SEASON OF ADVENT

On December 2, we celebrate the first Sunday of Advent. It marks the beginning the liturgical year. Advent (from, "ad-venire" in Latin or "to come to") is the season encompassing the four Sundays leading up to the celebration of Christmas.

The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming and also to the anniversary of the Lord's birth on Christmas. The final days of Advent, December 17-24, focus particularly on our preparation for the celebrations of the Nativity of our Lord (Christmas).

Advent devotions including the Advent wreath, remind us of the meaning of the season. Traditionally, Advent wreaths are constructed of a circle of evergreen branches into which four candles are inserted, representing the four weeks of Advent.

The purple candles symbolize the prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifices and goods works undertaken at this time. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday, when the priest also wears rose vestments at Mass; Gaudete Sunday is the Sunday of rejoicing, because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent, when their preparation is now half over and they are close to Christmas.

The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into

the world and the anticipation of his second coming to judge the living and the dead.



Path to the Pantry

More clients and families were served on the Monday evening before Thanksgiving than on any other day in the history of the North County Food Pantry. As a distribution site for Tom's Turkey Drive, we gave away 250 turkey dinners to neighbors in Elk, Chattaroy and Spokane. Many volunteers made the process go smoothly. Special thanks to John G. who provided transportation from Second Harvest earlier in the day. Riverside HS honor students assembled the turkey dinners (turkey, stuffing, potatoes, milk, rolls, veggies and cranberries). The RHS Girls Varsity Basketball team loaded groceries in hundreds of cars as they passed through our drive -through. Thanks to SCOPE volunteers for directing traffic at Country Church of the Open Bible. Thanks to Joe, Carolyn and Megan for assembling extra grocery supplies beyond what Tom's Turkey Drive had collected for distribution that night. Our regular volunteers are the foundation of the Food Pantry, and this month we would like to highlight a few key people:

- Brothers **Ryder and Rowdy** are homeschooled students and long-time volunteers on Mondays;
- Married couples Shelley and Don are invaluable Monday volunteers, as are Bon and Bernie on Wednesdays. These couples routinely handle a wide variety of tasks a the Pantry;
- **Karen** responded to our appeal in the Elk Sentinel for a Wednesday cook so a hot meal can be offered to clients and volunteers
- **Jack and Julie** rotate responsibilities of picking up surplus bakery goods from the Caritas Food Bank in Spokane;
- Last but NOT least, **Sandy and Joe** lead the North County Food Pantry and take care of reporting, inventory, supplier relations, volunteer oversight, and building and equipment repair and maintenance. They lead with integrity and passion. All who serve with them appreciate their leadership and commitment.

Our community is also extraordinarily supportive of our efforts to help our neighbors in need. Here are a few examples of the support we have received recently:

- Nancy provided a dozen homeless kits that include toiletries, and warm socks and gloves;
- A local quilting group donated nearly 100 hand sewn Christmas stockings for children in our area;
- The Knights of Columbus from St. Joe's Parish made a significant cash donation to underwrite utility bills and equipment maintenance.
- Watson's Market and the two local Dollar Stores regularly donate food near expiration, offering variety to our inventory;
- Several women donated hand knit scarves and hats that are greatly appreciated as we enter the cold winter months.

The North County Food Pantry is blessed by the outpouring of support from our community and beyond. You can be assured that we will continue to be good stewards of all monetary and in-kind gifts we receive. We are an IRS recognized tax exempt non-profit and hold ourselves to the highest standards of integrity.
