Our parish projects will focus on continuing to improve and maintain our buildings, which include required safety additions. All these important projects will allow us to further our mission and our ministries. They will help us keep our school current with technology and allow us to support the larger Church through our participation in the Archdiocese of Chicago *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign, which supports Catholic Education. A Celebrated History

The formation of St. Hubert began before it became a formal parish. Early in 1958, Rev. Arthur O'Brien, Pastor of St. Theresa Parish in Palatine assigned Rev. Raymond Sullivan to celebrate Sunday Mass in the dining hall of the Buggy Whip Tavern on Roselle Road near Schaumburg Road. That was the beginning of "St. Buggy Whip" as it was affectionately called.

An energetic fundraising pledge-drive facilitated the building of the St. Theresa Mission Church.

Rev. Leo Wincek was appointed pastor for St. Hubert Parish, Hoffman Estates.

One year later, the school was staffed by Sisters.

Needed Parish Campus Improvements

School Building

- Install a School Building Sprinkler
- New Energy Efficient Lighting

The Village of Hoffman Estates has directed that we install a fire prevention sprinkler system in our school building to comply with its ordinance. While the school itself is already exceptionally safe, this mandate will allow us to meet the building code required of all Village school buildings and will make our campus that much safer for everyone, including firefighters. Along with the continued safety enhancements, this project will also allow us to install new light fixtures to improve the facility. The lighting in the primary school is original to its construction in 1961.

- Install Sound System
- Upgrade Electric Panel in Kitchen
- Install Zone Lighting

St. Hubert hosts a variety of community outreach programs, parish life events, and ministries in the lower level of our church. Next to the Parish Ministry Center, it is the most used space on the campus. However, we currently do not have a sound system. That makes it difficult to hear when large groups are gathered. Also, a new electrical panel and zone lighting are needed for the kitchen which will help us when hosting families for lunch after funerals and to better accommodate parish social events.

- Upgrade the Electrical System
- Improve Reception Area

When the Parish Ministry Center was completed, it greatly enhanced our parish campus. It is the center of activity with daily activities year-round. The building is a gathering place and over time we realized a strong need to reconfigure the electrical system. This will allow us to better host large events which is currently hard to do. There is also a need to create a better functioning front desk area to welcome parishioners as they enter our building and to safely store our sacramental records.



School Technology

- Student Access to Digital Content and Computer Devices

Founded in 1961, St. Hubert Catholic School has been noted for our strong educational program. The U.S. Department of Education has recognized us as a National Blue-Ribbon School of Excellence. As we work to transform and enhance the way students learn and communicate, and to keep our school vibrant, our goal is to provide access to digital content and tools via a 1:1 computer device program through a three-phase process. This will equip every student with what they need to learn and develop important skills to do their best in high school, college, and beyond.

Guiding Our Effort

We have engaged a strategic fundraising firm to assist us in managing the campaign. Investing in a campaign consultant will allow us to conduct a more comprehensive fundraising effort over a shorter period. CCS Fundraising was founded as a Catholic fundraising firm, and assisting Catholic organizations continues to be the root of their work. They are guiding the Archdiocese's To Teach Who Christ Is campaign, as well as a number of our sister parishes in the Archdiocese. They will help the St. Hubert community use our gifts of time, talent, and treasure to meet our needs.

20+20 Vision

We are very excited about the opportunities ahead for our growing community of faith. To address these important needs, St. Hubert Parish is embarking on a financial initiative with a goal of raising \$2.4 million. We do not take this campaign and its implications on our parishioners lightly. The recent feasibility study solicited views from parishioners about the merits of such a project. After careful analysis, discussion with parishioners, and thorough review by members of the Parish Council, Finance Committee, and a newly formed Campaign Committee as well as the Parish staff, we have concluded that it is important to the community of St. Hubert to move forward at this time.

Because of considerable review and examination, we look to raise the minimum necessary to complete these needed projects as we also participate in the Archdiocesan campaign. Of course, every dollar raised above our minimum campaign need of \$2.4 million will insure any unexpected cost overages will be covered and, if not needed, would be applied toward outstanding parish debt. Considering our need, all parishioners are asked to consider a sacrificial gift.

While the financial goals of this project are challenging, they are attainable. The success of our 20+20 VISION clearly depends on all of us. Our need will be met and exceeded if each parishioner proportionately shares what God has given them.

Each parish household will be approached in the upcoming weeks. A gift amount is suggested for each household to prayerfully consider. No judgment is made on the level of gift you or others make. The specific gift request is based on our goal and meant to provide a frame of reference for each family's participation. 20+20 VISION seeks equal sacrifices, not equal gifts. Ultimately, the true test of any gift is whether it is planned, proportionate and sacrificial.

Pledges made to 20+20 VISION are not legally binding. They may be increased, decreased, or canceled at any time. Payment reminders will be sent according to your stated intentions. All contributions should be made over and above your weekly offertory giving. Weekly offerings are used for the normal operating expenses of the Parish. We depend on these contributions to maintain the parish and its programs.

St. Hubert Parish has a rich history and we look forward to the 2020's and through the next sixty years as a spiritual home that also serves the greater Hoffman Estates community. From our humble beginnings in 1958, our parish has been blessed with a devoted, hard-working, faith-filled community. We now have an opportunity to make a profound impact on our parish and return the many blessings we have received.
