of you kindly noticed my absence over the past four weeks. I had taken some much-needed time away to visit my mother and siblings, a visit filled with joy, laughter, and precious family moments.

The highlight was returning to my childhood church where, twenty-five years ago, I was ordained a priest. There, surrounded by old friends, fellow priests, and the parish community that first welcomed me into ministry, I celebrated my silver jubilee of ordination. It was a deeply moving milestone, and I promise to share more reflections and photos in an upcoming article.

I am profoundly grateful to the priests and staff who so faithfully cared for the parish in my absence. Your dedication allowed me to step away with complete peace of mind. Now I am happily back home among you, refreshed and eager to journey through this Advent season together as we prepare our hearts and our parish for the coming of Christ at Christmas.





## PRAYER CORNER

Prayer of the Week

### Eucharistic Thanksgiving

The Eucharist, celebrated during the **Mass**, is the **most profound forms of prayer** in the Church. It is not only a remembrance of Christ's sacrifice, but a real participation in it. It is where bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus, and the faithful are invited into intimate communion with Him. **The entire Mass is a prayer**, but the Eucharist is its heart: a sacred offering of thanksgiving, praise, and unity with God. When we receive the Eucharist, we are not just saying prayers—we are entering into the very mystery of Christ's love and offering ourselves back to God in gratitude.

The word "**Eucharist**" comes from the Greek *eucharistia*, meaning "**thanksgiving**." This reveals the true nature of the Eucharist as a prayer of gratitude. Every Mass is a celebration of thanksgiving for God's mercy, for the gift of salvation, and for the grace that sustains us. In the Eucharistic Prayer, the Church gives thanks to the Father through Christ, in the Holy Spirit, and the faithful join in this offering with their own intentions and hearts full of praise. The Eucharist teaches us that thanksgiving is not just a feeling. It is a way of life, expressed through worship, service, and love.

This connection makes the Eucharist especially meaningful during the **Thanksgiving holiday**. While Thanksgiving is often focused on family, food, and gratitude for earthly blessings, the Eucharist invites us to go deeper—to give thanks for eternal gifts, for the presence of Christ in our lives, and for the hope of salvation. Attending Mass around Thanksgiving is a powerful way to center the holiday on prayer, reminding us that all good things come from God, and that **true thanksgiving begins at the altar**.

## Gospel Meditation

### Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A few years ago, my house was broken into on Super Bowl Sunday. Turns out, it's a great day for burglars. If the TV isn't on, people are probably watching the game somewhere else, so ... easy pickins'. I'll never forget walking into my bedroom and realizing someone had been there. My stuff was thrown all over the floor. The closet was torn apart. It was disorienting and disturbing — someone had invaded the space I thought was secure. After that, I bought an alarm system. And every Super Bowl Sunday since, I'm extra careful to lock the doors and keep the lights on. That experience made me more alert. Not scared. Just attentive.

That's much like the spiritual place Jesus wants us to be on this first Sunday of Advent. He doesn't start the season with soft candlelight and cozy manger scenes. He starts with two brutal images: a flood and a thief. In other words, chaos and violation.

Why? Because life will flood us. Chaos *will* come. And in the midst of it, Christ will come like a thief — not to steal from us, but to steal us back. He is the intruder we should want. The one who breaks in, not to ransack, but to rescue.

Christ presents himself as the thief but also the new Noah. He builds the ark of the Church to carry us through the flood. And he invites us to join him. How? By participating fully in our parishes. By making our homes places of prayer. By guarding our hearts with truth. By refusing to let spiritual complacency leave us exposed. By repentance.

This Advent, don't just stay vaguely "awake." Prepare. Build. Watch. The flood will come. But so will he.
