



First Reading Ezekiel 33:7-9
Responsorial Psalm Psalm 95:1-2,6-9
Second Reading Romans 13:8-10
Gospel Reading Matthew 18:15-20

Today's Gospel reading is taken from a chapter of Matthew's Gospel, which is sometimes called the "discourse on the Church" or the "church order" discourse. In today's reading we find one of only three instances in which Jesus uses the word *church* in Matthew's Gospel.

In the first part of the "discourse on the Church", Matthew addresses the Christian community's concerns about rank. Jesus responds to the disciples' question about who is greatest in the kingdom of heaven. Jesus indicates that those who wish to enter the kingdom of heaven must be like children, and he cautions those leaders who might lead these "little ones" astray. He also responds with the parable of the lost sheep, indicating how God will seek out and bring back those "little ones" who have strayed.

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus addresses a common occurrence in the Christian community: a dispute between two members of the Church. Jesus outlines a procedure for settling such matters fairly. The victim should privately address the offender and attempt to resolve the dispute without outside involvement. If that fails, then the victim should bring two or three witnesses and confront the offender again. If the dispute is still unresolved, the matter should be brought to the attention of the entire community. If the offender refuses to adhere to the reparations prescribed by the community, then Jesus suggests that the offender may be expelled from the Church.

Jesus does not discourage disagreement within the community of the Church; he acknowledges the reality of conflict and error and offers his disciples a means for addressing such matters. It is in the conclusion to this teaching that the message of hope is found: Jesus is present with the community and will guide the community in its relations. Path to the Pantry September 2023

GOOD NEWS! Last month we reported that Second Harvest would no longer deliver food to rural food banks like the North County Food Pantry. Second Harvest has since rescinded that plan, so weekly deliveries will continue! When we thought we would have to make alternate arrangements to pick up food from Second Harvest, this community really stepped in to fill the gap! Four residents with commercial driver's licenses offered to help, as did a community member who offered his commercial truck with a lift. This support is a tremendous blessing to both our clients and our volunteers. Each month 40-plus volunteers distribute approximately 25,000 pounds of food to nearly 300 families in our community. We are indeed grateful.

We welcomed a number of new volunteers over the past months. They serve in a variety of capacities (inventory, shoppers, maintenance, social media, freight). Thank you Don, Sara, Sarah, Katie, Cylk, Jennifer and John.

Thanks to Catholic Charities Food For All program and Eden Gardens, we are receiving donations of fresh produce each week. We have distributed cucumbers, peppers, squash, berries, herbs, and peppers just to name a few. Our own garden has added carrots, greens, radishes, and cauliflower to our offerings. Distributing healthy foods is one of our priorities.

One of the "niceties" that distinguish our food pantry is the availability of a light meal for clients and volunteers. We are looking for someone to cook every other Wednesday mornings. If you like to cook for a crowd (40-50 people), we could use your help. Supplies are provided and we have a well stocked kitchen on site. It would be a blessing if this person could be "on-call" to substitute for other volunteer cooks on occasion. We are also in need of a volunteer on Monday mornings from 8-10 to help with set-up. Tom's Turkey Drive with all the fixings for a home-cooked Thanksgiving meal is right around the corner. Thanks to John who offered a BIG truck to pick up the food this year. 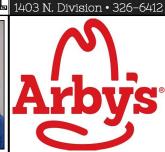
